<u>DIPLOMACY</u> is a multi-player war game invented by A.B. Calhamer and presently owned by the Avalon Hill Game Co. At present there are no game openings in <u>Black Frog</u> and none are expected until early 1981.

ODDS AND ENDS

If you are thinking that the rate of publication of Black Frog has slowed down a bit lately, then you are in for a big shock. Expect to receive four issues (including this one) in the next eight days. This, and number 25 (due to be mailed on November 25th) are regular issues with game adjudications. Between these two, expect to receive two special issues. One of these will be the Black Frog Christmas Gift Catalog, so hold back on your Christmas shopping until you get it.

The big news of the moment from your pubber is that I am out on strike and walking a picket line. Great Fun! It's the Lockheed Engineers and Scientists that are out on strike. The hourly production workers all settled. The company gave them a three year contract for 7%, 5% and 5% plus full cost of living allowances. A package that will mean at least a 50% increase in the three years. Then, after the hourly contract was settled, they offered us a one-time-only 10% increase with no cost of living. Really left us with little alternative except to strike. It looks like this thing may last quite a while. Oh well, you would all be far more concerned if it was Gary Coughlan on strike instead of me.

I journeyed to Bakersfield on Saturday to take in Dan Kuszynski's BirthdayCon. Bill Schiwautz stopped by and then went up with me and two of my sons. Unfortunately this came at a bad time for me and I had to come back early Saturday evening. Thus didn't get in much gaming. Played one game of "gunboat" Diplomacy, and didn't even play it out to conclusion. Dan was showing everybody

Swashbuckler, which is a fun game of sorts, but certainly no Diplomacy. Also played a game of Dune, Cosmic Encounter, and a ccuple of Nuclear War. By leaving early I was spared having to play Dan's variant, Vacation Diplomacy; but I am playing a game of it by mail in Murd'ring Ministers. Al Rodriguez was there and kept trying to get up a game of Kingmaker, but had no takers. Al has a thing about six player Kingmaker games; but the best advice I can give is "avoid getting into one with him." One of the highlights of the day was a phone call from Jennifer King. Other Black Froggers there included Ron Brown and Kelly Tilley. It was fun Dan, and I thank you. Do it again some time.

The reason I had to leave Bakersfield early was my wife's volleyball team. She coaches a highschool team and they won the conference championship (for the second year in a row). They wound up the 7th ranked team in southern California at seasons end—and there are a lot of teams in southern California. Saturday night they were playing in the second round (they won the first round) of the all Southern California championship tournament. I rushed back from Bakersfield (it's about 70 miles) leaving at 5:20 and getting home at 6:30. We dropped off Bill, picked up a map and rushed off for Carpenteria (where the game was held) about 75 miles in another direction. Arrived at 7:45 about 15 minutes late. It was a hard fought match, going three games but ultimately her team lost; 10-15; 15-9 and 14-16. It's all over for another year.

The fifth Black Frog Diplomacy Game, V.I.P., has sted. It was somewhat difficult to fill the game, which was somewhat surprising as I had thought that there was more demand for a game from Black Frog subbers. It will be quite a while before another game of regular Diplomacy opens in Black Frog. I will run a variant game of Jimmu, if six subbers express an interest. Players in the new game, V.I.P., are not eligible for the upcoming Black Frog "trophy" or "fifth horseman" game. This is the game where the "best Austria", "best England" and so on from the first four Black Frog games will compete in a fifth game for the coveted Black Frog TROPHY!

Note! Austria sent in a build of a nuke silo in Vienna for winter 1901. I overlooked it and did not record it in the orders for that season, but since Herr Doktor has complained, I will go ahead and allow the build. Since this is 1902 and nuclear warheads aren't scheduled to be invented until the mid-1940's, it seems rather unlikely that he will find any use for his silo--but that remains to be seen. 
