## Press Releases.

Rome, 15 March. After paying his respects to the Pontiff in the Vatican this afternoon Premier Alexandro Bresibaldi today addressed the Italian Senate: "It is with deep regret that I announce the resignation of my government. I no longer believe that my government carries the confidence nor the support of the Italian people. More importantly, I do not carry the support nor confidence of him who has entrusted me with the direction of this nation during this war. Instead of a moral and a just war, I find our nation surrounded by hypocrites, double-dealers, imposters, liars, and other misfits who have sought only to use us for their own advancement. Therefore, in protest against this foolishness my government is resigning. May God send peace to our nation, forgiveness to our enemies, and further victories to our allies, if we have any," Byzantium, 23 March. Her Holiness, the Empress and Pope Joan II, greeted the news of the impending abdication of King Lorenzo; of Italy with unconcealed scorn. In a speech in the Hippodrome, Her Holiness said, "His so-called Majesty of Italy is a quitter! He knows that his so-called allies, the perfidious English, are about to turn on him and erase his puny state from the map. Rather than face defeat like a man, he's going to run off. Buenos Aires or Switzerland, We presume. Mever let it be said that the Empress of Byzantium was less a man than the fop who now disgraces the throne of the Lombards. ((+(There is no doubt that the speed and regularity of Big Brother is an attractive feature. The only other zine with a comparable publication rate is Boardman's Graustark. As Big Brother is published with 13 days from one deadline to the next, compared with Graustark's 14, Reinsel can usually squeeze one additional playing year into a callendar year, compared with the Graustark rate. As I understand the situation Reinsel is finding that publishing takes up more time than he can afford. He is not alone in that, of course. Inyway I believe he intends to cease publish ing about a year from now. He had intended to let his tenth game be the last, ending on a nice round figure. As you know, since you are in it, there was such an overflow of applicants for Game 10, that he decided to offer an 11th as well. I think, though, that someone should twist his arm and persuade him to round it out to an even dozen. In spite of his planned cessation date about a year from now I think he could manage another. The average postal game ends in 1911 or 1912. However, the average Big Brother game is shorter than th is, several of them ending as early as 1908. As his publication rate allows Reinsel to turn out 9 playing years per calendar year, he would just have time to run another game in the time limit he has set himself.

Yourliking of Erehvon supports the findings of Peery's poll, where Erehvon came in first among voters who are not gamesmasters and second among gamesmasters. There is no doubt that Rod has a way with a pen and contributes a lot to the general hilarity of the Diplomacy scene not only in his own zine but in those that he is playing in as well. What I like about Costaguana is its diversity and unexpectedness. I have had farirly extensive, though spasmodic, correspondence with Conrad, and think I know what his fields of interest are.
