

Had I known I wouldn't get the other train, clearly I would have paid out. (For what it's worth, I believe that cost me 4th place here, too.)

I'd say I had fun, but trusting Paul to do right by the KATY instead of dumping it on me, well, let's just say "lesson learned."

PZ: Might have been a wash - without trying to extend the game, I would have had two trains on the IC.

'CH: An impressive win. Well done, Paul.

Losing by that little, I can think of dozens of things I might have done that would have made up the difference. 



I have a suggestion for a small variant that we might want to try some day: start the game with the \$50 brown tile in place in New Orleans. It would add some historical accuracy--in the late 19th century New Orleans was by far the most important port in the United States and the GM&O and the IC were more important railroads than the Frisco and the Katy--but I'm not sure how it would affect the game.

CB (again): Indeed, I am beginning to wonder if AVOIDING the Frisco isn't preferred. In 1870 more than most, I am seeing the importance in the VOLUME of shares held and highly priced Frisco eating up initial capital seems to hinder ones ability to hold a higher number of shares.

I never shared your distaste for the Cotton Belt (but then I have only played four times). On the other hand, it never occurred to me that the SP could be the beast Pup turned it into. I'm VERY

impressed with that strategy and may employ it myself in the future. Kudos, Pup!

On the New Orleans variant proposal, I think you would have to have at least a five-player game to make something like that work. Furthermore, the idea of going to brown so early seems a tad excessive. Perhaps a) starting New Orleans on Green, b) upgrading New Orleans ONLY from Green to Brown when the rest of the game goes from Yellow to Green, c) Creating a value-only upgrade for New Orleans (that is, create a Grey 60 for New Orleans, adding no new lines (obviously), c1) expanding access for New Orleans from two cities to three (though I see this as less of an issue, especially given the destination tokens that already reside there).

Finally, while I am passing out kudos, kudos to Chuck for making it as close a game as he did. How many rounds ago were you looking at resigning, yet you closed the gap tremendously. Well

played.

PZ (again): Thank you Chuck. Actually, considering how many things went my way (being able to loot the Katy and dump it, but actually I was happy enough to get it, loot it, and maybe still have to run it sitting only with the Pres certif), I was kinda surprised it was so close. IC not being able to reach destination sooner probably didn't help. Also, being the leader and having my stock pillicked didn't help either.

I've seen the Cotton Belt do super well when the Pres also owns the river bridge company. You can get across the river quickly, with an extra tile lay to boot, get some money out of your rr before

3-trains, and make its destination with only a 3-train.

One of my ftf group made an 1870 variant adding the Kansas Southern RR (I think). I never played it, but I think it's intent was to make the central-south area more interesting. Another in the group made a new board in a non-historical world. It's intent is to balance all RRs. I've played this once or twice, but not recently.

MF: I wish to congratulate Paul (the man who never spells my name right) Zieske on the win. Had Chuck Hanna simply sold a share of Paul Z's company stock - instead of mine --- the results would have been much closer and Chuck may have won (but he must've thought I was winning). Sorry Paul Z. I do manipulate the stock values against the leader - it's a sign of admiration more than anything else.

I didn't play the SP as good as I should have - burned too much cash on unnecessary bridges. I do like Chuck's idea for for New Orleans' - but give the GM&O the Gulf Shipping Private Port -

then the GM&O would become easily unbalanced and too powerful.


PZ (again): The SLSF can be a tricky beast. One of the things I think you want to do is not have it so desirable to own, so people won't buy it, force you to buy additional shares, and not have shares in the IO paying dividends to the company. If you pay divs, then just the price appreciation between par and current value can make people want to buy it. And if they sell, that may not be good either. One strategy is only to pay half divs with maybe a withhold and full thrown it to keep the price down. I've seen this employed to good effect by Anthony Carver (and which he has also done similar in 1826(France) with the Belge).

MP: On the contrary, I certainly would have sold a share of the FW&D if I'd only had one. But buying one in the stock round would (1) have floated it up a notch, and (2) required me to sell something else to make room for it. It was much to my advantage to sell a share of a company that had already run rather than of one that hadn't, and my only other choice in that category was AT&SF. I also thought at that time that the game might run through another set of operating rounds, making SoPac a less desirable holding since its share price would stagnate. But I was wrong on that point, too.

PB: Yes, I overbid for the SL&SF, and I figured that out at the end of SR1 (and knew I was doomed). My one diplomatic approach to the Professor's newborn KATY was rebuffed, so I decided to punish his track lay with my own track lay. He responded by trashing KATY in favor of AT&SF and admonishing me that I should've dumped the RR that I screwed. Hadn't realized I'd "screwed" it. Set it back a tempo, yes, but that shouldn't be fatal in as competent hands as were his.

After that, it was catch-up -- and I never could. Ended up nurturing SL&SF (only) to the finish

line. If I only could've been Prez of SSW or IC too.!
