I just received a sample of the <u>Toronto Delegram</u>, from Bill LaFosse, of 2 Swift Dr., Apt 30h, Toronto, Ontario, MAA 2A2 in Canada. Subs are XX 10/34.00 and Games are open at a 32.00 game fee. I can't recommend or not this zine since it just started but he has a game going already and except forthe terrible spellin which he admits, its looks to be not a bad publication. You should write for a sample. And Bill, use a small L (1) for your ones, not a capital I. Check out this zine.

I got a letter from Bernie Oaklyn, who has been haveing some troubles with the standby policy that he uses in <u>Le Front</u>, his zine. In it, he gives his policy on standby players, which is a little different, to say the least. It follows.

Thanks to a letter sent to me by Lee Kendter, Sr., concerning the use of standby and replacement players in our games, and to noting exactly what has been happening in games in which I myself am a player and those that I have monitored in passing, this article emerges.

Let us first look at the fairness to each of the sever players in the game when one of them misses his moves. Consider the setback of a country if those orderes fall within the first game year. Then consider the importance of missed moves somewhere down the pike. Each time orders are not given for a country, that country, and sertainly its alliance structure, suffer a setback. And, the neighboring countries gains a decided advantage, which is somewhat similar to a real war where a commander failed to give an order, or did not plan ahead, ar was a little late in setting up his defenses of offensives.

Mevertheless, a set of missed moves in this game results in hard feelings which must contribute at least substantially to a growing distaste for the game in the mind of the players. Surely none of the players need a win so badly that they would ask for a set of missed orders. Nor should they wish to condone any such missed orders. The gamesmaster is the key here. He is in a position to stop or at least minimize missed orders in his house rules. For instance, the GM can make as a requirement for anrollment in the game, that the player submit to him on a separate shaet of paper, properly dated and signed, and sentinually update the alliance structure for that country. The GM can announce that the last stated alliance structure on file will be used by a standby player whose name and address and telephone number that GM will publish under the game (giving each and every palyera chance, if they dare, to negotiate in advance with the standby player). In additation, the GM should assign a standby player for that game. But, once that standby player has been assigned to report for duty under the name of a particular country, and has had the advantage of pribate communication from the other players, taht raplacement player should not be given any other assignment in that particular game, else Withe GM has caused a violation Nowhere in our publications is there noom for such statements by a GM that "orders were submeitted by a neutral party", or some such nonsense. If it becemes necessary to call on a local player, or even write to another player and request that orders be submitted for a game, that person's name, address, and telephone nember should be published under the game season that such orders are used, giving the other playersthe right and chance to verify those orders as coming from other than the gamesmaster, and that the standby player was given access to the alliance structure on file for that country and give the other players the right and ch chance to communications with that standby player far before that player suprises the game with a published set of motes (which usually result in a stab). We see that there is a question of ethics here, and this is a problem to solve.

It is up to each and every GM to solve this problem for himself, under pressure of the players in his zine if necessary. It is not the responsibility of certain persons, like one Rodney Walker, to police and condemn and ostracize and GM from the hobby because the GM uses certain practises. After all, if the players do not like to play under such practices, that players can take his money elsewhere and close down that GM once and for all. In fact, if certain policies are not liked by the players, they can most certainly get together and vote to take their game to another publisher and GM and get out from objectional policies.

Your GM's response: I never like to see missed moves myself, as they slow down the game. I see no way to really have absolutely neutral players submit standby XXXXXX orders for another player but I fail to see any real

improvement over the way I do it in most respects. After all, the idea of having the player who resigns find his own standby is rather preposterous but

it is advocated by some GMs. ((Seem to have skipped up to 1 spacing.)) The way that most everybody does it (Seem to have skipped up to 1 spacing.)) The acceptable way of doing things. I sincerely hope that most GMs do state who the coming standby player is if possible. Jim Bumpas uses an interesting phantom system which works quite well in my opinion. Comments are welcome.
