

The timing for that one was bad for me as it came right inbetween GlasCon and PacifiCon and just a weekend away from Mike Hartman's Shortley-Con. But this time, I expect to be up there. Some time ago Don Horton announced that he was winding up his long enduring zine "Claw and Fang" with issue #124. He will get to issue #124 in March of 1981. By now some of you have probably guessed that I have decided that this was a pretty good idea. I will end Riack Frog with issue #124, just like Norton, only I am burrying mine out in order to get to the coveted #124 before Don does.

In regard to Black Frog issue #24. Everybody who has guessed as to what it was has guessed right so far. With very few exceptions, everybody who thinks that they did not get a copy is wrong. They have merely failed to recognize it for what it is!

Several persons have written and asked about getting copies of BF #1-7. The first six issues of Black From (and the first five of them were not named) were for the sole purpose of completing the orphaned game 1977HG. There were less than 10 copies of all of these printed. BF #7 went a bit further. In addition to carrying the final season of 1977HG, it made the announcement that the zine would be expanding a starting some new games. In all about 30 copies of this went out. As many of you know, it was my original intention to limit EF subscriptions to 30. I still do have the originals for these seven issues. If any subber, knowing what they are, still wants them--I would be willing to Xerox them off and send the whole batch out for \$1.00.

JIMM is dead! Only one reader expressed an interest in playing in this variant game. The offer to run it is cancelled. Mike Mills (Emhain Macha) is still trying to fill a game in his zine. Keith Mercer, Dan Palter and the Ole Black Frog himself are signed up. If you are interested in this game, write to Mills at 1585 Quaker Road, Macedon, NY 14502. Jimm is a six player game set in Japan. With fewer supply centers and only six players, it is a bit simpler game than ordinary Diplomacy. Which to my mind makes for a better variant. Map and rules are available (for a charge) from Mills.

With the cancellation of JTMU, there will be one more opening in regular Diplomacy in Black Frog. If you want in, let me know right away.

NOTE: Blair Cusack is still the player of record for Austria. The Apple computer will, if necessary, submit neutral orders for him for one more season (which will not count the possible winter adjustments). Per the BF houserules, if he does not pick up the position by this time, Austria will go into CD.
