AnarchyDiplomacy: Round(s) 1: Each player Submits a request for one home supply center. Each unique request is granted. Requests continue among the rest until each player has established one home supply center. Diplomatic communication is advisable. Round(s) 2: Same as round 1 for the selection of a second home supply center. Round(s) 3: Same as round 1 for the selection of a third home supply center. Round 4: Each player submits a list of 3 names for the country. (Selections will be by GM with preferences given to unique first letters.) Winter 1900 builds of 1 army, one fleet, and one choice of player (three armies if the country's home supply centers are all land locked).

<u>PowerDiplomacy</u>: For each build, the builder specifies one of seven enhanced abilities to endow the new unit. The seven abilities are chosen from a list of nine unit **powers** per votes by the players at the beginning of the game. The nine powers are (double attack, double move, double support, double hold, jumper, amphibious, arial support, hypnotism, rocketry). Detailed rules if anyone is interested.

HELP! In the Capital Radio game, I will need default orders for England. Chuck Rathfelder is still alive, but I have not heard from him. Perhaps Adrian Tymes or Tony Dousette would be interested in submitting default English orders in Capital Radio?

I was really surprised, this last month. In the last issue I finally published my e-mail address. About 60% of you submitted your orders by that method. I like it. Such orders are easier to read, and I can send a return back so that **you** know the orders were received. If seven of you are interested, I will run a free regular diplomacy game by e-mail. 



<u>DRACULA</u>PRESS:

BATYVILLE: I owe Phil Reynolds an apology. In the final adjudication, I showed him as an NMR. This was not true. However, the Turkish orders did not affect any of the French moves, so the game is still over. I received an end-game statement from only one player. Here it is.

Russia:

I was badly stabbed by England early in the game. Evidently he'd done the same to everyone and no tears were shed when he was taken out. You can antagonize some players all of the time, but you can't antagonize all the players at the same time. Hopefully he knows this now. France hot the upper hand of Germany while Italy was giving Turkey a hard time—while leaving himself (Italy) wide open to France. Stephen Glasgow—(Turkey) was a good ally. France played a good game, all I want to know is what did he say to Italy to get Italy to play the way he did. I've never had any luck convincing someone to throw themselves onto the knives of a common enemy, while I assaulted their homeland. Personally, I suspect hypnotizing - but how can you hypnotize by mail? Congratulations to Jim Lewis again for the win. Jim, aren't all these wins becoming a bit monotonous for you?
