Well -- it finally happened. The 135th Air Commando Group of the Maryland Air National Guard called and asked me if I'd be interested in joining the unit and becoming its press information office. Note -- that's office, not officer. A one-man publicity bureau. However, there was one small formality -- 4 months in Texas early next year. Subject to the TAC doctor's final D.K.; I'm in. I doubt if it'll satisfy Charles Reinsel, but I'm in.

Why did I do it? Well, for one thing the job's the same in war or peace -- and you can't hardly get no better nohow. Second, the priority rating for the unit is ZZ, which means they have to call up better than 80% of the ANG units in the country before they call this one. Third, it frees me from threat of drafting -- and those ulcerous unclassified summers. And, lastly, it allows this history teacher to move over to teaching "uncritical" ENGLY history rather than "critical" English which bores me.

The 4 months will probably start February 26 and end July 2. That means that I will miss 9 issues of BARAD-DURMarch 3,17,31; Apr. 14,28; May 12,26; June 9, 23; and, for insurance, possibly July 7. My training is 6 weeks with the Air Force Reserve at Lackland AFB in San Anbonio, then 12 weeks of "school" for AF PR men in Amarillo.

So, if anyone out there is willing to do 10 issues of BARAD-DUR, by all means let me know. This will probably be games XF, G, and J only — although you never know about B.... I'd like the games and the magazine to be run as an entity, if possible, so that there will be no inconvenience or interruption. I might add that B-D goes to only 29 people, so the job's not that gigantic. Anyone? Just In Case?

By the way -- this Guard thing does not affect the BALTICONFER-ENCE scheduled for Feb 10-12 at the Emerson Hotel, Baltimore. I'll be there. And it also allows me to declare, with some assurance, that Baltimore is definitely rebidding in 1969 for the 1970 World Science Fiction Convention.

GB-1967-J is now filled, probably the last GB game until next summer unless Bounds feels like one. This game will probably be played under 2 different GMs - since I'll be away a while -- but it will start and end under me, and will be played under my system, explained previously. Newcomers with questions are welcome to submit them. Ditto old-timers. All of the people below asked to be in "J." All requests were written on a list in the order received. I made a few scribbled notes elsewhere, and now can't find the list. If memory serves, the list below is correct. However, if anyone below does NOT now want to be in "j," please write immediately and I'll notify the stand-by. Base game fee is \$4.00 per game. However, for players on the game roster in current Games Bureau games (i.e. 1965 A, B, C; 1966 D, XF, G, & H) the fee is reduced to \$2.00. The reduced fee also applies at all times to winners of GB games. However, the $\frac{94}{32}$ rate is for first class surface mail only. You should add \$1.00 to your \$4 or \$2 (depending) if you want air mail service -- \$5 or \$3. The next issue (#37) will be "winter, 1900" and will involve no play. The issue after, BARAD-DUR 38, will contain Spring, 1901 move orders. Game fees and Spring, 1901 move orders must be in my hands on or before 10 P.M. Friday, January 13, 1967. The first set of completed orders in to me is the set that will be used. No revisions. Failure to pay or submit moves will result in instantaneous replacement.

Newer players note that Huff has won 1 game (GB-1966-E, the shortest postal game in Postal history according to John Boardman), has played in every BARAD-DUR game and in an infinite number of games in other magazines. James Latimer is another veteran, aiming to play 30 games at once. Jerry Jacks is no stranger to Postal, and is a veteran of a great many games. Hal Naus is a noted Gamesmaster and Dipdomacy veteran. Gene Prosnitz is a veteran across-the-board man, but has been playing Postal only since the start of GB-1966-G a few weeks ago. Yom Griffin is also new, and a friend of Gene's. According to my records, Tom is in one other game -- EURALIA -- but that hasn't started as yet, either. Paul Leitch is new to me. So -- DIPLOMACY PERIOD STARTS RIGHT NOW. GOOD LUCK. Oh, yes -- countries wound up being selected at random, by drawing from a hat. If you're really unhappy, send in a protest in 7 days. If 2 folks write, I'll switch you in the next issue. Otherwise -- you're stuck with it. Sorry. JLC

BARAD-DUR, however, will be in the mail by the nation-wide 5 PM pickup on New Year's Day -- which makes this the last issue of the year. As a reward, after the December 30 moves you need not submit any more until next year....
