PRESS RELEASES

R-3

Vienna; 12 February 1904:

Due to the extreme cold, all units of the Austrian Army have been ordered north to hunt Germans.

Budapest; 17 February 1904:

The Emperor calls on all nations to censure Germany for its act of aggression against Italy. The Emperor plans to meet the Kaiser personally to discuss the matter.

Venice; 2 April 1903:

The populace of Venice turned out in record numbers today to see the city's newest attraction. The city's canals have been filled with stone from the towers of Trieste. Rather than toss these stones one by one into the sea, the mayor of Venice decided to put them under the feet of the Italians.

Vienna; 6 May 1903:

The Emperor announced that the tourist visas of the Italian visitors were cancelled, and that they have been asked to leave the country. Units of the Army and Navy have been sent to help them find their way home.

Greece; 10 May 1903:

Admiral Pomi-Pomi has been granted the title of Prince of Greece after his victory over the Italian Fleet in the Ionian Sea.

Vienna; 15 September 1902:

Today the Archduke Franz Ferdinand announced the retirement of Emperor Franz Josef, effective immediately. The official reasons given are ill health and age. Palace rumor is that the heir apparent had become fearful for the safety of the Empire due to more than a year of inaction on the part of the old Emperor. Official residence for the retired Emperor has not yet been determined. The Archduke has ordered a meeting of the entire Imperial General Staff, including the Chief of Imperial Naval Staff. The Italian question, and Rumania are expected to be important topics. The Foreign Minister has been instructed to receive all representatives from any country, regardless of past relations.

Budapest; 22 September 1902:

The Archduke Franz Ferdinand announced today that the Empire has taken the change in head of state calmly. The Commander-in-Chief, Department of Hungary has returned to Vienna to report on the extremely provocative border situation with Rumania. The Russian occupation is viewed with some alarm. The Archduke stated in a recent interview that, "The Rumanian question hinges on future Russian intentions, and we are very anxious to talk with the Czar concerning this point." The Archduke also did not rule out the possibility of serious talks with the government of Turkey.

Copenhagen; 1 April 1902:

Today King Christian IX announced that he has asked to be put under the
