#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### ADDITION TO ATLANTIS HOUSE RULES

The section under "B." should be changed to:

B. While the rules do not allow a unit to retreat to the <u>country</u> from which an attack is made, it does not specifically prohibit a unit's retreat to a different <u>space</u>, even if that space is a part of the country from which the attack was made. Because of the use of "Coastal Crawl," there are exactly six such unusual retreats allowed, and they are referred to as the "Crawling Retreat":
