COMMENTARY: 1970C - 1903 AND 1904

That Precocious Peery, Ruler of Russia, is crowing in his zine, ZENOGOGIC, of his forthcoming "win" in 1970C. While in the past two years he gained 5 new supply centers for a total of 12, he has only 10 units on the board, just 3 more than after 1902. The road to 6 more centers with room for 8 more builds is in his never-never land of fairies. Even after taking Greece and presuming he can grasp all of Italy, which I doubt, he still needs 2 of the following centers: Tunis, Munich, Berlin.

Underiably Peerirussia made gains since 1902 but don't be impressed. They are ill-gotten goods accrued by default. His Southern enemiss, Austria and Turkey, missed critical moves. He was spared devastation in the North by the atrophy of Germany, primarily. And the failure of the U. S. Post Office to deliver Italy's Spring 1903 moves was yet another boon.

Barring a drastic recasting of alliances, or an Act of God, of which California is overwhelmed of late, the relevant question is not whether Peerirussia can win but if Peerirussia can develop a stalemate. To do this he needs luck and skill, which he presumably does not totally lack — his good fortune thus far is self-evident, not so his skill. This is a harsh statement, but he did manage to alienate his two Western neighbors, he did attack all other neighboring countries, and he is without an ally. Such a prependerance of negatives is indicative of something to be desired, and that something may be skill.

England or France, each with fewer units than Peerirussia, have a superior play for victory than that binomial-bibulous-braggadocio, the refugee from Minsk (or is it Minsky's!).

We've seen but the first half of this war-drama, so shut your Peeristic mouth and shroud your bareass, lest you get pricked. On with the play.

St. Peerigrad, 3 January 1905:

The Government of the Greater Peerian Empire wishes to inform the Government of Germany that if its actions indicated by the spring moves are in line with the feelings it expressed to us in its latest communique the Government of the Empire is willing to consider negotiating a settlement of the conflict between the two nations, a settlement which will spare the German nation the fate of Austria, Turkey, etc. As for the others...well....

St. Peerigrad, 4 January 1905:

The Empire has declared its unilateral opposition to the creation of a free Jewish state in Israel, Palestine, or other Mid-eastern areas rightfully belonging to the Arabs.

St. Peerigrad, 6 January 1905:

The Emperor, Peerimaximus, today ordered the Empire's ambassador in Paris home. It is known everywhere that the Government and Empire have been displeased with the French for a long time.

St. Peerigrad, 7 January 1905:

Empire officials were shocked today to learn that His Majesty, the Emperor of Emperors, has decided to visit the Polish city of Stettin and deliver a speech. Although officials cannot understand the reasoning behind this move they did indicate that the title of the speech would be: "From Stettin on the Ealtic to Trieste on the Adriatic a great iron curtain has descended across Europe."

St. Peerigrad, 8 January 1905:

Buillboards began appearing around the city this morning proclaiming: TODAY EUROPE, TOMORROW THE WORLD, THE DAY AFTER THE UNIVERSE!
