





# THE HUNT

1st Chase Extended!

Inspired by Lipton's book, "An Exaltation of Larks" (ISBN-10: 0140170960), this is a word game where we propose a noun and the players are asked to propose a collective noun to fit, such as "flock" for sheep, or "pride" for lions. Boris and Ms Nar will rank each entry for each word and the best score will be the winner, regardless of Mr. Lipton's proclamations. Each word gives a possible 1 point, but the point may be split if either more than one player suggests it or two or more words are ranked equally. The first player to score 10 points wins six free issues of this rag (not to mention ennobling). The Hunt is run in "Chases" or rounds until someone reaches 10 pts. To the Hunt!

We have a bit of a problem here. Only one player responded. He obviously would win the game since he scores all ten points and ten points are the victory criterion.


