GAMESMASTER BECOMES VERY UPSET!!!!!!! (at himself)

A couple of errors in the "Fall 1913" moves have come to my attention. First, the English A Arg-Bol did fail as I indicated, however, it was not dislodged as I incorrectly noted.

Also, a conflict between sets of House Rules occurred in the German/Italian moves. I mistakenly ruled according to my (ATIANTIS) House Rules, when I should have remembered the EREMION House Rules. Since this game was begun under Rod's rules, I will not change the rules in mid-game.

The moves:

Italy:

F Bel--Hol A Bur--Bel

F NthS (S) F Bel--Hol

Germany:

F Hol (S) A Ruh-Bel A Ruh--Bel

This is an example of the so-called "Miller's Rule" which says that a unit which has been dislodged may not give support. The German F Hol has been dislodged, so its support order fails, and A Ruh fails to gain Bel, being stood off by the Italian A Bur--Bel.

Under ATLANTIS House Rules, the support would have been valid because the attack would not have "come from the side" as the Rules for Diplomacy require (page 4).

I erred in not remembering the EREWHON rules, and now Germany (Payne) is required to send in the retreat for F Hol (Helgoland Bight or ...), and one more removal, since Hol is lost to him as a supply center (and goes to Italy). ₩ the above dust by the second

I have really been making mistakes in this game. Perhaps I should do this first before the other (easier) games. I'll have to avoid the alcohol also ... speaking of which, I have some of Larry Peery's favorite drinks to pass along to you. I have not tried all of them yet, but eventually....

White Russian: made in a Mai Tai glass with lots of Vodka, just a bit of Kahua. and lots of cream. A nice social drink that doesn't leave you gassed.

Chivas Regal and water, tall; for serious drinking. A single ice cube, fill the glass to about $\frac{1}{2}$ " with Chivas, and toss a dash of soda in it. Three or four will kill a horse. /But oh so good!/

F-310: Creme de Menthe (2 shots) in a Mai Tai, with just a bit of Kahlua, on ice. Tastes like Scope.

White Russian and a Brandy Alexander. Not to heavy on the Kahlua, has about 4 shots, served in a Mai Tai glass or three or four Alexander glasses. Two of these and no more driving. But so mild, tastes like a chocolate malt. However, has about 3,000 calories. Yummay.

My favorite is Southern Comfort and 7-Up. Put about 1-1-1 in a water glass, add an ice cube or two, fill to level desired with 7-Up or Swiss (2000), and relax. It calms the disposition and eases weary muscles.

Then there's always the good ole' Screwdriver: Vodka and orange juice mixed 50-50 in a water glass or tumbler for those in a hurry. To get vitamin C....
