Near the Inn of the Farting Cow:

Downward came Halfflower's crescent blade upon Leomund's neck. Clamboring up the road came the knights of Eyeoff Dubblue, and from the south the orcs of Morgath scampered, crawled and jumped toward the two graven figures, King and executioner. All watched in stunned astonishment, as the fatal blow delivered by the now hysterically erupting Halfflower came down.

Lord Tie Roan summoned his strength and charged the grimey band while the shock of their leader's triumph still seized their attentioned. With FIASCO gleaming white-hot, he slaughtered orc upon orc. The ground was cluttered with orcin body parts of every shape and size.

But then new amazament grasped them all! Leomund stirred! Again Hafflower, struck with awe and terror, slashed his cresent blade at the King! The force of the blow dashed the King to the ground, but again he rose! Now fully to his senses, he drew his blade VETO and held it high above his head. The orcs were so agape that the carnage precipitated upon them by the knights was hideous to behold! Not one orc was left in less than a dozen parts when the slaughter was over.

ATLANTIS HOUSERULES

FOR DIPLOMACY

- 1. Unless otherwise specified the rules of Diplomacy and the rules of ATLANTIS will be used for all games.
- 2. Countries will be assigned by player preference, with each player sending in a list of the countries in order of his preference; wherever possible, the player's first choice will be used. In the event of a tie, a random choice will be made to determine first choices.
- 3. Unordered units dislodged will be annihilated instead of retreated. Players may refuse to retreat and have their units annihilated. Two or more units retreating to the same space will be annihilated. Retreats cannot be convoyed.
- 4. Unordered units will stand. A country may support unordered units of another country.
- 5. Failure to submit removal orders will result in the removal of the unit(s) as determined by the Gamesmaster.
- 6. There are two move seasons ["Spring" and "Fall"] and one adjustment season ["Winter"] for builds and removals. Moves must be submitted by noon of the dead-line date announced; preferably by mail, although phone orderes will be accepted (by the Gamesmaster only). The Gamesmaster accepts absolutely NO responsibility for a player's inability to reach him by phone.
- 7. Substitute moves will not be used. However, a player who does not submit moves for two consecutive seasons, or who frequently misses moves will be removed by the Gamesmaster and a replacement player appointed.
- 8. Players may designate a substitute to replace them temporarily of permanently with the consent of the Gamesmaster.
- 9. Press releases are encouraged, and will be printed subject to space and time limitations.
- 10. Victory conditions: 18 units on board. Situations where an 18 unit victory are not possible will be dealt with separately.

SAMPLE RULINGS:

A. Two units may not directly exchange spaces. The "Coastal Crawl" and the "Crawling Retreat" are no longer exceptions to this rule. The only valid exchange of units would be one in which fleets were used to convey:

ENGLAND: A Lon-Bel, F Nth (C) A Lon-Bel FRANCE: A Bel-Lon, F Eng (C) A Bel-Lon

B. Koning's Rule will not be used:

RUSSIA: A Rum-Bul, F Bla (S) A Rum-Bul, A Ukr-Rum

TURKEY: A Bul-Rum

C. Miller's Rule will not be used; that is, a dislodged unit may give support:

RUSSIA: A Rum-Bud, A Ser (S) A Rum-Bud

AUSTRIA: A Bud-Ser, A Tri (S) A Bud-Ser, A Vie-Bud

Note the move of A Vie-Bud does not succeed.

D. Two units cannot normally exchange spaces:

GERMANY: A Hol-Bel, F Bel-Hol

[See "A" above for a valid exchange of units]

Dislodged units cannot retreat to a space where a stand-off oggerred:

ENGLAND: F Eng-Iri, F Nat-Iri

FRANCE: F Mid holds

ITALY: F Wes-Mid, F Spa (sc) (S) F Wes-Mid

Note F Mid Atlantic is dislodged and due to the stand-off cannot retreat to the Irish Sea.

F. A country cannot cut its own support:

GERMANY: A Mun (S) ITALIAN A Ven-Tyr, A Bur-Mun, A Kie (S) A Bur-Mun

A Tyr-Mun, A Boh (S) A Tyr-Mun AUSTRIA:

ITALY: A Ven-Tyr

Note the German support is valid and A Ven-Tyr does succeed; also note A Bur-Mun does not succeed since a country cannot dislodge its own unit.

G. A country may cut the support given it by another country:

AUSTRIA: A Sil-Bor, A Mun (S) A Sil-Ber, A Ruh-Kie

A Ber (S) AUSTRIAN A Ruh-Kie RUSSIA:

GERMANY: A Kie holds

Note A Ruhr does not succeed to Kiel because the support was cut.

H. A convoyed attack is presumed to come from the direction of the last convoying fleet:

F Adr-Ion, F Gre (S) F Adr-Ion TURKEY:

A Nap-Gre, F Ion (C) A Nap-Gre

Note that since the attack comes from the Ionian Sea, it does not cut the Turkish support into the Ionian Sea. The Italian army remains in Naples and the Italian fleet must retreat.

I. Orders for an army moving by convoy should specify the route, and only those fleet orders for convoy duty which correspond with the orders to the army will be valid:

ENGLAND: A Lon-Bel

F Eng (C) ENGLISH A Lon-Bel

GERMANY: F Nth (C) ENGLISH A Lon-Bel

Since the convoy route is not specified and there is a conflict in the orders, A Lon-Bel does not succeed.

ENGLAND: A Lon-Bel (C) by FRENCH F Eng

F Eng (C) ENGLISH A Lon-Bel FRANCE:

GERMANY: F Nth (C) ENGLISH A Lon-Bel

Note A Lon-Bel Does succeed since the convoy route was specified.

J. Orders for an army moving by convoy do not succeed if the convoy is dislodged:

ENGLAND: F Iri-Eng, F Nth (S) F Iri-Eng, A Liv-Wal

FRANCE: A Bre-Wal, F Eng (C) A Bre-Wal

Note A Liv-Wal does succeed because the convoy was dislodged.

K. An army moving by convoy which is dislodged cannot cut support:

FRANCE: A Bre-Lon, F Eng (C) A Bre-Lon

ENGLAND: F Iri-Eng, F Wal (S) F Iri-Eng, F Nth holds, F Lon (S) F Nth

GERMANY: F Hel-Nth, F Den (S) F Hel-Nth

Note F Hel-Nth does not succeed because the support for the North Sea by F London was not cut.

L. A country cannot normally oppose its own forces:

FRANCE: F Wes-Mid, F Naf-Mid, F Por (S) F Naf-Mid

Note that F Naf-Mid does not succeed.

ENGLAND: F Eng (S) FRENCH F Naf-Mid, F Nat-Mid

FRANCE: F Naf-Mld

Note F Naf-Mid does not succeed because the English support is invalid (opposing its own F North Atlantic).

ENGLAND: F Eng-Iri, F Nat-Iri

FRANCE: F Mid (S) ENGLISH F Eng-Iri

Note the French support is valid, and F Eng-Iri does succeed.

[from p. 2] battle raged. But Gygax was in the weaker position. His fight was not against Morgath and his own strength was being sapped.

Near the Inn:

Halfflower was being held at bay by the knights of the Legislature. They could not harm him, but he was having little success against them — each being a hero in his own right.

Leomund drew off and cast a spell against Morgath himself. But without the Seman of Roddy Wacker or a SILMARIL as a base of power, his spell was weak.

Now Morgath held both Leomund and Gygax in his grasp. Gygax knew Leomund was alive but if he dared release his own spell while under Morgath's attack, he would surely be vanquished!

Vienna; 7 July 1901:
