



Spotlight on...

MAYAL WARGALE

With in the last couple of days, I have recived, the above mentioned rules, from the Big League langers co.in linn. The cost ran me \$5.50 for FPNW, and the packet with charts etc for the River Flatte battle. Bince I have recived the packet I've had a chance to use the rules, and though they lack a bit in the calism, they are very playible.

With the entire packet, there was the rules book, which told you how to make the movement gagues, the firing arrows, the distance charts, penitraing chart, and how to move, fire, lauch tempedoes and the use of aircraft. Then there were the charts for each of the ships that fought in the battle, with 1/1200 diagrams that are used when the models aren't avaible. Also given were the demage charts for each of the ships, as well as the formula to use to make these charts for any ship that ever was, in the age of iron is WWI WWII up to now.

It takes about 5 mintues to learn how to play and get set up. It is a matter on moving your ships in any way that you want, though you can only turn up to 90° in any one given movement phase. Then you have to get down a sight the other ship(s) with your firing arrow(s) and write down the iches distance that you guess it is at, what guns firing. All this is to be done with in a time limit, usally 60-30 seconds makes for the best game.

It is then a matter of taking tape measures, linning them up with the fire arrow and seein where the shots landed. If hits are scored the taking datage and recording how much you have. With a little guess work and a good eye you'll start to land a few shalls and them the battle is on for samest. Once you have hit the ship, you find that you are able to continue for some time hitting the ship. That is the game.

What the game lacks is the fact that their are no rules covering fires, ramming and all ships can turn the same. Also missing is the different makes of gun verus the type of armor. One set of rules that I have played before the German 11" guns could fire furthur than the German 15"! and on and on the British 4" was better than the Italiam 4" in range and power. Considering that these are a good set to start with and are fast playble and quite real, they are very good for the beginner and for one wanting to see if he would like to go into this type of thing more.

TOURNALIEUT GOLF

Tournment Golf is a board game, produced by Rigley Benada. The quality is very good and should be for \$12.00. The board is a reproduction of the Green Valley Country Club course. It has small squares supersoribed on it. From square to square is 20 yards. From Square to line is 10 yards.

Frinted on the diec, are the probable distances for that particular club. There is also a directional die, which decides the clice hook or stringht. When using a wood the slice or hook is doubled. Then chipping, (which maybe done with a 5 iron-wedge) distance and slice or hook are halved. The putting die reads; In, 5 and 10. On the green, there is a 10ft circle, and a 57t circle. So gutting is simple: you putoutsidethe 10 foot circle, putt from 10 feet, or from 5 feet. Patting outside the 10 foot circle, your odds are 1-5. Putting from the 10 foot- the 5 foot your odes are 2-1 of making the putt.
