## Anduin

Sheesh! Talk about a busy month! Thank Ghod that's all over with. This is the first time I've even thought about Diplomacy since May. I NMR'd and NBR'd for my first time but in both cases it helped my position. To those of you who wrote and are awaiting a reply, sorry for the delay and I'll try to catch up as soon as I can. Why you may ask, was June a busy month for me you may ask, well, I'll tell you. Firstly, I had Finals in many of my subjects, and I also had an Acheivment test in Chemistry, as well as Standardized Testing in both Math and Chemistry. But I came through with flying colors I'm not embarassed to say, getting A's on both of my big tests (blush blush). But now, that's all over with and school is out. Soooooo...

This is a HR's issue. Included will be my updated HR's, a mailing list, some winter moves for those games that have them, and some other assorted tid-bits. I'll hold some stuff off for next issue which will be out at its normal time, the time of July in this case. Even with my busy schedule, I did find the time to attend a Chess demo given by Bruce Pandolfini, a National Master. I have included my game with him in here as I think those of you who like Chess may find it interesting. As you can tell, I am a real chess fanatic which brings me to my next topic. I have been running some games of Postal Chess between some of the subbers to Anduin. But there hasn't been too much interest due to the fact that nothing was at stake. If anyone is interested, I would like to run a postal chess tournement with a \$3 entrance fee and all the money going to the winner at the end. If you are interested, read on. I'll haver details later on somewhere else in the issue.

#### ANDUIN HOUSE RULES

#### DIPLOMACY:

- I. All the rules of Allan B. Calhamer's DIPLOMACY, as printed by Avalon Hill in the 1971 edition, will be used as far as practicality allows in postal play.
- II. Games are open to all citizens in the U.S. Canada, and people with APO, FPO, or CFPO addresses. Games may also be opened to foreigners but under special conditions (i.e., longer deadlines, etc.). All monies must be remitted in US currency.
- III. Stand-by positions are available free to subscribers. If you wish to be placed on the SB list, all that is nessacary is that you inform me.
- IV. Game deadlines will be published with each report of the game. In general, these deadlines will be on the 8th or 9th of each month. This allows me to publish them for the 15th.

- V. In the case of a postal strike in the U.S., all games will be postponed until after the strike, when an update issue will be printed with information on the games and new deadlines. A Canadian postal strike will merely suspend those games with Canadian participants.
- VI. Each submission of orders should include the games assigned "Boardman Number", the name of the player's country, the season of the move, and the players signature. If the game does not yet have a Boardman # assigned to it then use whatever name I have given it until I recieve the BN from the BNC.
- VII. Any person found to be playing under a pseudonym will be immediatly expelled from all ANDUIN games that person is in. A stand-by will then be found to replace him. Deception of the gm will not be tolerated.
- VIII. Unless otherwise specified, game fees are \$3 with a \$3 refundable NMR fee. If during the course of the game, a player never NMR's he will have his NMR fee refunded. When a player NMR's, a stand-by will be called for and if the player misses the next deadline, the position will be given to the stand-by and his orders will be counted.
- IX. If you wish to phone in orders please do so between the hours of 6:30-9:30pm on weekdays, 12:00-10:00pm on weekends. EASTERN STANDERD TIME! I will not accept orders phoned in outside of these times. It is not advisable to phone in orders because there are times when nobody is here to take them.
- X. Press releases found offensive will not be printed (basically this means racist or nazi-type press).
- XI. There shall never be more than two people from the same area-code participating in the same game and there will <u>never</u> be more than one from the same town.
- XII. I reserve the right to make any changes I feel are nessacary in the HR's. However, I will try and find out the general opinion of the players before doing so. All players will be informed of any changes made.
- XIII. DRAWS INCLUDE ALL SURVIVORS (DIAS).
- XIV: I TAKE NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE FAILINGS OF THE UNITED STATES POSTAL "SERVICE"!
- XV. Retreats. In the case of a unit being dislodged, a retreat will be called for. If the unit has only one space to go, the gm will arbitrarily retreat it there. In the case of a unit having a choice, orders may be made conditional upon that retreat and/or any others. Be specific. If the player chooses to retreat a unit OTB, he should notify the gm of this. If no insturction is given for a retreating unit, it will be removed. In the case of an NMR, all dislodged units will be removed.

XVII: If a vote is called for, and a player doesn't vote on it along with his orders for the next turn, the gm will count it as a "yes" vote for any or all votes called for. Be it for a concession, combinging of seasons, draw, or anything else concerning the game.

XVIII. Orders arriving late will be accepted if they are post-marked six days prior to the deadline. For Canadians and other foreign players, eight days prior to the deadline. What this means is if the USP"S" screws you grandly, you won't have to pay so much. Orders mailed sooner than the set numbers above, are mailed at the players risk of arriving late (usually, allow yourself at least four days and six if you are Canadian or foriegn.). In any case, I will never accept orders arriving four days after the deadline no matter when they are postmarked. If I cannot read the postmark, and orders are late, I will not count them.

XIX. Orders mailed by Express Mail, Mailgram or any other next day service, will be accepted if they are mailed two days prior to the deadline. If they are postmarked later than this, you run the same risk as stated in XVIII. Special Delivery does <u>not</u> speed up the amount of time it takes for a letter to get here. So when using other methods of mailing in orders (other than normal 1st class) check and see what you are actually getting for the extra money you are spending.

XX. In the case of more than three retreats in any one given season, the gm may seperate the seasons as he see's fit to do. In any case, seasons will be seperated if more than three people wish or them to be and state so.
