



England -> France: Congrats, you've done well. Germany was alive when you came after me. Things would be different if he hadn't been sleeping when I came after vou. I hope we meet again.

Batyville: Giving up already?

England -> Austra/Turkey: Tell me where you want my fleets to go. They are completely at your disposal. As big Blue Robin said, "Your wish is my command, Master." Remember, I can't make anybody love you.

Batyville: To those who do not seem to know it, the postage to Canada is 40¢.



PRESS: Winter 1902

**Kiel:** The Admiralty announced the start of construction on a top secret submersed bomb to be deployed off our coasts as a deterrent to foreign navies.

Batyville: I did not know this was a variant game!? Germany -> England: A traditional start generally

fails to gain a foothold on the continent. Batyville: Until it is too late? For whom?

Germany -> France: My fleet responds to your worrying rather than your suggestions.

Batyville: Did France offer your sailors a night on the Paris town? That was nice of him!

Germany -> Russia: I was merely gauging the caliber of your response to my ridiculous plan.

Batyville: Gee, is this a new diplomacy strategy?

Munich -> Venice: You do pose interesting situations.

Batyville: Are you going to share?

Rome(Vatican) -> All: At the beginning of this great endeavor, I ask blessings upon all, and especially upon those whose design and purpose is most congruent with Italy's. However, those who do not communicate may be excommunicate.

Batyville: As long as they are not exinquisitioned.

Batyville -> Tom: There is no difference between contingent and conditional orders. Both are contingent on or conditional upon a previous seasons results. Yes, one can submit several orders dependent on conditions of earlier seasons. If they get too complicated, ask for a separation of the seasons (I will probably not honor a separation of the retreat seasons, but if the group decides to play a combined Winter-Spring season I will always accept a request for splitting Winter & Spring.

Batyville -> Peter: Ablepsia, since you ask, means blind. I was in a weak mood when I chose that name ( or perhaps it is because I am almost as blind as a bat.

Batyville -> Peter: ZAT does mean Zug-abgabe-Termine, and is abbreviated correctly. It may not be in your dictionary because it is a tecnical (diplomacy game) word. It is the designation used for deadline in the German zine I play in. For a literal translation, look up the three words separately.

Turkey -> Batyville: I GM's you in Mensa #14, you are GMing me in Mensa #41. Weird, huh?

Batyville: Be careful, someone might think we are dyslexic. By the way, how did I do?

## GAME START DRACULA

### Character Diplomacy (Batyville Version)

The voting for characteristics is tabulated below. We will play with the seven characteristics with white backgrounds (the two shaded ones were black balled). My personal favorite is the hypnotist, and I think I do not like the airbnorne unit either. I tried to make these characteristics approximately equal in value. Can anyone suggest another characteristic to replace the airbnorne one? Of the seven surviving characteristics, I believe the Jumper will prove the most valuable. However, note that it jumps adjacent units, not adjacent spaces. The Jumper, as well as all other units can move normally if they are not using their special power.

Question 1: Can the jumper jump over a unit and land in a space to which it could not directly move (e.g. JMF StP jump over A Moscow to Sevastopol). Since army jumpers can jump over fleets at sea and land on islands, the answer to this question must be YES.

Question 2: If XXA Ven -> Pie, and JMA Tri -> jump (A Ven) -> Pie, does the jumper succeed. YES. Part of the jumping power is that the jumped unit must hold, therefore there is no conflict in Piedmont.

Question 3: If Adam orders the double mover DMA Mun -> Sil -> War, and Bob orders one DMA Vie -> Gal -> War, do they end up in Sil and Gal? YES. Note that the double movers can follow each other. Any interaction between a DM and any other moving unit will cause a bounce, even if the subsequent space is open. Note, also, if a double mover is unsuccessful on its first province, I will not publish its subsequent attempt.

The effect of these characterists, I hope, is to equalize the powers. England is no longer a corner power (since its F North Sea can be jumped by an army), Italy can grab spaces other than Tunis, in the first year, by judicious choices of initial builds. I do not believe that we can have a stalemate line, but that remains to be seen.
