The Fremen, Emperor and Harkonnen took each other out the first turn two turns. And with the Guild raking in the spice. We decided to go for the win on Turn 3. The Harkonnen could have won the battle by taking out my weapon from my hand but he did not and i won and my ally easily won his battle as I supplied the answer about poison defense. I was surprised the BG guess was not a Turn 3 alliance win.

HARKONNEN (Nichols): Congrats to Kevin & Dave. Way too fast!

WBC WOOD!!

ABSTRACT: This was probably my best WBC ever. I won games of GANGSTERS (GSR), MONSTERS RAVAGE AMERICA (MRA, both of which earned me semifinal berths), PUERTO RICO (PRO, a quarterfinal berth), and CIRCUS MAXIMUS (CMS, a berth in the final). My 1-point second place got me into UNION PACIFIC (UNP) semifinals as well. I decided to forgo the MRA semi and final (1 plaque contested by 16 players) for the simultaneous CMS final (5 plaques contested by 12 players). I came in 3rd in CMS, finally breaking my threefold string of 8th place finishes and my five-year drought of not bringing home some Wood.

Anyway here follows a more detailed description.

We left FWB at 0730 Monday and got into the Lancaster Host, site of WBC, about 1400 Tuesday after overnighting outside of Roanoke, VA. Figure 18 hrs on the road. The Phase I of the auction was already winding down and the auction store sadly depleted. After a dip in the pool, I got two games in, CMS where I survived the race with a heavy with a +2 driver, placing 6th, and GSR which I won. I can only surmise that the other three guys were more brain-dead than I was.

Wednesday, I placed second of four playing Tomanagi in MRA, second of four in GSR (where I won the polo shirt in the Picture of the Month by being the first with a Cop #10 nametag to draw the Cop #10 bribe chit), then a 1-pt 2nd of 4 in UNP was good enough to get me into the semifinal where I placed fourth of four.

On Thursday I won a four-player game or MRA as Ixiptla mostly because the Challenger (with 48 health) chose to take on a monster with whip tentacles in the first round and was about even with my 22 health by the time he got to me. I played two rounds of THE KAISER'S PIRATES (TKP, third of three both times) and got a packet of expansion cards for the game for my trouble. Later I came in

fourth of four in PRO and then second of three in the late night GSR heat.

Friday morning, not really wanting to create a scheduling conflict on Sunday, I took a light chariot with a +2 driver and +2 speed in CMS. Rather than trying to get ahead of the pack of seven heavies and a medium (and staying there), I tried the opposite tactic -- I tried to stay behind the pack for the first 1.5 laps and let the heavies cull the herd before making my move. And it worked, I finished first of nine charlots, although no one had seen it work before at WBC or Avaloncon. I must have used up all my luck for the day since next was a disappointing fourth of four in MERCHANT OF VENUS (MoV), another fourth of four in GLORIA MUNDI, and then a fifth of five in the GSR semi.

Saturday, I won a PRO heat to qualify for the quarter-finals that night, then lost a two-player game of CARCASSONNE. My losing ways continued with a fourth of four in the PRO quarter-finals,


and an eighth of eight in SLAPSHOT.

Sunday morning I had a choice: I could enter the MRA semi-final where I would need two wins to "bring home some Wood" or to play in CMS final where finishing in the top five won Wood. I chose the latter (1 chance in sixteen vs 5 chances in 12). This time running a heavy with a +1 driver and +1 speed (What use does a heavy have for endurance? Nonetheless, I got a good roll and started

with 33), I finished third, during the same turn as the first and second place finishers.

So in 120 hrs, I played four games of GSR; three games of CMS and PRO; two games of MRA and UNP; and one game of CARCASSONNE, GLORIA MUNDI, SLAPSHOT and MoV; and the equivalent of 2/3 a game of TKP. I made one quarter final, three semifinals, and a final. I got Third Place Wood in CMS (from a field of 95). For playing I got some GSR expansion counters and rules and won a polo shirt. I got some expansion cards for trying out TKP. All that for a mere \$60 registration fee. Also bought copies of VENUS NEEDS MEN, BATTLELINE, TKP, and PAX ROMANA and ordered the new WAR AT SEA.






