The new province--a non-supply center--is Bukovina. It borders Galicia, Kiev, Bessarabia, Rumania, Transylvania, and Debrecen.

A group of Seattle players, headed by Greg Long, has challenged the LTA to a game of team Diplomacy. The Seattle people will play France, Austria, and Russia. The LTA will play England, Germany, and Italy. Units which may not be dislodged will stand in Bulgaria and the three Turkish supply centers. All other provinces will be open game. The first team to have 18 units on the board following a winter turn, will win. Jim Dygert will captain the LTA powers, and Greg Long will captain the Seattle powers. It is the duty of the team captain to submit the moves for the whole team, but each country's orders must be signed by the player of that country. The other two LTA players are Clyde Johnson and Brian Bailey. Mr. Long should inform the gamemaster of the positions to be played by the other two Seattle players, as well as himself.
