



CLIFFHOME -- As Austria hammers the final nails in the Tsar's coffin, his toady, Italy, aids in rending asunder the hapless French. EMBASSY BEAT

BERLIN--The Kaiser was hospitalized this morning, apparently for stress resulting from his frustrating campaign against the French. A guard reported that he found the Kaiser late last night jumping up and down in his frog pond screaming, "Die a horrible death, die a horrible death!" The Kaiser's condition is reported as being stable, but his doctors recommend that he rest for an undisclosed amount of time. The Kaiser officially placed Foreign Minister Fischer in full control of the German military to continue the destruction of the vile French dogs. Fischer told reporters that the Kaiser's final words to him at their meeting were, "Bring me legs."

Sevastopol Sentinel: Archivake Wormtongue wound up his visit to the freshly liberated eastern provinces yesterday by touring some of his new dachas on the beach. He then boarded his newest cruise ship, the Poorpaul (that's Slovenian for what-a-sucker) and left for his vecation in the Aegean. 

Could an Anglo-French entente be developing, despite all the previous rhetoric, to counterbalance the Eastern alliance? The Italian moves vestward would seem to make the pact imperative for M. Rezzarday. Germany holds the key swing vote as to who will be first to get the axe.

Barcelona Bulletin -- A host of dignitaries was present today to witness the awarding of the prestigious Super-Suday Bomb to the staff of this newspaper in honor of its coverage of the French war crimes on SPA. Receipt of this award follows close on the heels of, and indeed eclipses, the paper's receipt of a Pulitzer Prize for the same coverage.

"This is a great day for Spain," said Spanish President Al del Gravo. "But despite my joy at this happy event, my heart is still heavy with the knowledge that the French troops will

soon return and that the horror of French occupation will resume."


President del Gravo went on to plead with the other nations of Europe to destroy Prance, and to request that, if Prance ever is conquered, all of its citizens be imprisoned for war crimes.

In related news, it was community announced today that a small group of wealthy Spaniards had contributed over ten million pesos toward establishing an independent Spanish military unit. This unit, to be called the voluntistas, would be charged with defending SPA from French invasion. No further information on this unit was available at press time.

Sophia Standard News--The King's invitation to the Austrian Empire has met with a positive response, and sources close to the throne today announced the hated Turkish armies should soon be forced out of BUL. The King also expressed his thanks to the other European powers for their support during Bulgaria's "time of trouble".
