AMERICAN DIPLOMACY REGISTER supports the play of the board game Diplomacy published in North America by Avalon Hill.

Diplomacy has been played in an organized manner by mail since 1963. National tournament play has been conducted since 1967. This tournament play has been publicized primarily through the publications that support play by mail Diplomacy.

Diplomacy adherents justifiably feel that this is the best board game of all time. Most players are introduced to the game in an informal group or perhaps a club setting. Informal groups and clubs often have a prime organizer and continue, even flourish, as that organizer contributes effort. But as the effort wanes so does the group or club.

American Diplomacy Register exists to provide support services to group, club and tournament organizers. The "Where to Play Diplomacy" and "Events" registry are designed to assist players find the organizers and events, in an attempt to reduce the recruiting burden. The "Games" registry is to provide a central record of activity for whatever structural use an organizer feels is helpful. ADR ratings are intended to provide a tool to assist in promoting activity.

American Diplomacy Register will include instructional and entertainment features. Elements will be added, modified and deleted as organizers determine what is most helpful to the promotion of play and enjoyment. American Diplomacy Register focuses on features most helpful to organizers. For features of a more general interest the reader is referred to DIPLOMACY WORLD, a quarterly publication that has long served as the centerpiece of the Diplomacy hobby. The features of American Diplomacy Register listed on the right have been explored and developed in the postal Diplomacy publication Maelstrom. Fritz Juhnke and Paul Milewski were quite helpful in the ratings discussions. Pete Gaughan has been supportive and has offered very useful suggestions as this has been developing. Doug Beyerlein provided the original inspiration for this in 1967. Jim Meinel is most responsible for the idea to simply open the Registry, because carefully maintained data can be reworked after the fact.
