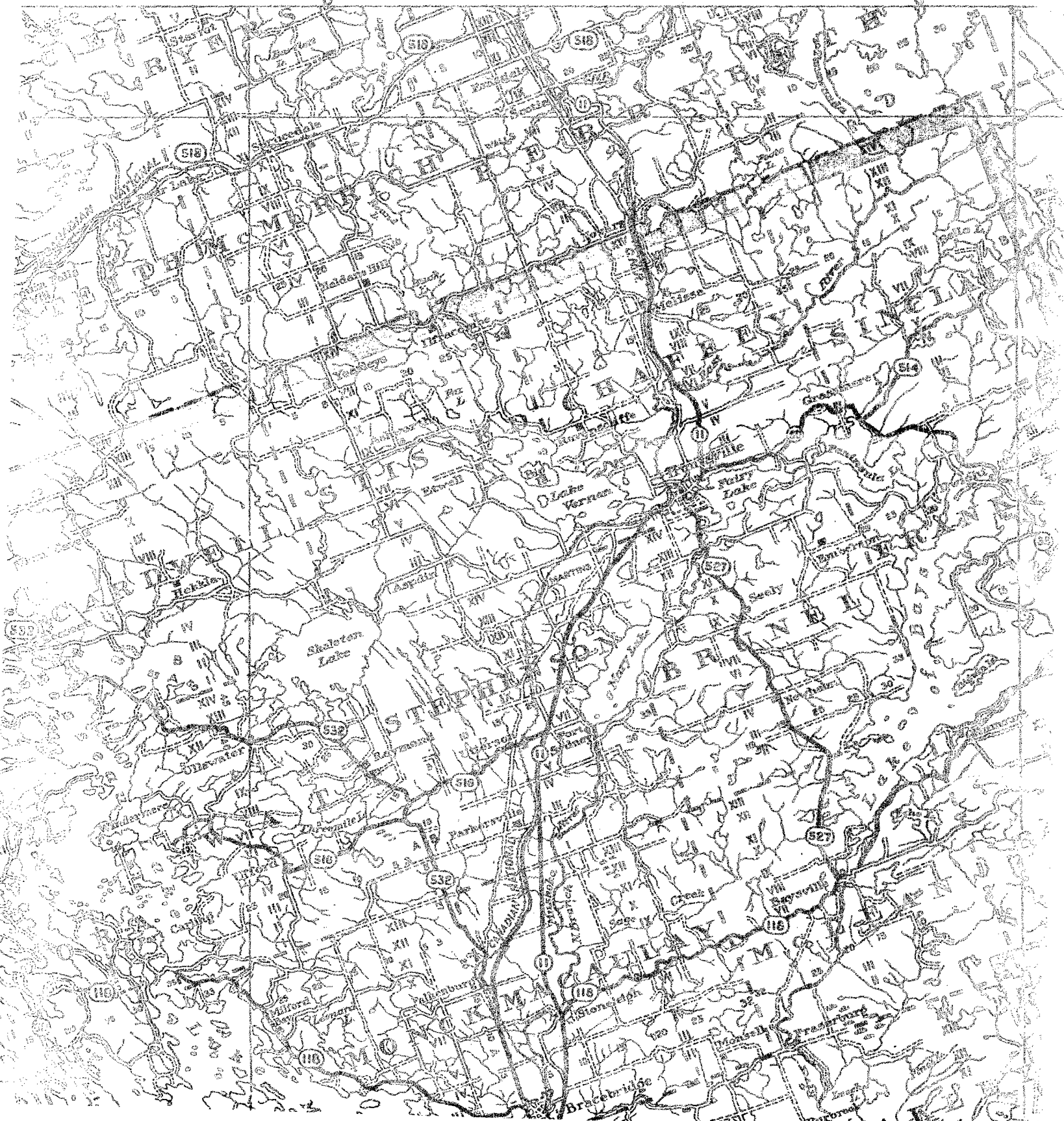

The Game of Finlandia- designed by David Head

A Little History: This game is set milleniums after World War Three. As a result of this "war to end all wars", the earth was blown to bits, with random meteors forming islands, etc. and continental drift of other islands we find the once small country of Finland as the dominant land mass. To the northeast is Ireland and the southeast is Sardinia, and to the west is the shrunk foundation of eastern Russia; siberia. Man has evolved enough to develop intelligent civilizations, and with it war. But during this pre-war period, the major powers; Nisko, Korets, Brody, Agra, Lipno, Rypin, and Otaru, have started colonies, with expansion in mind. The aggressive country of Brody has ignored overseas colonies and has absorbed weaker powers to the south. Thus sets the stage for imminent conflict in Finlandia!

Rules for Finlandia

1. The same rules as seen in the 1971 Diplomacy rule book except where noted below.

3. The game starts in the year 5,000 AD, in the spring.

4. The canal that passes through Fiel is identical to that of constantinople.

5. Aland is a sea space and may not be occupied by armies.

6. If a colonial power gets one or more builds, at least one of the builds must be plaecd in the colonial power.

7. A unit may enter the Pristok Marshes freely but these marshes provide the support of one army once in. I.E., three units are needed to dislodge one.

8. A country may build in a captured opponent's colonial centre if he owns it.

9. There are 21 home centres, 14 colonial, and 41 neutral centres, therefore victory criterion is ownership of 38 centres.

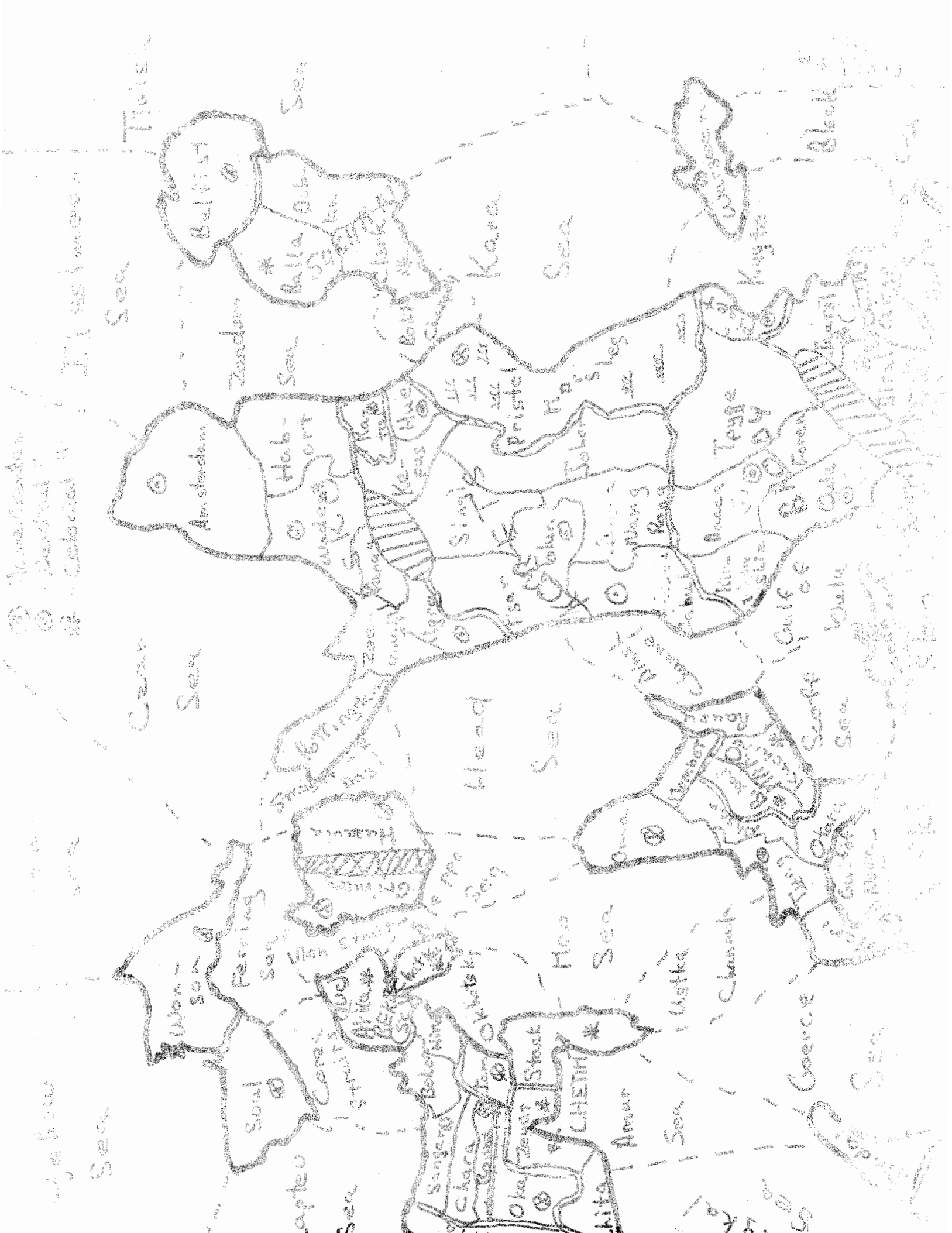
Optional rules: every year one neutral centre that has been taken by a major power or his colonial troops rebels and declares independence. the centre is once again neutral and the power loses ownership of it. the centre would be select ed at random.

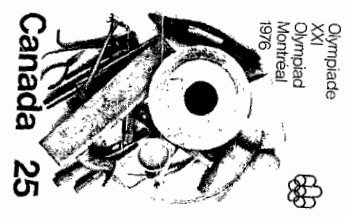
colonial powers declare their independence and a new player is brought into the game to play that positioñ.
