Possibly you never expected to see a copy of Black Frog again. Surprise! I had a rather busy summer and took off from publishing this rag. I never actually planned it this way it just happened. In early June I left my job (of two months) with Hitco and went to work for Northrop. Hitco convinced that I couldn't leave that quickly and I ended up working at both jobs for over three weeks. Working 60 to 70 hours per week kept me busy enough that I was not able to spend a lot of time thinking about publishing a 'zine or playing postal Diplomacy. Then in July I want on vacation (having prearranged this as an employment condition at Northrop). Mearly two weeks of rafting in Utah also was not conductive to thinking about postal Diplomacy or publishing a zine. After the delay in June and early July, I did pick up Cm'ing the three games -- but they were published by letter instead of by zine.

The two month delay in publication of game results did cause a great deal of consternation among the players. I apologize for this and I hope (but won't guarantee) that it won't happen again. One result of the delay is that 1981K (Greed) has been transferred to a new gamemaster. I wish the game (and players) well, but the transfer was done rather poorly (I thought) (see page 8). There was also consideration for transfer of 1980KJ (V.I.P.) but it is still here as one player objected to transfer to a zine with a DIAS rule.

"Real Men Don't Eat Quiche" is a new book by Bruce Feirstein that has made a fairly big splash on the booklists. The book is all fun and games, focusing on macho America--the guys with hairy chests.

Feirstein's point is that we've become a nation of wimps. "Quiche Eaters." The heroes are all gone. Instead of John Wayne, we get Alan Alda. Instead of Errol Flynn flighting the Commies and Nazis and the Japanese Imperial Marines for India, Burma, China and all points north, we get Dustin Hoffman fighting Meryl Streep for a 4-year old.

His points are telling:

Feirstein has supplied a simple litmus test to tell the real from the wimpy.

CUTTING BACK ON THE HOBBY

It has been about ten months since I decided that I either had to get out of this hobby stone-cold, or at least cut back considerably. Actually I did stop stone-cold for $2\frac{1}{2}$ months, but then decided that I must accept the responsibility and phase out slowly.

There has been one major problem in this. I find that I have to have a certain level of participation in order to maintain interest. Eighteen months ago when I had a high level of interest, I was playing in a dozen or more games and doing well in half of them. Over the past nine months I have been playing in three games only. Participation as a player in postal games is the only justification, to my way of thinking, for being in the hobby at all. Certainly it is the only activity that ever really maintained my interest.

Playing in three games is not enough to keep any level of interest on my behalf. One of these games (1980KZ in MM) could well end this month. This is the only one of the three in which I am doing at all well (...I will win 80KZ) and after it ends my interest will decline even more.

If it were only myself involved, what the hell, let the games decline and don't worry about it. But there are others involved. The players in the three games that I am still GMing. They deserve a GM that is reasonably active and involved in the hobby—otherwise they don't get a good game. And the players in the two remaining games (that I am in), they deserve a bit of competition.

A few months back Don Stafford (I remember Stafford in particular although there were others as well) got on my case for continuing to play in postal games while I was letting deadlines slip in the games I was gm'ing. Stafford called my irresponsible and sought to have <u>Creed</u> (1981K) moved to another 'zine. I really don't see how it would have been more responsible to NMR out of three games in addition to letting deadlines slip. Oh well!

In any case, in order to maintain a little interest in the hobby while I finish out the three games (80KJ, 81CD and 80HU) I am going to make myself available for some stanby positions.

Bob Arnett, Allen Wells, Don Del Grande, Ron Brown, Cary Coughlan and Mike Conner -- you can put me on your list for one standby each--if you want.
