<u>Home of The Brave</u>, by Geoff Challinger (100, High Street, Swanscombe, Dartford, Kent, U.K.). Geoff seems to do the most professional job and takes the hobby very seriously, an attitude I gather that is not entirely universal in the U.K. though I could be wrong. <u>Home</u> has a lively letter column (as do most UK zines)

but what I really like is Geoff's editorials—of which the topic is almost always different each issue.

NMR:, by Brian Creese (256, Canbury Park Road, Kingston upon Thames, Surrey, U.K. KT2 6LG). My personal U.K. favorite due to Brian's superb writing style. He has an uncanny wit and your bound to find all kinds of satires within the pages of NMR! ranging in topics from Hobby Personalities to Pub and music reviews!

<u>Chantecler</u>, by Michel Liesnard (from Belgium). Unfortunately, Michel just folded after I believe twelve years of pubbing. $\underline{\mathbb{C}}$ was a really enjoyable zine.

Acolyte, by Pete Tamlyn (6, Broughton Close, Bierton, Aylesbury, Bucks, U.K. HP22 5DJ). An interesting and unique zine which I find thouroughly enjoyable. Fete likes D&D for some perverted reason but A makes for good reading (anyway). My favorite part of the zine is a column done by a man named Cedric Poslethwaite. Somehow I doubt that he is real (my apologies if you are Cedric) but he knows absolutely nothing about the hobby yet always writes something entertaining. Let me give you a short example of his incredible writing style:

"Of greatest urgency should be the swift conveyance of my sincere regrets to Ms. Owers whom I mistankenly described as a 'Mr.'. Ms. Owers is, of course, the chairman of the 'Sol III' convention mentioned last issue (and has, incidently, most charmingly informed me that the appelation refers to Earth, the third planet of the star 'Sol' and not third in a series of conventions (it was my mistake, my dear, Master Peter would not be so ignorant)). And having extricated myself from that parenthetical labyrinth, I would like..." I love it! Could this be an English Ed Wrobel?

I think y'all might be interested in sending for a sample or two of these zines. They're quite good compared to the common North American zine (though I'd say we have a larger range variety wise--as each U.S. zine can be completely different from any other).

From Steve Langley ((17 March, 1983)):

From John MacFarlene ((16 March, 1983)):

Anduin #19/20 hit the mailbox today—-I'd like to make some comments. As usual, a good issue; I'm disappointed that Anduin

won't be coming out for a couple of months, but as a student myself, I understand fully. Anyway, to more specific points:

I don't see why so many people have a bone to pick with Linsey's GMing. If they don't want strict GMing, they should stay out of <u>YoD</u>, or at least not play there. Walker says that a "unit giving support is also holding"—no, it isn't! A unit giving support is not <u>holding</u> (an order <u>not</u> to move), but is just <u>not</u> <u>moving</u>. Thus, A Bul H (A Gre S); A Gre H (A Bul S) is a double order. Bruce has set down very strict rules; why shouldn't he follow them? Why have rules if you're not going to follow them? Wrobel writes that Linsey would like to "escape responsibility by blaming his houserules." It is his responsibility to <u>follow</u> his houserules, not top bend rules and interpret orders. What if you, for some obscure reason, wanted to have a unit hold but had promised another player you'll support it? Looking over Linsey's houserules, you see that A Gre H (A Bul S), A Bul H (A Gre S would result in A Gre holding (double ordered), while giving the other players the impression that you intended a support. Imagine your anger as you find that the GM has <u>interpreted</u> your orders and supports Greece! I would rather play under BRUX than 99% of the world's GMs; at least you know exactly what your orders will do...

As for your comment about so many rules being "silly", you've said yourself that in the case of A Bels S A Hol, A Hol S A Bel" where both are fleets, you'd have them both hold. This is no more silly than refusing to interpret double ordered units, perhaps more so. There can only be one unit in a space at a time, why shouldn't we assume that if someone orders a unit there, he intends to move <u>that</u> unit? So, if you think Brux's rules are silly, remember you've got some "silly" rules too. Of course, I don't think either rule is silly, and neither do many other hobby members.

I agree fully with Walker's comments on controversy. It hurts if carried too far, but it can be constructive at times... I agree, Hichair <u>is</u> a jerk. But he's <mark>letting me ru</mark>n a subzine, so I shouldn't say such things in public. Your head dunking idea is good, but I think if you try it, you'll both end

up losers, like Byrne and Hanson.

I really like the double inside staple; hope you do change. I found Peery's comments interesting ((don't we all!)); I too have found many people who cannot write a decent game letter yet they nearly always have letters for print in various zines. Why is this? Ego problems?

Ed Wrobel writes that we are gamesters, first and foremost (love his writing style!). This is true of many of us, but why can't we enjoy the hobby for other things, perhaps even more so than games? In an old issue of <u>Eggnog</u> which I have, Konrad Baumeister writes that he has become disenchanted with the hobby because now it is made up of wargamers, to whom the game is everything, as opposed to SciFi fandom (the hobby's majority, if I've got my facts right, in the 60's and early 70's.) who lived on the press, letters, and articles. He's got a good point there.

Well, that about wraps it up. Good luck on your SAT!

((Thanks for an enjoyable letter John. I'm glad someone agrees with me that Hichair is a jerk! If you think letter-writers have

big egos, what do you think we publishers have?! About Linsey. Γ^* m about ready to accept the fact that some people actually like the way he GMs, though for the life of me I don't understand But I must disagree with your attempt to define "sillyness"(!). It all depends on where the GM draws the line. When he decides just how much he will interpret. As Wrobel said, just by reading the orders the GM is making an interpretation, it just all come down to where you draw the line. And I think that Linsey draws the line too tight. Okay, if he wants to GM that way, fine. It's just that the way I see it, I'm gm'ing for my enjoyment and for the enjoyment of my players. To see that they get the utmost for their money and to try and make it is much fun as I can within limitations, I set down houserules designed to aid the player or at least keep him from making a fatal error. this without GM interferance (just as all GMs do.) This way, there are no surprises for the player. Anyway, I have my opinion and you and Linsey have yours. I guess that as long as Linsey enjoys doing things the way he does and as long as he keeps getting (satisfied) customers, then you have my blessing to keep on GMing that way Bruce (see what I mean about eqos?!).))

From Dave Carter ((17 March, 1983)):

Next to my games I find your letter column the next most interesting thing to read. ANDUIN is fast becoming the place to read up on what is going on.

As much as it pains me to agree with anything that Brucie Linsey does. I have to agree with him 100% on the Wrobel thing. He was quite open about his style og GM'ing and Wrobel did technically double order 2 units. If the situation was told to me beforehand I would fully expect Bruce to do what he did. My sympathies go out to Ed Wrobel because I'm sure he must feel morally right and cheated out of something. I don't agree with Brucie's style of GM'ing but as a player in VoD I like playing under his GM manship. He is extremely reliable and he cares for the players in his games who can understand that he doesn't mean to be a prick. I don't feel the least bit "screwed" in any of his games and I would sign up instantly for any future games.

Could you tell me how Larry Peery can deduce that the Canadian hobby is a mess because he can't get anyone in the Great White Nord to sit on a Miller Award Nominations Committe? The snow must have numbed my brain because there seems to be a logic short circuit there somewhere. I don't know who else Larry asked but I said NO because I'm playing in 27 games, running 9 and having a guest-GM run 8 more. Excuuuuuse me.

From Dick Martin ((21 March)):

I'm having second thoughts as to whether I'll do the census again this year. I should know within the next month if I'll do it or not. I'll keep you posted. If you're <u>serious</u>, you should have your software ready to go and lots of time available.

I got a chuckle from your responce to the Zine Review Service. Two pages after saying you're doing a good job, you admit to a big screw up, + omit the Italian orders in 81IP! Whew! Your right though, there are others $\underline{\text{much}}$ worse than you are. I think I've played under the worst of them, yeah, some $\underline{\text{real}}$ losers.

Bruce's GM'ing has its good points, and its bad points, obviously. One point that nobody has brought up about all this "strictness" nonsense is what is meant by the word. "Strict" is a general term which Bruce often hides behind. Most GMs I've played under are very "strict". By that, I mean that they follow the rulebook closely. On the other hand, those 20 pages of disorganized and incomprehensible HRs that Bruce uses depart significantly from the rulebook on several points. So in a sense, Bruce is not "strict" at all.

There's also the point that telling a novice that he's a "strict GM" is meaningless. How is the novice expected to know the difference between a strict and a loose GM?

Having "no unannounced publishing delays" as a primary quality of GMing is very nice. I hear that Tretick has been publishing very regularly for quite some time. I'm a very strict GM — when it comes to following the rulebook. That includes taking it easy where the rulebook says to relax — particularly the section on writing orders.

Endgame Statements:

The GM: First of all, I want to thank all the players for playing it out. The game had <u>very</u> few NMRs (I think 2!) and I really appreciate that. From my view, the game was in France's bag with the success of his stab on England. There never seemed to be very much opposition to Randy and he just kept making progress. The East was very interesting as stabs flew back and forth between Russia, Austria, Turkey, and Italy. Poor Russia never seemed to be able to gain an advantage. Just as he would gain some centers back in one area, he woulld lose them in another. Turkey never seemed to get very far and Austria just stabbed everyone in sight! Italy was the only one to finally get going but it was too late. Good game guys.

Russia (Mark Murray):

At the start of this game I had a good alliance with Turkey. Italy was staying non-commital, and Austria had a good defensive position which would take time to crack without Italian support. Then I was attacked by England who was allied with France (France never had any enimies unless it was the inept Germany). To counter this threat I saw the need to get out of the log jam in the Balkans so I could deal with England. I thought the best way to do this would be to ally with Austria and stab Turkey. Unfortunately Austria did not play along and I now had 3 enemies. Fortunately France chose to stab England and I convinced England to vacate St. Pete and I returned to fight Austria and Turkey. - (C) France & Italy: For a change I stabbed a turn too soon instead of too late- hopefully, the net effect was suitably amusing.

Italy (Ernest Hakey):

First I have to say "thank you" in a sarcastic tone of voice to Mr. Palter for making the game interesting. Now for the Mad Pope's view of things. The game began with a bang- territorial conflicts all over the board- and soon shaped up into a "doom for Italy" situation: E/F vs. G in the west, I/A vs. R/T in the east. I quickly decided that I would have to try to break up both the western and eastern alliances and try to gain a center in the meantime. Therefore I intervened in the attack on Germany, taking and holding Munich and thus gaining a fleet to withstand Turkey with, and hopefully at the same time reinforcing a shaky understanding with France which might develop into an alliance later. Though aware of the danger of allowing E/F to grow too quickly, I was also aware that I was France's next target if England wasn't. On the eastern front, meanwhile, I had convinced Russia that the situation was stalemated and that an attack on Turkey would be advisable, in return for which I would help him into Berlin, and he would also be able to free units to defend against England in the north. It was at this point that Austria, never very communicative, went over to Turkey's side. I am convinced that had Austria stuck with Russia and myself for a turn or so and <u>then</u> stabbed <u>Russia only</u>, that Austria and I could well have taken numerous gains in the east while France was destroying England, which he had begun to do at my urging and with some of my suggestions (not all). Or, if Austria had stayed with Russia and myself until the end of Turkey, Russia and I might have then split Austria between us. In any case, two powers would have emerged in the east, hopefully myself and one other. However, with Austria's stab came the easy decision (from the Mad Pope's point of view) to do everything possible to ensure Austria's elimination. This sounds difficult, but with a strong alliance with France and a good understanding with Russia, whom Austria had also stabbed, it was quite possible. At first this meant giving up Tunis to the Turks, but at that point, provided Austria got eliminated, no price was too high to pay. It is possible that if Turkey had aided in Austria's destruction I would have agreed to defend against France's win - however, Turkey was justifiably adamant about stainding by his new ally (who had, after all, kept him from being eliminated himself), so I felt obligated to remain sided with France. In any case, I needed someone's help in eliminating Austria-and my Frenchh ally pulled through. In spite of some little parancia, France was very constant in his supply of French units and orders on his souther front allocated to my aid. built as I requested, moved as I desired and his aid was invaluable in the accomplishment of my goals. Russia, too. proved useful in the destruction of the Austrian homeland and later eliminating one of the last two Austrian armies (France taking care of the other). Anyway, at one point I had decided to

completely support France's victory, with two goals of my own as conditions; first and foremost, the elimination of Austria and the occupation of as much "Austrian" territory as possible; second, if possible to have more centers than all other powers other than France put together. I am happy about this ending, given my extremely poor tactical position in Fall 1903 : Austria is indeed eliminated. I have 9 centers and own all of the traditional Italian and Austrian domain. My thanks especially to Randy Ellis, Mark Murray and Michael Quirk for their performances and diplomacy in this game, and to Eric Kane for his superb adjudication.

And the winner--France (Randy Ellis):

When I got the gamestart for this game back in October of '81, I almost gave up right then. I was France and Phyllis Byrne was Germany and Steven Brooks was England. They both lived very close to one another and I had played in a game previously with Phyllis. I learned that she doesn't write or communicate in any way and for some reason, she didn't like me. My only chance, I felt, was to call Brooks and have a long talk with him via long distance. Expensive but as it turned out, worth it. Steven and I worked out an alliance and by F'01, Germany had managed to take Bur but England bounced her in Holland and I had 3 builds. and Italy decided to get some pieces out of Germany also and to my surprise, by F'03 (I think) Germany was eliminated. It just so happened that my English ally, Steve Brooks, neglected to write me before S'04 and he built F Lon. Being the paranoid little weasel I am, I thought for sure he was going to stab me now that Germany was gone so I moved to Eng (to bounce him I thought) but I made it! As it turned out, my "defense" against an English stab became a potent stab of England. I convoyed to Wales next season and after that. England was on the ropes since most of his forces were in Scandinavia fighting Russia. Meanwhile, the east was in utter chaos as Austria, Italy, Russia and Turkey would play musical allies (yes guys, similar to musical chairs; you switch allies as often as possible). Consequently, no one in the East gained much. Then it happened... England's fateful NMR that crushed his position by allowing me to get into Nth. Up 'til that point, he had a chance, after that, nil. With Russian aid, I crushed England and quickly became the dominant power on the board. With Russian aid, I crushed I had no enemies besides England so I had to make some. I coaxed Russia and Italy out of Germany, sent forces into Italy to aid him against the then-potent A/T alliance, and decided to crush Russia after Italy offered to help me win if I let him come in a "strong" second. I think my victory could have easily been stopped at several points but the Eastern powers, even up until the very end, were too busy bickering. I thank all of you for making this a very enjoyable game: for me anyway!

ANDUIN HOUSE RULES

DIPLOMACY:

- I. All the rules of Allan B. Calhamer's DIPLOMACY, as printed by Avalon Hill in the 1971 edition, will be used as far as practicality allows in postal play.
- II. Games are open to all citizens in the U.S., Canada, and people with APO, FPO, or CFPO addresses. Games may also be opened to foreigners but under special conditions (i.e., longer deadlines, etc.). All monies must be remitted in US currency.
- III. Stand-by positions are available free to subscribers. If you wish to be placed on the SB list, all that is necessary is that you inform me.
- IV. Game deadlines will be published with each report of the game. In general, these deadlines will be five weeks apart.
- V. In the case of a postal strike in the U.S., all games will be postponed until after the strike, when an update issue will be published with information on the games and new deadlines. A Canadian postal strike will merely suspend those games with Canadian participants.
- VI. Each submission of orders should include the game's assigned "Boardman Number", the name of the player's country, the season of the move, and the player's signature. If the game does not have a Boardman Number assigned to it, use whatever name I have given it until I recieve the # from the BNC. Please keep different games on seperate sheets of paper and do not put other notes on the order sheet as it may become lost in my files. If you can seperate the different correspondances, it makes things much easir for me.
- VII. Any Person found to be playing under a pseudonym will be immediatly expelled from all ANDUIN games that person is in. A stand-by will then be found to replace him. Deception of the GM will not be tolerated.
- VIII. Unless otherwise specified, game fees are \$3 with a \$3 refundable NMR deposit. This will be returned at the end of a game as long as the player has not NMR'd during the course of the game. When a player NMR's, a stand-by is called for and if the player misses the next deadline, the position will be given to the stand-by and he becomes the player of record.
- IX. If you wish to phone in orders, please do so between the hours of 6:30-9:30pm on weekdays, 12:00-10:00pm on weekends. EASTERN STANDARD TIME! I may not accept orders phoned in outside of these times. If you have last minute changes to make, the deadline is 10:00pm deadline day. It is not advisable to phone in orders anyway because there are times when nobody is here to take

them. Orders given to anyone else besides me are at your own risk!

- X. Fress releases are encouraged but releases found to be offensive will not be printed (basically this means racist or nazi-type press).
- XI. There shall never be more than 2 people from the same areacode participating in the same game and there will <u>never</u> be more than one from the same town. The GM will do his utmost to try and get a fair geographical spread of players.
- XII. I reserve the right to make any changes I feel are necessary in the HR's. However, I will try and find out the general opinion of the players before doing so. All players will be informed of any changes made.
- XIII. For a draw to pass, the vote <u>must</u> be unaminous. Draws may be made between any number of survivors, and may exclude some survivors as long as the vote is unanimous. NVR=Yes. However, there must be a majority of people voting YES for a draw or concession to pass (i.e., a draw or concession cannot pass because everyone forgot to vote!). This is a change in policy and become effectivie for all new games coming into Anduin. The games currently being run are all DIAS.
- XIV. I take no resposibility for the failings of the United States (or any other) Postal "Service"!
- XV. Retreats. In the case of a unit being dislodged, a retreat will be called for to be due with the next season's orders. Orders may be made conditional upon the retreat. Be specific. If a player chooses to retreat a unit OTB, he should notify the gm of this. If no instruction is given to a dislodged unit, it will be removed by the gm. In the case of an NMR, all dislodged units of the NMR'ing player will be removed.
- XVI. If a vote is called for, and a player doesn't vote on it along with his orders (or if he NMRs) for the next turn, the gm will count it as a "yes" vote for any or all votes called for. Be it for a concession, combining of seasons, draw, or anything else concerning the game.
- XVII. Orders arriving late will, in general, never be accepted. The exception to this being if I have not yet typed up the game report, and it is less than four days late, the orders will be accepted. These orders will not be accepted however, unless the postmark on them is six days before the deadline (eight in Canada and other foreign countries). What this means is that if the postal service screws you grandly, you will not have to pay so much.
- XVIII. Orders mailed by Express Mail, Mailgram, Carrier Pigeon or any other form of service are acceptable unless I have to pay for them, in which case they will be returned. Special Delivery does

 \underline{not} speed up the amount of time it takes for a letter to get here. So when using methods other than the normal mail, check carefully to see what your getting for your money.

XIX. I reserve the right to seperate seasons whenever I see fit to do so. Usually, seasons will be seperated when there are three or more retreats and/or an inordinate amount of winter adjustments. Other cases where I might seperate seasons are if there are a large number of NMRs. In any case, seasons will automatically be seperated upon request of a majority of the players. If a tie arises, I will decide whether to seperate seasons or not. It is advisable to always submit back-up orders no matter which way you vote on season seperation just in case.

The main difference between this and RB is that in this game, you make your own lines instead of buying up lines that already exist. I think I enjoy this one a bit more than RB. Also for 2-6 players. A totally different game is ILLUMINATI. This game is sort of a joke but is still done in an excellent manner and very playable. It is about world domination, corruption and big buisiness. Each player plays an "Illuminati" and trys to gain control of several corporations like the IRS, The Mafia, etc. For 2-8 players.




