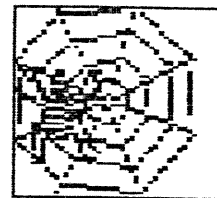

NEW FORMAT ARRIVES!

Well, here, more or less, is our new format. For those few of you subscribing by E-mail, what we've done is change our banner, and started using various different typefaces to emphasize one thing or the other. We've also included some graphics to help the reader find the game of his interest. There's a quill and paper graphic for the DIP games, a locomotive for the 1830 games, a beer mug for the 1835 game, a star (still looking for some onion domes) for KREM, a sandworm for DUNE, a dragon for MR, and a stag for The Hunt. The several DIP and 1830 games are further differentiated by a second graphic, a "IV" for BORIS IV, a "V" for BORIS V, a sawblade and victim for the 1st 1830 game, "Cruelty Is In", and a moneybag for the second, "Greed Is Good". Granted, the graphics need a little work, but we ought to have that squared away by next time.

Our 1835 section has opened with the minimum number of players and another pair of hardy souls have joined the MAGIC REALM game in progress. At this point we have room for one more DIP or 1830 section and a GUNSLINGER and then we'll have to wait for a couple of the games to wind down before starting any more.

You will note that our next deadline is a holiday. The post office has assured me that mail will be delivered on the 3rd (the federal holiday) but not the 4th. Plan accordingly.

The recently published *Zine Register* (ZR) had some nice things to say about *Boris*, so we'll return the compliment. ZR is 76 pages of reviews and listings of all the known gaming 'zines. 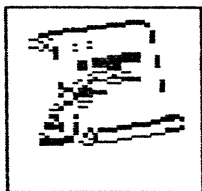

This month's Madame Bolduc Press Excellence Award goes Jack Shacklett for his BORIS V article datelined Sevastopol.

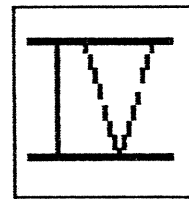

The Turkish build of two fleets augurs badly for Italian pretensions of naval supremacy in the Med and signals a determination to make BLA a "Turkish Lake". The Russian build of A SEV rather than F STP(nc) would indicate a southern campaign, but against whom? Could Turkey be trying to overthrow the Treaty of Karlowitz? Meanwhile the Western powers appear to be warily eyeing each other, looking for the first sign of weakness. England's naval superiority should make her the power to deal with rather than against.

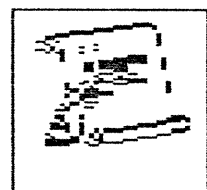
Embassy Beat

FIFTH OF FORTH--The Royal Navy has received word from a fast frigate that the North Sea fleet engaged elements of the German High Seas fleet off Denmark in a night battle. The Jack Tars were surprised by the vicious, but ineffective gunfire. The Admiral, Lord Monocle was expecting the use of blank rounds as part of a combined exercise. The use of explosive shells was soon answered by accurate naval artillery from the *Royal Oak* which sank a German Cruiser.

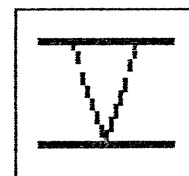
WINDSOR--The King reluctantly declared war on the Kaiser after Parliament overwhelmingly voted to enter the conflict on the Continent. The King said "I am sure my cousin has been ill advised by the German General Staff with the invasion of Holland. 6. Movement: A moves 6T from Arakeen to Oh Gap. F move 1T from False Wall West to Habbanya Ridge Sietch.
7. Combat: G w/ 4T vs F w/ 1T at Habbanya Ridge Sietch.
8. Spice Collection: A collects 2S for Arakeen and 6S in Oh Gap, F collect 6S at Funeral Plain, H collects 2S for Carthag, and G collects 1S for Tuek's Sietch.

TURN 2

1. The Storm moves from Sector 1 to Sector 2.
2. Spice locations are Shai-Halud/Broken Land (8) and Shai-Halud/Great Flat(10).

We have combat and a nexus. Guild and Fremmen are reminded to submit a battle plan. Note that F cannot use his 6S in the battle since it was collected after the battle; likewise G cannot use the 1S he collected. Alliances may be formed as per the House Rules. Include any orders to ally with your next orders. Movement may be conditional upon how the combat turns out or whether or not alliances are formed. Players with tokens in multisector territories are asked to specify which storm sector their units are in.

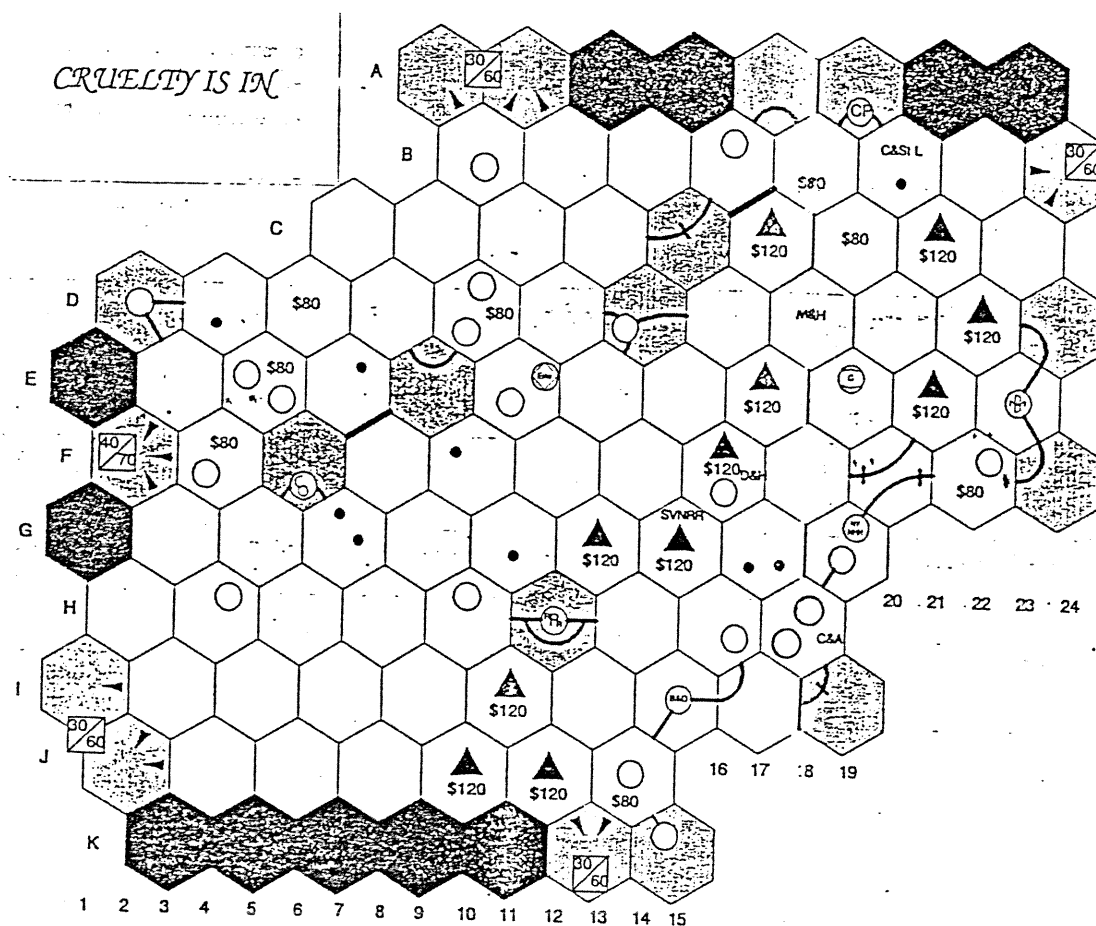

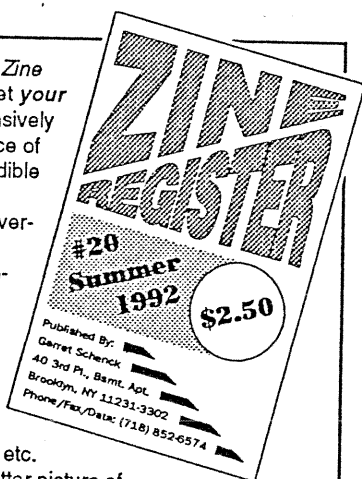

Looking for a new zine to subscribe to? Thinking about signing up for another game? You *could* dig up some publishers' names and addresses out of a zine you're currently getting, send a buck or stamps for a sample, and wait until they get around to sending you their latest.
