

Black Frog

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Diplomacy is the registered trade mark of a multiplayer world-war 1 game invented by Allen Calhamer and currently owned by Avalon Hill, Inc.

In this issue you will find the most recent update of the percentile rankings for Black Frog games. The trophy game should start soon (see page 12). Mike Conner, James Townsend, Dan Kuszynski, Bill Schiwautz and Thom Burnett have all qualified. Al Pearson is being asked to take the French position (although he is a replacement player for the qualifying slot). Nobody really qualified for Austria. I am asking Ron Brown (who won as Austria in 1977HG—the first game concluded in BF) to take this position. I would appreciate it if these seven players would confirm right away if they will play in this game.

2ND CHANCE GAME

Bernie Sampson, Bill Quinn and Al Giddings have all asked me to start a "2nd chance" game for all who have done poorly in their first BF game or who have been eliminated. OK your on! Sampson, Giddings and Quinn are all in. Bob Osuch, who has asked to have a BF game start, can have the 4th spot if he wants it. The fifth, sixth and seventh spots are available to the first three of the following eligible persons who contact me: J. Lanning Myers, Kevin Mooney, Kerry Blant, Peter Ashley, Gary Coughlan, Clark Reynolds, Tom Swider, Jay Shufeldt, Al Rodriguez, Vern

Schaller, Douglas Landon, Jack Fleming or Mary Beck. If there is a very large response, two games may be started.

There will be no game fee for this game. Countries will be assigned by random draw (as in all BF games) except that no person will play the same country that he has previously played in a BF game. This game, and the trophy game, will be carried in East of Eden.

1979HK has just ended in <u>Dragon and the Lamb</u> and I have gained my 4th postal win. All four wins have come in a period of less than three months, and it is becoming a bit embarrassing to record them.

1979HK is my first win for a country other than France (I was Germany in this one) and is probably my best played game to date. The game started poorly. I misordered in F'01 and wound up with but one 1901 build (which for Germany is not too good). In F'02, France, England and Russia were all going against me and the situation was bleak to say the least. The break came when Chris Ward, who was England, resigned from the game and was replaced by Keith Mercer. Keith allied with me and, while we had two of the weakest countries on the board at the time (I had five units and Keith had three) we came back by working together. Ultimately I stabbed Keith to take the win in 1912. The stab, which is the first major stab of a long term ally that I have ever undertaken, had all the flair of a classic "Kathy Byrne stab" and I went from 13 to 19 centers in 1912.

The conclusion of this game leaves me with but four games in progress. 1980KZ (Murd'ring Ministers) is the only of these that has any promise (I should get some sort of a draw out of it). 1980AN (Why Me?) and 1981L (the Snake Pit) are almost hopeless causes. 1981C (Jihad!) is a very interesting game, but I have no high expectations for it. I resigned from 1979KG (the "R3" game in Retaliation) where I was in the game as a standby only. "R3" was a very unpleasant game to be in and I feel sorry for the individual who will take over in my stead.

I may start a few more postal games, but only a few more. I am in the process of phasing out my commitment to the postal hobby.

The biggest football story of the 1981 "pro" season is the parity that has finally been reached between the AFC and NFC. After games of November 15th the two conferences are dead even, but the NFC was ahead for one brief week after Chicago upset Kansas City on the 8th and Dallas bested Buffalo on the 9th. The AFC has enjoyed a wide win margin over the NFC for the past ten seasons.

The Los Angeles Rams are ruining the "pro" season for me. I never particularly cared much for the kams, but this year they are a particularly lousy team to watch on the tube and their season is going nowhere to boot. They are not selling out Anaheim stadium, but the local NFC affiliate TV channel (#2) is buying up all the excess seats to bring the game over the tube. If it wasn't for this, the game would be blacked out locally and a good game from some other part of the country could be televised instead. The AFC affiliate (channel #4) has opted not to schedule another game opposite the Rams game and instead of bringing us an AFC "game of the week" we get an old Shirley Temple movie instead. Thus, if you live in LA (or the area served by it's TV stations—I am 35 miles from LA) your only good TV games are on Monday night.

With five weeks to go in the pro season. Four NFC teams virtually have the play-off berths sewn up. Dallas, Philadelphia, Minnesota and San Francisco are sure bets to be in the play-offs. Six other teams are contending for the 2nd wild-card slot. Atlanta, Los Angeles, New York (Giants), Detroit, Green Bay, Tampa and Washington (that is seven not six) all have 5-6 records. But one of them will be in the play-offs. An 8-8 record will probably be good enough to make it. In 1979 the Rams were 5-6 at this same point in the year and went on to appear in the super bowl. But don't expect this to happen this year. This year the rams will be rather lucky to finish at 7-9.

In the AFC only Cincinnati appears to have a play-off slot assured. Denver, the surprise team of the year next to San Francisco, has a way to go before winning in their division (Kansas City and San Diego are breathing down their necks) but must be an odds on favorite to end up with one of the wild-card slots at worst. The New York Jets are making a real push in the east and could end up surprising a lot of people before it is all over.

The best news in the college football world was Missouri beating Oklahoma 19-14 last Saturday. The win gave Nebraska the Big Eight championship, with Oklahoma

yet to be played. Nebraska (who will be in the Orange Bowl) is the first team to cinch a major bowl bid.

The Big Eight, which is the only conference ever to carry off a "hat trick" (When Oklahoma, Nebraska and Colorado finished 1-2-3 in the polls) went one week this season with no member in the top ten of either poll (the first time ever). The conference stands in jeapardy of ending the season with no team in the top ten (especially if Oklahoma beats Nebraska next Saturday), although three teams should make bowl appearances and be in the top 20 (Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma).

Could you believe an Iowa vs Washington State Rose Bowl? At the time of this writing it is quite possible. Washington State has to beat Washington and Iowa has to beat Michigan State while Ohio State beats Michigan. Even if Iowa and Washington "tate don't make it-- Southern California and Ohio State won't either. Other teams in contention are UCLA and Michigan, along with Washington. Like the Big Eight is no longer dominated by Oklahoma/Nebraska, the Big Ten is showing signs of ending the domination of Michigan/Ohio State. Washington State could end a very long domination of the PAC 10 by SC, UCLA and Washington. Now if only the southwest could do comething on a more permanent basis about Texas and the southeast something about Alabama--next years college season could be quite interesting.

By the way the real bright spot of the 1981 football season is my Alma Mater (William Jewell College of Liberty, Missouri). WJC has completed their regular season with a 10-0 record and is the number 2 rated NAIA Division II team. NAIA are real small colleges with enrollments of less than most high schools here in California. William Jewell has always fielded a very good football team, but this is there 2nd (I think) undefeated season. They will go to an NAIA bowl game.

VOLLEYBALL NOTES

My wife's high school volleyball team has finished the season and won another league championship. She has gone into the record books as the only team to win three straight league championships twice. Having done it in 1974-75-76 and 1979-80-81. All in the Golden League. 78 - 6 is 92.9% which is a heck of a good record for a seven year span. The last three years her team has been in C.I.F. (Californ ia Interscholastic Federation) tournaments featuring the 32 or so top teams. There are over 400 high school teams in southern California. They have not done so well, losing in the quarter-finals all three years. This year they lost a tough match to San Cabriel 15-13; 17-15 and 15-12, after being ahead in all three matches. This was last Saturday.

Canyon High (where she teaches and coaches) is 15 miles NE of Valencia. It is a desert community and volley-ball is not a big activity. Some of the highschools from LA beach areas are hard to compete with. They have enrollments three or four times as great as Canyon's and volley-ball is a major sport there.
