The Gamesmaster received the usual statement as to cessation of hostilities with a 17-17 board from Mebane, but something entirely different from Miller -- a set of moves not altogether in accord with Mebane's, and a statement that the draw was off. Miller mentions an attempt at intergame alliance (upon which I frown) as one reason, but he didn't expect Banks to be so trusting. However, instead of 17-17, as Miller expected, it came out that Banks did not protect Belgium and Turkey wins the game. ### OWNERSHIP AND RETREATS

A house rule of BARAD-DUR for all games which has been in effect since the start is being protested by James Latimer. I will allow the protest. Protests are not retroactive but may change precedent by player vote. The situation under consideration is: in B-D, winter retreats to the supply center of a nation do not affect ownership of that center. Latimer challenges this, stating that retreats come before builds. Players in all games are requested to vote on this. A majority of the players in each game would be necessary. If you think retreats come before builds, vote YES to the proposition. If you think retreats come after the determination of the unit roster, vote NO to the proposition.

TURKEY controls the following supply centers: Edimburgh, Liverpool, London, BELGIUM, Norway, Sweden, St. Pete, Moscow, Sevastopol, Warsaw, Rumania, BUDAPEST, Serbia, Greece, Bulgaria, Ankara, Constantinople, Smyrna, for a total of 18 units. B game is the oldest B-D game, and it was a very good if extremely long affair. Not "long" in the year-sense, but in the sense of a great period in which play was static. It is also unusual in that the three people in the game when it ended have been in it since the beginning. The original B players were: ENGLAND: Ron Bounds, Bounds remained static during the early stages of the game, but by 1906 had started to move, beating back Germany (in the process of being crushed), and at one time was up to 7 units. However, TURKEY (Don Miller) broke England's back in 1 move by, after an early and hard fight crushing Russia, who had had singularly bad fortune from the start, a convoy move A CONSTANTINOPLE TO WALES, which worked while none of England's units could defend against its relative land mobility. GERMANY (Charles Reinsel) and Russia (Joel Sattel) started at each other early. When Russia was crushed by Turkey, Germany turned on France but not, by then, ITALIAN (Banks Mobane) units which had managed to virtually pulverize Huff (FRANCE) from the south by the good use of fleets. Germany was contained by a combination of Italian and Turkish maneuvers; France was finally reduced to Belgium, then eliminated. Reinsel found the two powerhouses too much, and was reduced to Holland, which he eventually lost. England, completely decimated by its distance of the fleets from home and by Italian and, by this time, Turkish fleets in the north, was reduced to Denmark, where it continued to hang on until finally crushed by all 3 remaining powers. The situation became one in which AUSTRIA (Frank Clark) held the balance. Clark at the start had played his balance skillfully, but while he had been most instrumental in crushing Germany when Turkey could not get the units over Clark discovered that, after Germany, he would have to attack either Italy or Turkey, breaking the alliance. His indecision -- first agreeing to 1 ally and moving that way, then changing his mind and moving the other -- caused so much consternation on both Turkey and Italy's parts that they decided that he could not be depended upon and moved in to crush him, the plot being to take an equal number of Austrian possessions -- Italy  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Austria and all of Germany, Turkey the other  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Austria and the Balkans -- and tie the game. Unfortunately for Italy, he made some diplomatic mistakes causing Turkey to believe that Italy would try for the double-cross and the win. Thus, Turkey moved what was supposed to be a static piece -- a fleet into Italy's Belgium -- while Italy did not doublecross Turkey. Thus Turkey, who intended to tie, won by thinking too deviously of his opponent.

An excellent game. I'd like to see more like it. Congratulations to all of the players past and present.
