### HOUSERULES FOR ATLANTIS

- i. Unless otherwise specified, the Rules of Diplomacy and the Rules of ATLANTIS will be used in all new games.
- 2. Countries will be assigned by player preference, according to a listing sent in by the player. Whenever possible, the player's first choice will be used. In the event of a tie, a random choice will be made. If a player does not submit a preference list, a random selection of countries will be made to provide such a list.
- 3. Unordered units will hold and if dislodged, they may retreat. Units ordered to retreat to a space not allowed by the rules will be disbanded. Two or more units ordered to retreat to the same space will be disbanded. If there is only one space to which a unit may retreat, the Gamesmaster will order the retreat, but players may nevertheless exercise their option to disband such units rather than retreat them.
- 4. Failure to submit removal orders will result in the removal of the required number of units as determined by the Gamesmaster.
- 5. There are two move seasons ("Spring" and "Fall") and one adjustment season ("Winter"). Retreat orders may be called for immediately after or immediately before any season. Deadlines for "Spring" or "Fall" moves will be at least 14 days after the mailing date of ATLANTIS. Moves MUST be submitted by noon of the announced deadline date. Moves should be submitted by mail, on paper or card no smaller than 3" x 5". No moves via Certified or Special Delivery mail accepted. The Gamesmaster accepts no responsibility for the failure of the Postal Service to deliver mail. Phone orders will be accepted by the Gamesmaster only during hours specified in ATLANTIS. The Gamesmaster makes no commitment to be available during those hours.
- 6. Substitute moves will not be used. However, a player who does not submit moves for two consecutive seasons or who frequently misses moves may be replaced.

The Gamesmaster may delay the game in order to allow a replacement time for negotiations. The Gamesmaster also reserves the right to delay the play of the game, if such a delay is in the best interests of the game.

- 7. Players may designate a substitute to replace them temporarily or permanently, with the consent of the Gamesmaster.
