All the games of the major rating lists are included in this survey. The total number is 387. The number listed under "Points" is the Calhamer point count where only wins and draws are tabulated: Winners receive 1 point; in a draw, the point is divided among the surviving players. The "Averaged Score" is computed by dividing the number of points by the number of games played, omitting decimals. The resultant score is similar to a batting average in baseball.

A score of 143 is average, equivalent to winning 1 of 7 games. To arrive at an equitable score, therefore, only players completing a minimum of 7 games are included. Also excluded are players believed to be inactive for more than a year. Replacement players are not charged under "Games Played," unless they win or draw the game.

This survey will be updated whenever there are significant changes, particularly when new names achieve The Top Ten."

WESTERN STALEMATE POSITIONS

By ERIC VERHEIDEN

Stalemate positions in the west without northern sea-going opposition are explored in some detail in John Beshara's "Fundamental Stalemate Positions, I" and "II" in <u>Vazir</u> Nos. 3 and 4 and Robert Lipton's "A Series of Progressive Northern Stalemate Positions" in <u>Graustark</u> #268. However, vestern positions with northern sea-going opposition were not seriously discussed previously and these are presented here.

In all of the positions examined, the west owns a minimum of England, France, Iberia (Spain, Portugal), the Low Countries (Belgium, Holland), Denmark and Norway. In some instances, Sweden, St. Petersburg and all or part of Germany is owned and in the course of the togatment it is necessary to expand as far east as Tunis and Italy. When permitted by the rules, any of the opposing spaces may be occupied by enemy fleets. Essentially, only minimal positions are presented.

Rome;

Monsignier Sean Flynn, Press Secretary to Cardinal McLenoan, announced today that the Holy Father has called for the first Holy Crusade in modern times. The forces of all Christianity are called upon to join in the attack on Turkey.

A lead army in being assembled in Venice and will be lead by the great Bishop-General Geraggio "Big Ge" Gambino, the Blossed, the Hero of Trieste. Cardinal McLenoan appointed Bishop-General Gambino because of his great success in the liberation of Avignon and Marseilles.

The war is called for the following reasons:

- 1) The refusal of the Turkish government to do anything about the sharp increase in the price of opium and female slaves.
- 2) Taxation of Church property in the Holy Land, especially the Church motel chain.
- 3) The closing of the Jesuit Order's heroin, weapon and slave exchange in Alexandria.
- 4) The refusal of the Ottoman Central Bank to buy Papal Bonds.
- 5) The refusal of the Turkish government to cooperate with the Holy See's campaign to exterminate Protestants in Europe.

There will also be a sub-Crusade against France and the Atheistic Paris government for its refusal to go along with Papal direction.

All parish leaders are instructed to lead their congregations in prayer for the victory of the Church and to assist the Holy Conscription to help fill the ranks of the Papal Army.

It is not a wise ruler who puts his people through such suffering as to have his country become the battlefield of Europe. The President of France has already been wise enough to see the light. He is really a wine leader. The English King is a fool and racist, he deserves to be defeated as badly as he will be.

It is about time that the truth about "Cardinal" McLenoan be known. He was born in County Kerry, Ireland, in 1880. He is a man of almost no education, but has managed to teach himself to read and write. He is of some intelligence, and very much animal cunning. For most of his youth he was a street thug in Dublino (Continued on page 7)

In 1900 he was hired by a British contractor as part of a labor gang doing work flushing out the London sever system. We know that he was active in the ERA while in the English capital. Soon after he began work in London, the police began looking for him in connection with a plot to assassinate the Archbishop of Canterbury He disappeared, and along with him so did the local IRA call's treasury and a sixteen year old girl, also active in the Sinn Fein, named Mary O'Rourhe.

In 1901, McLenoan surfaced in Naples as part of the underworld there involved with prostitution, both male and female. Just before his death, King Christopher Utz was very involved with a crackdown on organized crime. Whether the Mafia had anything to do with the King's death cannot be determined, since the present government has refused to make any investigation.

King Chris' death plunged all of Italy into anarchy. The Grand Duke of Naples tried to save the city from destruction. He hired a private army to protect the peace. For his trouble, both he and the Duchess were found with their throats cut. McLenoan was a member of the palace guard. The city went into riot. Much of the city was burned. Conspicuously enough, McLenoan fled to Rome, taking with him, apparently by force, the sixteen year old daughter of the Duke.

In Rome he had a lot of money to spend. He became friendly with the Pope's Secretary for Foreign Affairs, Cardinal Di Medecci. He raised a private army and returned to Naples. He claimed to have married the Duke's daughter, though there is no record, and thus took power as the next Grand Duke of Naples. The young man who had been the betrothed of his wife was hanged for treason.

McLenoan wasn't satisfied with Naple alone. He marched his army to Rome and declared himself, along with Cardinal Di Medecci, to be a "Grand Protector of the Pope." His army of Naples street thugs surrounded the Vatican. The Holy Father has not been seen in public since.
