


First off, here is a letter from Laurence Gillespie on SPI.

particularly those so unpatriotic enough to spend the \$6.00 surcharge necessary to get S&T. I have spoken to at least a dozen major wargamers, both American and Canadian, about this, and not one has ever been able to come up with an answer to the question, "Why the \$6.00 extra?"! This includes some people who work at SPI. Ask Joel Klein, I think he's the one that manages their shipping department, and see if he can give you one good reason why Canucks have to pay the \$6.00 extra. I'm sure you can read a postage meter, and it is quite obvious that the maximum cost of postage per issue is 50¢! Assuming a ten per cent difference in Canadian/USA third class mailing rates and you get 30¢! ((DH here, I'm not sure, but I would think that there would be no difference in US third class rates, whether they were mailed toalocation in Canada or the US. Canadian third class rates are the same to both Canada and the USA. The surcharge on Canadian subs is now \$3.00 per year, but this is still considerably more than other magazines that I get from the US. If postage was a major factor in the difference between a Canadian and US sub, why does the Western Staml (Stamp) Collector charge the same for both a US and a Canadian sub, when they have 20 more mailings a year than SPI? The postage arguement just is not valid.)) Even is SPI found a way to mail S&T to their US subscribers for absolutely nothing there would still be three dollars above and beyond the total mailing cost. And it is no where near that, of course. I am also informed that using UPS saves S&T 2¢ per issue. As UPS does not extend its services

to Canada, there's 12¢, combined with the 30¢ postage differential and you get \$5.58 ((\$2.58)) sheer ripoff. Sheer Ripoff! Outrageous in fact. worst of all, is the absolutely CRAPPY level of service. Issues of S&T (when I received them) took an average of 3½ months to get here! took in excess of six!! Which means that any news or special offers in the zine are hopelessly outdated. I could vaguely understand some twit paying through the nose if they sent the issues air mail or something, but when it is obvious that they don't give a darn about giving their Canadian readers service at any price, what is the use. I could tell you tales that would twird your turban about the horrendous muddle SPI made of my game orders. I ordered about \$35.00 worth of stuff and none of it ever got to me less than five months transit period! What really gets my goat is the page after page of sheer BULLSHIT they cram into S&T telling you how much they "care" about their customers. Worst of all, is the sheer amount of prejudice To the best of my knowledge, Americans NEVER have trouble with their orders, all of which get their in under four weeks. No, as far as I am concerned, SPI and S&T are the biggest ripoff artists around, and if by pressing a button I could destroy them all, I'd gladly do it. ((DH here again, I would suggest that any Canadians interested in SPI products write Herb Barents 1142 S. 96th St. RR4 Zeeland, MI 49464 USA He charges 50¢ extra for mailing etc for Canadian orders, but when you consider that you Can buy an \$8.00 game for \$6.00 you are still saving \$3.50, as an \$8.00 game costs a Canadian \$10.00 from SPI. And if you can get acoupon from his zine Boast, you are even farther ahead. Herb also sells products from all the major wargame companies.))


