NEWS OF THE WORLD

ROME (3 December 1901): In the first encyclical of His reign, His Holiness Pope Innocent XIV (formerly Rodrigo Cardinal Borgio, Archbishop of Tijuana) denounced the current European war. His Holiness declared, "There is entirely too much goody-goody in this war and it barely takes the fingers of two hands to count up the pitiful few instances of good old-fashioned treachery. What we need is a good large-type War to Make the World Safe for Debauchery."

ROME (4 December 1901): The Papal News Secretary today noted the the Pope had meant "...to Make the World Safe for Democracy", but was too drunk to get it right.

ROME (5 December 1901): His Holiness today fired his News Secretary, noting that He couldn't have meant "Democracy" but was too drunk to remember what He did mean. "Debauchery's good enough," Innocent added.
