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Effective January 1st, 1981 to new subscribers, subscriptions to BF are 50¢ per issue with a minimum sub for ten issues. (= \$5.00 minimum sub)

Diplomacy is a multi-player war game invented by Allan B. Calhamer and owned by Avalon Hill Company. At the present time, there are no game openings in BF.

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I really didn't plan on putting out an issue of BF this week. I was going to put out a heavier than usual issue next week when all of the games have deadlines coming up. Although I have plenty of material to fill this up and plenty of time on my hands (I am still out on strike, going into the tenth week now) I figured enough was enough and was going to wait a bit. But then in yesterdays mail, I received a copy of PEEK. This does require a bit of comment. But a bit of trivia first.

BJ: "Very good, David; now spell weather."

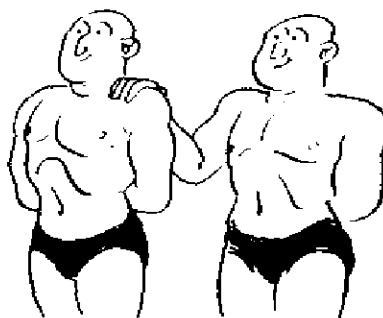
David: "W-E-O-A-T-H-E-R"

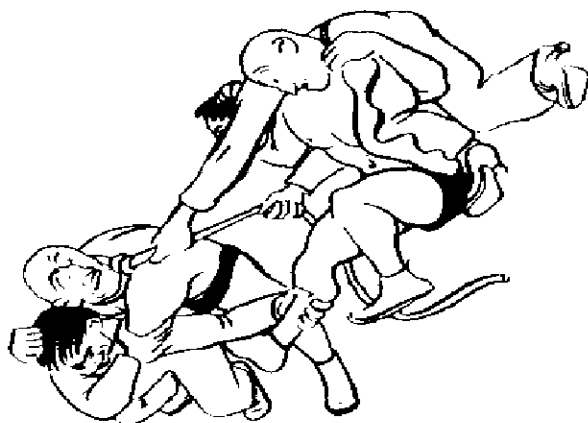

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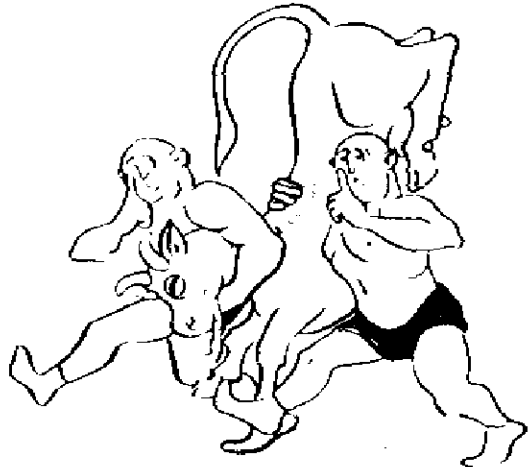
Mark Berch may have come up with the answer as to why the Iran-Iraq war is taking so long. In Diplomacy Digest Mark writes:

With new zines of this caliber on the market, the Diplomacy hobby certainly does appear to be healthy as we go into the new year.

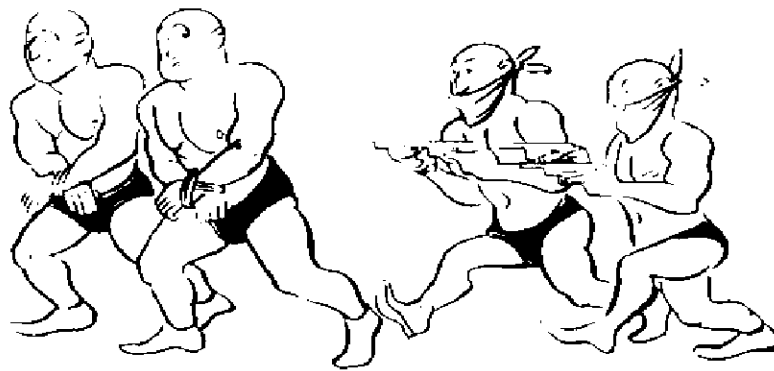

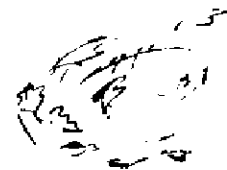

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IT IS BRIGHT PINK AND CALLED PEEK

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A most unusual new zine found its way to my mail box yesterday; it is bright pink, has a format similar to Black Frog, is supposedly published by Jane Proskin, and has the name of Peek.

Jane Proskin is not a real person! (Or, is she?) The thing was obviously done in fun and I am one of the primary targets of the barbs.

But I must defend myself. On December 27th, the day Jane Proskin claims I was in Las Vegas with her at the Plaza Casino, I was home with my wife. I did not go to Dave Grabar's GrabarCon for a number of reasons--one of them not being to go to Las Vegas with Jane Proskin. Actually I spent the night of the 27th in Santa Monica at the home of Mike Hartman along with my wife and Mike's wife Loraine. You'll back my story won't you Mike...Mike where did you go when I need you.

Whoever wrote Peek, has some close information, however. Mike Hartman and Bill Shelton did conspire to stab me in 1979HN, I did lose a bet on Missouri in the Liberty Bowl (albeit \$10.00 and not \$500.00) and there are some other things that ring close to home.

I am not going to go into a great deal of detail in regard to Peek because I think that all or most BF subbers got a copy. Indeed genuine BF mailing labels were used to mail them out.

(This makes Gary Coughlan as very prime suspect because I recently sent him a set of BF mailing labels for him to use in mailing out copies of his upcoming zine, Europa Express.)

There were probably more than one person involved, however, the zines had a local "Van Nuys" postmark. Although a couple have said that they had "Burbank" postmarks on their copies.

Jane Proskin (or whoever is responsible for Peek) challenged me to call the first issue of Peek BF #32. She (or whoever) claims that all BF subbers received copies, and if they didn't they only had to send her a postcard at Box 6824, Burbank, CA 91510, and she would send them one.

This is a little bit irregular (but BF is highly irregular), but why not. Peek hereby becomes BF #32, but will not count against anyone's subscription. Since this (the copy in your hand) is issue #31--it will put two issues out of order, but that is no matter. And, there is some precedent for this. Remember issue #24? There are still a few subbers that have not figured out what that one was yet.

P.O. Box 6824: BURBANK

The real key to who Jane Proskin really is may well be contained in the return address she gave: Occupant, P.O. Box 6824, Burbank, CA 91510. Since she asks everybody to address her mail to Occupant it is a good indication that the box is rented under some other name and that mail addressed to Jane Proskin would not be delivered.

But what name is it rented under? Is it possible to find out? Burbank is not too far from here--about 30 miles away. When I have a chance, I will try to investigate this aspect.

WHO IS JANE PROSKIN?

When Bob Arnett published his controversial issue of Volkerwanderung (November 1980 issue #15) that he calls the "Hobby Gold" issue, I phoned him to give him my opinion of it. ("Hobby Gold" is a rather thinly disguised attack on Bruce Linsey and some of his publishing policies with which Arnett disagrees.) During this conversation with Bob, I heard the name Jane Proskin for the first time. "You know all about Jane Proskin don't you?" Bob asked, although those were not his exact words. Then when I told him I didn't and got curious, he clamed up and would say no more.

However Arnett gives some more information in a letter to the editor in Brutus Bulletin (#76, November 1980 page 10).

"...In fact, I know of an imaginary person that Linsey made up. I don't know for what purpose Bruce created this person, but she really does not exist. Have you ever seen the name of Jane Proskin in print? We were fooled at first. I put her on the Volker standby list in issue #11. But due to some information from some other people, I found out that June ((sic! Jane)) did not exist. Linsey made her up..."

What does Bruce Linsey say about all of this? Turn to Brutus Bulletin again (#77, November 1980, page 9.)

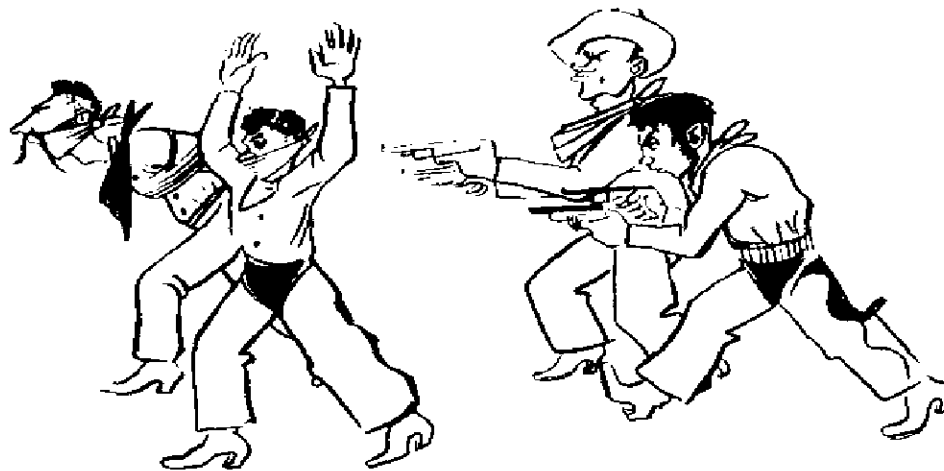
"...I thought it would be a nifty idea to invent a fake person. Don't gasp--I never intended to defraud anybody of course--but I had what I considered a neat idea for a hobby hoax. Jane Proskin would write letters to various zines, and the original plan was that she would do her darndest to annoy none other than Jack Masters! In effect we were going to make her into a hobby personality. Who is 'we'? Kathy Byrne and me.....Anyway, we also agreed to let Bob Arnett in on the secret. To add credibility to Jane, I put her on my standby list and asked Bob to do the same. Bob agreed, with the proviso that I would send him a letter from Jane asking to be a standby--so I did. It goes without saying that she would never be asked to stand by in either zine, but her name was there for the sake of appearances..... Her mailing address is actually that of my cousins, Mr. and Mrs. Rob Proskin....."

The Linsey letter goes on and on, but I have quoted the vital parts. Now enters Gary Coughlan. In his letter to the editor (Brutus Bulletin #77) he states:

"...Jane Proskin is real. Her address was printed in Voice of Doom #26. I called long distance directory assistance and got the phone number which is registered to a Proskin of that address. If Bruce has invented her, he has gone to superhuman lengths and the phone company has joined him in this conspiracy."

Well somebody is going to superhuman lengths to perpetrate the "Jane Proskin" character, because first we have the fake #27 of Murd'ring Ministers with the Joy of Jane subzine and now we have Peek. It looks like one of Linsey original objectives, "to annoy none other than Jack Masters", is being met pretty well as well.

Gary Coughlan becomes a prime suspect. He is the only one who has steadily maintained that Jane was a real person and he had access to Black Frog mailing labels.



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JOY OF JANE AND MM #27

The entire issue of Murd'ring Ministers #27, that contained the Joy of Jane subzine was obviously a fake. Ron Brown and a few others seem convinced that Al Rodriguez was responsible. Personally, I seriously doubt this. Once again I think of Gary Coughlan. Coughlan has admitted to the "Mellow Yellow Voice of Doom" and the "Bonzai for Bozo Retaliation" fakes. It appears to me that the MM job was just the latest in his series of efforts.

In any case Jane Proskin creates her own story in Joy of Jane. In this publication (December 12th, 1980) she writes:

"Yes Diplomacy player there really is a Jane Proskin. I am alive and well and right now am living with Dan Kuszynski in Bakersfield, California..... A lot of you probably want to know a little bit more about me....I won't go into great detail, but... I am 32 years old and was born in Ladysmith, Wisconsin in 1948. Until recently I lived with my late husband ... in Schenectedy, New York. My husband died ten months ago and left me no property but instead a trust fund that gives me \$4000.00 a month to live on. This is substantial enough that I don't have to work. Since I have nothing more pressing at the moment and for the next couple of years, this is what I plan on doing. I will travel about the country visiting the more prominent postal Diplomacy players; staying with those that will have me. Through my visits I will learn all about them and will report what I learn in Joy of Jane."

Well, Joy of Jane has now become Peek. Since everybody reading this has apparently also received Peek, I'll end my discussion of the "enigma of Jane Proskin."

This factual account leaves no stone unturned in bringing to light one of the greatest coverups perpetrated on the American public since Watergate.

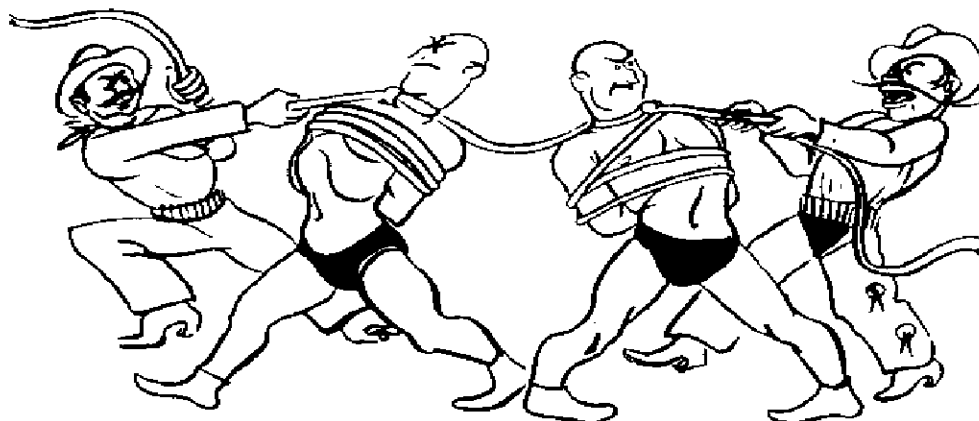

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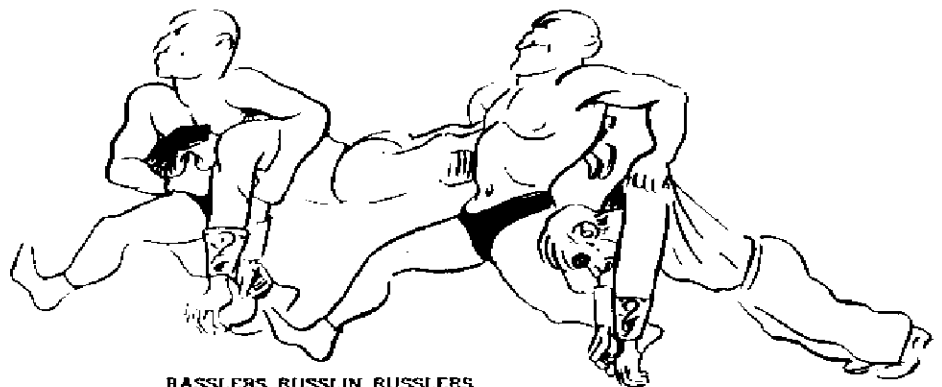
