This game has had a rough time of it, and we hope that it has at last found a permanent home. It will be known herein as ARMA-1. Since the last time any moves were published was 9 July, we shall refresh everyone's memories: The positions:

AUSTRIA (Reinsel): A Vienna, A Rumania, A Venice, A Serbia, F Albania.

ENGLAND (Dygert): A St. Petersburg, F North Sea, F Norwegian Sea, F Barents Sea.

FRANCE (Curtiss): A Burgundy, A Spain, A Gascony, F Belgium, F Marseilles.

GERMANY (Johnson): A Ruhr, A Kiel, F Sweden.

ITALY (Tzudiker): A Munich, A Berlin, A Tyrolia, F North Africa, F Ionian Sea.

RUSSIA (von Metzke): A Warsaw, A Galicia, A Finland, F Norway.

TURKEY (Brannan): A Constantinople, A Bulgaria, F Greece, F Aegean Sea.

Note that Conrad has replaced Jack Chalker in Russia. Also note that there is no English army in Moscow as was erroneously reported in the last Costaguana.

At the end of Fall 1902, the supply centers were distributed among the great powers as follows:
