for

DIPLOMACY

- 1. Unless otherwise specified, the rules of Diplomacy and the rules of ATLANTIS will be used in all games.
- 2. Countries will be assigned by player preference, with each player sending in a list of the countries in order of his preference. Wherever possible, the player's first choice will be used. In the event of a tie, a random choice will be made to determine first choice.
- Unordered units will stand. If dislodged, they will be disbanded instead of retreated. Players may refuse to retreat and have their unit disbanded instead of retreated. Two or more units retreated to the same space will be disbanded. Retreats cannot be convoyed.
- Failure to submit removal orders will result in the removal of units as determined by the Gamesmaster.
- There are two move seasons ("Spring" and "Fall") and one adjustment season ("Winter") for builds and removals. Moves must be submitted by noon of the deadline date announced; preferably by mail, although phone orders will be accepted by the Gamesmaster only. The Gamesmaster accepts no responsibility for a player's inability to reach him by phone.
- 6. Substitute moves will not be used. However, a player who does not submit moves for two consecutive seasons or who frequently misses moves may be replaced.
- 7. Players may designate a substitute to replace them temporarily or permanently, with the consent of the Gamesmaster.
- 8. Standard abbreviations:

Nth -- North Sea

Nwy -- Norway

NAf -- North Africa

Nwg -- Norwegian Sea

Eas -- Eastern Mediterranean Wes -- Western Mediterranean

NAt -- North Atlantic

StP -- St. Petersburg

The only rule not followed by ATLANTIS is Miller's Rule. is, a dislodged unit may give support, if the dislodging attack came from the space into which the unit was giving support.
