SCROLLS, SPELLS AND OTHER LETTERS

From Scott Cameron - Hicksville, NY:

Your discussion last issue with Rod Walker on morals was interesting but failed to reach the heart of the matter. The point I think you both missed is that a person cannot even claim to have morals without believing in a religion or religious—type philosophy (Rod's belief that principles established over a long period of time by rational people constitute morals falls into this latter category). If you don't claim to know of a guiding force to the world, then there can be no basis for an ostensibly universal system of morals (all moral systems are universal by nature—if they're not universal, then they're opinions, not morals). Either everybody is subject to the same higher power and therefore the same morals imposed by that power, or they are not.

In the absence of this guiding force (and as a nihilist ${f I}$ certainly doubt the existence of this force, even if you still seem to have some notion of "societal good")), morals can be seen to be merely justifications for the actions people take. For example, a person who decides for whatever reason not to drink alcohol will say, "drinking alcohol is wrong/immoral so I don't do it" (or "drinking alcohol is unhealthy and my body is the temple of the Lord" or some such). Meanwhile, someone who does drink alcohol would not have an idea like this as part of his moral system. Morals can therefore be said to include the whole range of personal decisions from choice of clothes ("I don't like checked ties") to decisions on government ("I think all Italians shuld be rounded up and shot"). Each of these decisions are made for the same reasons (personal convenience or prejudice) and with the same justification (little or none). In reality, morals simply serve as excuses for doing something you want to do or not doing something you wouldn't do anyway. ((I think the point you are missing is that a person's moral code is based (hopefully) on some sort of logical building block. Thus he/she would not dislike Italians unless there was a good reason not to like Italians. As for checked ties, that is a matter of personal preference and I'll grant you that there is no single cohesive or logical factor guiding one's preference in ties or art or anything else for that matter. It's a matter of taste. I happen to like Led Zeppelin, but I also enjoy Beethoven. Sure people have different morals. If you prefer to call them opinions or ethics, that is fine -- it is not the word you use, but the definition that is important. Whether you call it your moral code or your 'code of honor' or your ethics or whatever does not matter.))

In the absence of any higher view of morals, and in recognition of the fact that the world is composed of individual people, each of whom has his own needs and desires, then I would say that there is only one idea which might be applicable to all situations. This is the belief that a person should be allowed to do anything he wants so long as he does not infringe on other people's doing the same. In the absence of the provable existence of god this is the only "ethic" which makes any logical, rational sense. ((This "ethic" could also be described as a "moral", don't you think?))

You and Rod are both wrong in your discussion of NY vs. LA. Both places are rotten places to live. Most cities are beat places to live in unless you have to and I'd say the country is much preferable. In fact, I'd say the best place to live is... (continued next letter).

From Rod Walker - Encinitas, CA:

Another interesting issue of ANDUIN. This is a quick response, but no time for an extensive one. We've been over the "deity" question before...but as a quick side comment, I will agree with you if "deity" means "being that created the universe". I prefer to redefine the term as a being of quite finite (but still very great) powers which has influenced the course of evolution and of human social development on this planet, to the best of its abilities and with objectives only very dimly perceivable by us. If you think of "worship" as a form of communication, you will then be very close to the point. However, this is not the sort of idea I can spread around and get people to work up much enthusiasm for; the traditional religions do a better job, and that's what they're for. ((The idea of a "being with finite powers" is almost harder to grasp than that of Jehovah almost. I think it may indeed be possible that some other being or beings visited our planet long ago (ET's if you like) and have since disappeared either by leaving or dying out. With the size of our universe, it is quite possible that other planets have developed life forms more advanced than ours and have traversed space to reach us and influence our evolution. The connections between the Egyptians and some South American cultures is quite striking. Thor Hyerdahl talks at length about this in his book, <u>The Ra Expeditions</u>, though he does not discuss the concept of some ET being.))

I am sorry, however, to see you still clinging to the old $\underline{\mathsf{non}}$ <u>sequitur</u> that whatever is done in the name of religion is done <u>by</u> that religion. You are looking at intrusions of religion into the secular world brought about forcibly by individuals who were <u>using</u> religion for their purposes. I do not believe that anything should be condemned by the fact that some individuals distort or None of the acts you complain of are inherent in the normal beliefs and practices of the major religions (in fact, quite the reverse). It is the <u>inherent</u> values of a system you ought to consider, not the abuses. ((Maybe so. but I still maintain that the mere existence of organized religion has been the cause of much sorrow and pain and has been used as an outlet for man's worst inherent qualities - those of greed, power and just plain meanness.)) (That said, you have to realize that any belief system which claims to have a key to absolute truth...whether Christianity or Marxism or any other

religion...will attract fanatics. That must be guarded against.)

Evolution: I don't see we have much of a disagreement here. However, you have to be careful about over-emphasizing natural selection. Darwin himself opposed people like Wallace who wanted to make natural selection the only mechanism by which evolution worked. The fossil record does not substantiate this, since it does not substantiate the old idea of gradualism. The primary

mechanism of evolution does appear to be random occurrence. involves the random occurrence of mutations (some of which might not be visible) and the random occurrence of change in the environment, including the occurrence of disasters which wipe out great numbers of species. In an equilibrium situation a developing new species might not find an ecological niche into which it can move (not available, or already filled by another quite efficient species). For instance, if another big-brained animal were to appear, we'd wipe it out at the present time. But in a post-disaster situation, there is plenty of room for anything that develops, so that new species which might otherwise never make it becomes the dominant life form instead. In normal times. it is not always the "fittest" that survives; whoever is there first has a natural advantage. Really, a lot of thinking earlier this century was to define whatever survived as having been "the fittest". That is simply circular reasoning. The fossil record shows long periods in which little or no evolutionary change occurred at all, plus occasional appearances of new species which simply added themselves to the existing fauna without necessarily displacing any other species. This last seems always to be associated with evidence of disaster on a cosmic scale (for instance, the last layer of dinosaur fossils or rocks from that era is almost invariably covered by a clay or sediment containing unusually high quantities of iridium...an element whose presence is pretty conclusive proof of a collision with a comet or some such body. In any event, the Cretaceous Catastrophe literally wiped out every land animal with a body weight of more than 25 pounds. Current thinking is that the object hit the Pacific and punched a hole in the Pacific plate (the "hot spot" currently generating the Hawaiian Islands), with a crater 100km wide...now vanished through recycling of the ocean floor. That is the sort of chance that gives evolution its big breaks.

Mankind is of course its own ecological catastrophe, and who knows; we might have to look to a post-human world. Read Dougal Dixon's <u>After Man: A Zoology of the Future</u>. I don't agree with him in some instances (<u>e.g.</u>, he does not postulate the survival of the coyote), but the book is very interesting and informative.

((Ah yes, often have I pondered what the future holds for the poor coyote. We don't have much of a disagreement I think concerning evolution, much of what you said I could have quoted out of textbooks. But, you are applying your obviously vast knowledge of the subject incorrectly in several instances. Yes, random occurance is the main means of evolution, but those occurances which prove to be beneficial or helpful are the ones that survive and thrive—the survival of the fittest. Naturally if an organism is occupying a certain ecological niche already it will have an advantage over other organisms when competing in that niche. So the other organisms must adapt and change and ultimately, evolve. Your telling me that they have an advantage is a simple statement of fact. It's like me telling you that the sun rises in the east and sets in the west. So what?))

From Dan Palter - Cedarhurst, NY:

Dear Conceited Twits (since you don't identify which of you is which I am forced to address you as a group entity),

Let's take your last comment first — if a typo equals mental disorder then there are nothing but mentally disordered people who write. ((Ah yes, the ole' "it was a typo trick"!)) I had presumed that my meaning was clear on that sentence; If not I will elaborate. Our concept of government descends through the enlightenment of the 18th century plus the English tradition of an adversary legal culture with relatively limited government ((This still doesn't make any sense, Dan. What is an "adversary legal culture" besides confabulation? Is it a culture in which the legal system is based on the two sides of each dispute facing off in the courtroom? We're sorry if you consider questioning your flimsy arguments "nasty", but what did you expect?)) The combination of these two traditions has produced a set of norms here that do not apply to most of the rest of the European world to say nothing of the excolonial portions of the globe.

For the rest, masty comments and a pitiful few books (what you are describing is by my standards a rather small section of a home library) do not expertise make, and based on your comments you either have only read popular histories or don't know what the big words inside them mean. Let's take your objections one at a time.

Your first insertion was conceded by me in the portion immediately following the insertion. Of course, many Germans disliked Weimar as a product of Versailles. Nonetheless, after the final wave of postwar chaos in 1923, they stomached it quite well until economics drove the governing coalition apart. not disagreeing with you, but I still contend that it was a combination of the two - poor economics and a dislike of the Versailles treaty. Why you can't or won't accept this simple fact Since WWII we have a similar situation in Italy is beyond me.)) where a fascist bloc on the right plus a much larger communist bloc on the left leave only a relatively marrow majority of democratic parties who accept liberal democracy. These parties, spanning by our standards birchers and revolutionary socialists, have had to run a coalition dance to keep the allied imposed They have managed to do so only because neither system working. war nor economics has ever caused them to completely fall out over the risks of bringing the whole thing tumbling down. The same was true in Germany. Even the democratic parties would have overthrown Versailles and even the Weimar majority had reservations on the applicability of Western norms to Germany. Yet they survived economic collapse after the war, a punitive peace and civil strife from the right and left to come out for a six-year run as a respectable liberal democratic state. collapse of 29-31 was economically induced. The democratic parties, divided sharply on class and economic lines were simply incapable of allocating the pain in any agreed upon manner. This led to government by decree and ultimately Hitler as the only alternative to communism on one hand and starvation on the other. It was a sorry failure in which all the German political and economic leaders share much blame. ((It could be said that the United States government was an economic failure during the

depression, but it was not overthrown. We changed presidents, of course, but the government remained the same institution it had been before the depression. If the German government had been a firmly entrenched one of several hundred years, the depression simply would not have caused sufficient instability to permit Hitler to gain power as he did. Sorry, Dan, both factors were of vital importance.))

- (2) You prove with your second comment that either you cannot read or have no mind. Where did I say Goebbels had "actual authority over the city"? I clearly stated his <u>party</u> title, not any municipal, land or national office. ((What you claim to state and what we interpret are obviously two different things. Though again you are taking our comment here as if it were an <u>attack</u> on the point you had made. It is not. We were merely clarifying Goebbels' position. To argue over such a trivial point is, well, trivial.)) Nonetheless he used his Gau, please note again the <u>party</u> title, organization to run a joint transit strike with the KPD that brought Berlin to its knees and scared the powers that then were out of their feeble collective wits. For the first time since the Kapp Putsch a revolutionary mob had seriously changed the balance of political power. What scared them was the two parties leading the mob as the prior time it had been the quite tamable SPD.
- The record of Nazi measures against the Jews is subject to several interpretations. If you are so motivated I will swap footnotes with you. At what point does official anti-Semitism plus tolerated but unofficial terror turn into genocide. I will stand by my statements and am prepared to document them. is that down until the start of the war the official rationale was forced emigration - a rationale that lead to the Nazis allowing Palmach training camps for settlers emigrating to Palestine to run Germany until 1939. Scarcely the mark of the ovens of 1943. Similarly until the invasion of Russia such silly but nonetheless real schemes as the Madagascar plan were being floated. So let's review the case. The mass roundup of Jews only follows Kristallnacht - until then the bulk of the population of both the official and unofficial prisons were communists or other political enemies of the Nazi's. The mass murders only start in Russia in 1941 and not in the rest of Europe until 1942. Did this make it great to be a jew in Berlin in 1934? No, not hardly but far better than in 1941 and far better then than 1943. Horror is relative. Dachau was scarcely a summer resort. It was also not Treblinka. ((You know, Dan, you appal me. Let me change the ethnic group since people are desensitized to hearing what befell the Jews. Let's say the United States passed laws forbidding blacks to use any of the same facilities as whites, employ whites, marry whites, be educated with whites, be citizens, retain any assets, use the same mass transit conveyances as whites, shop at the same time as whites, etc., etc. All of this was perpetrated on the Jews prior to Kristallnacht, according to Milton Meltzer's **Never To Forget.** In addition, Jews were beaten and killed throughout Germany at the encouragement of the establishment. Throughout Meltzer's book are examples of this sort of activity. I also recommend Lucy Dawidowicz's book The War Against the Jews, if you have the stomach for it. The conditions for Jews in

Germany before Kristallnacht were comparable to the conditions for blacks in slavery in this country, which were quite dehumanizing.))

- The Germans knew the Jews were being taken in the night. were communists, uncooperative priests, homosexuals, members of the left populist wing of the Nazi party, and a host of others. Again it is easy with 20/20 hindsight to say they should have known, but how? ((Uh uh. The key here is that while official policy was aimed at all of these groups, in practice it was much worse for the Jews than for any of the other groups (see my last interjection - those restrictions did not apply to the other groups to the degree that they did to the Jews and in some cases not at all. Die Juden were singled out quite clearly. The German people are not excused, exonerated, or absolved at all.)) The worst excesses were in the East and none were publicized. There were thousands of civil servants involved in the repressive operations.)) By the time the stories made it back from "home on leave" soldiers in '42-'43 about the real massacres in the East the average German couldn't help but know that he was living in a gangster state. By then it was also far too late. The patriotic impulse in the midst of a great world war plus a terror apparat with nothing to lose should not be underestimated. For example, after the bomb plot Hitler went wild against the old imperial ruling classes. ((Not quite an ethnic group, Daniel. Attacking a political group for their views or because they pose a threat is not comparable to destroying an ethnicity merely for existing as such.)) People with extremely minor connections by action or blood to the conspirators were savagely tortured and ((Horrible, but not **as** horrible, nor on as grandiose a scale.)) The elite of Germany did nothing as their own kindred were led off almost at random to the slaughter. And these would have tried to save the Jews?
- If you think everything I say is false name your sources and line of reasoning. I have briefly named mine and am prepared to go over them at whatever length is necessary. Either you have no knowledge of the topic or are using the immediately post WWII sources that do not take account of the scholarship of the last 20 years. What you are mouthing is British propaganda, however prettily packaged under university press labels. ((You say "British propaganda" - you mean "Jewish propaganda", but don't wish to sound anti-Semitic.)) See again the Lucas and Taylor books I recommended. The key to Prague and Danzig was the military clauses of the Versailles Treaty. A militarily impotent Germany could do nothing about the Versailles settlement of Eastern Europe. A rearmed Germany with her Western borders reentrenched behind a new Westwall could do what it liked in the The keys were as follows. France had the military strength to enforce Versailles as long as Germany was totally disarmed but feared being bled to death even so without British support. Brits wouldn't fight for Versailles so Hitler was allowed to Having been allowed to do so there was nothing militarily a Franco-British coalition could do to save Czechoslovakia or The phony war was proof thereof. The rest of Europe didn't "Have to fight or face an imperialist Germany". They had always faced one. They could have fought to retain a toothless

Having given the German Eagle back its claws they lacked the power to do more than defend themselves while waiting on events. The ultimate defeat of Germany required the power of the US and USSR. Britain and France themselves could with proper planning have defended themselves but could never have gone over to the offensive to beat Germany. However, the fall of France and the Battle of Britain did not mean a general World War. A different British government could have made peace on fairly generous terms in the spring of 1941 and probably gotten a German withdrawal from France and the low countries in the bargain. The conversion to world scale was brought about by the entry of the US and USSR into the picture - see Lucas especially for possible alternate endings and do remember that the renewal of the selective service in the US in the fall of 1941 passed the House by one vote after considerable presidential arm twisting-without Hitler's help FDR might never have been able to bring us into the war. ((I am incredulous! The Germans would most certainly not have withdrawn from France and the low countries had Britain sued for peace. The Germans believed firmly that they would crush the British and had no reason to bargain. Germany annexed Austria and Czechoslovakia, Germany invaded Poland, Germany invaded France, Germany attacked Great Britain, Germany invaded the Soviet Union. To think for even a moment that the Germans did not desire world hegemony is inconceivable. There was no room for negotiation at any point. The British, French, and everyone else should have acted a lot sooner than they did. This point of view is supported by the vast majority of historians and people. Does it not surprise you that, other than by the Nazi party and its ilk, World War II is universally (i.e. worldwide) considered a "good war"?))

In summation, I'm more than prepared to have a reasonable discussion but find it very typical of many people in this area that they see persecution of Jews in capital letters while ignoring the other circumstances of the period and place. They also tend to equate number of books with knowledge of their contents (would you care to see the WEG/DSP library on the period-come in some night when we do playtests and ask Stefan to show you around) and to attribute mental disorders to those who fail to share their shallow prejudices.

((Calling us shallow and prejudiced reflects only upon the source of such labels and has no effect upon the truth. The facts are what they are, and they belie your contentions about history.))
