

CRUELTY COMPLETED!!

Our initial 1830 game is complete. This is something of a feather in Boris's cap as, to the best of my knowledge, no 1830 game was ever completed in *Fast Trax*, *Fruel's Folly*, *Wild Gypsy Rose*, or *Loco Motives*. If you have ever attempted to GM one you'd know why. It takes an incredibly long time to adjudicate a normal turn (maybe five or six times as long as the most complicated DIP turn). For this reason, we will not be starting another until "Greed" is over, which could be three or four months. Looking over the recent *Zine Register*, (see ad elsewhere), there aren't more than a couple of 'zines that offer the 18xx series, and the reason surely is the GM workload they require.

To replace the completed Kremlin, I'd like to do another game of *Dune*. We already have three signed up, so only need three more. Might be able to recruit some fresh blood at Avaloncon. Other non-18xx titles are possible.

Yes, indeed, Boris and Ms Nar are again venturing forth to endure the vigors of tournament life. Well, Boris will endure it; Ms Nar will probably be raiding malls in the DC area. Plans are to room with Paul Saunders and cronies for the duration. As I recall, I signed up for *Unlimited Civilization*, *War at Sea*, *Dune*, *Greed*, *Kremlin*, and DIP. I'm working on some stickers with the spiderweb graphic above to put on the nametags so all us BORISers will recognize one another.

Please note that the next deadline will be but days after returning from Avaloncon, so I won't be able to get much of a head start on compiling the next issue UNLESS YOU MAIL EARLY. Please do if you can.

We've been experimenting with the layout again. The last few issues were done up in Times 12 point font on legal-sized paper, then photo-shrunk about a third, then laid side-by-side to get the digest format. This issue is already laid out in digest format in Geneva 14 point at half-size on "normal" sized paper and printed sideways. Initial galleys looked good, so we'll see what we get.



AUSTRO-ITALIAN TENSION? FRANCE PREPARES FOR TAHITI

Spring 1908



ERRATA: Germany, with five centers and four units may build one.

CLIFFHOME--With the evident friction between Austria and Italy, Germany is now the key player in the upcoming foursome. The Kaiser has no fleets with which to challenge Lord One-Eyed, but can certainly intervene decisively with England to decide whether Wormtongue or Italy should be next to go. Wormtongue's perfidy in asking for support into TRI while attacking BER won't be forgotten when the decision is made nor will be his threat to BER. On the other hand, an Italian fleet in MID won't sit too well with London. England's surrender of A SEV in Fall 1906 is coming back to haunt him as his dearth of armies means he must rely on others to take the war directly to Wormtongue.

The captain called the cook.



SPRING 1908



WALL STREET JOURNAL--Brokerages expect continued disinterest in the dinar and renewed interest in the lira. The ruble is viewed as overpriced since lower priced currencies offer better leverage. The Bourse is a game of foreign exchange. Each player starts out with \$1000 American and can invest it in the currencies of the European Great Powers. Each unit of European currency costs its current number of supply centers in dollars. This game is pegged to the results of BORIS VI (on page 4). The game is open to all but players in BORIS VI. Players can buy and sell currencies freely except after a Spring turn (the Bourse is closed to prevent panic selling and rampant speculation). Of course the player with the best net worth at game's end will be the winner.

ERRATA: JB/NEWBOT had \$4 left over from his initial purchases that were never listed. FROG bought pounds, not kroner (last issue's chart is incorrect). NEWBOT's buys last season were credited to WMMNM instead.

Since there is uncertainty as to the prices of the kroner (6 or 5) and the ruble (6 or 7) due to Austria's retreat order, Company values base on both options are given (RUM/otb). Those wishing to deal in either currency should specify when the buy/sell if they will do so at the lower, higher, or either value.

I believe that a *fixed* SC bonus for winners would be the best plan if you are going to award a SC bonus for draws. For instance, award any winner a bonus equal to 18 SCs. Or 20 SCs. Or 20 SCs (say). It is ominous to make a winner's actual SC count matter. It is also a shame to award SC bonuses to draw-wins but not to winners.

Perhaps this would be a good solution? //Don Grande indicates that he probably will not make details of the scoring system public, but he has given me these guidelines:

- * two 2-way car can thus don't necessarily beat a win and a survival, but not a win at a 5-way draw;
- * a win beats a 2-way and a 3-way;
- * a 5-way always scores higher than a survival, however much math it!

"Supply center points" is not simply a multiple of how many SCs a player has *at the end* of the game, although it is based solely on ending SCs. Don admits that this last item might raise eyebrows, and I don't completely understand it, but that, I think, is the last piece on the scoring system! //
