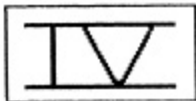

CLIFFHOME--Could Wormtongue have made his move too soon? Now all of Europe has united to thwart his megamaniacal ambitions. Or has it? Count Devoni's naval traffic jam was about as inept as could be imagined and GRE could've fallen too with a modicum of support. Some skeptics feel a massive con job is being perpetrated here; others believe Wormtongue believes his forces have reached critical mass. 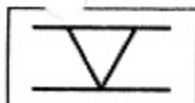

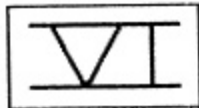
Boer Bugle (Capetown): Lord Acquir, Defense Minister of the South Africa commonwealth announced today that a small expeditionary force will be dispatched to take control of French and Italian provinces in Northern Africa. He was quoted as saying, "It is high well time that the Eyties and Frogs were replaced in the Mediterranean by a competent, well regulated guardian power. Only the British Empire can effectively guide the new world order." Details of actual troop movements were a guarded secret, but a Rand-McNally road maps of North Africa and Tunis were seen to be rapidly purchased from local book merchants.

WALL STREET JOURNAL--Their hunger for new acquisitions unsatiated, Austria and Russia have pounced upon new prey. Italy, too long fixated on SPA, now finds all her home centers threatened by the Austrian maw. Russia shall pluck the last Turkish center and grab what it can of a vanishing Germany. France should regain SPA after the Italins dismemberment, then be forcibly absorbed into the British Empire. The question of the moment is, "When will Russia reach critical mass and turn on Austria?" Prudent investors will want to know.

BORIS WORLD PRESS REVIEW

Barcelona Bulletin (published in Zurich): Reports reaching the Spanish government-in-exile have revealed that the atrocities committed by the French occupation troops against innocent citizens of SPA have increased in number and severity since their previous occupation. From Zaragoza comes a report of a horrible atrocity committed at a pet store. Apparently a French patrol occupied the village in which the store is located for several days, causing the residents to flee to the countryside. When they returned after the French had departed, workers at the store discovered that a sign reading "Hundreds of adorable puppies and kittens for sale" had been taken down and replaced by one reading "French Army Snack Bar". There was no sign of any of the puppies or kittens which the store had in stock and one can only guess at what fate may have befallen them. Spanish President Al del Bravo reacted with horror to the report. "Is there no level to which these animals will not sink?" he asked. "I would hope that the other nations of Europe will be as repulsed as I am by these actions and will take appropriate measures to see that France is punished for them."

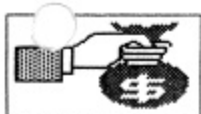

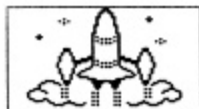

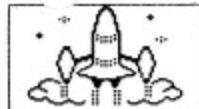

President Jean-Pierre Grise apologized profusely but added that he had little control over the situation. "The army is loyal to former President Rezzarday," he said. "There is nothing I can do to control these troops. The former President is a deeply sick and very troubled man as his complicity in this incident reveals. Even helpless puppies are not safe from him."

Budapest Daily Bugle: The Emperor today returns from his visit to the new Russian Grand Duchy of the Golden Horn. Officials high in the palace quoted the Emperor as saying that the new Grand Duchess was "... charming, simply...." The *Te Deum* offered in the Hagia Sophia was a moving event and representatives of most of the civilized crowned heads of Europe were there (excepting, naturally, the Germans, who can hardly be considered civilized). The Emperor was said to remark that it was a pity that the Vatican remained under the control of a state hostile to it, and something really ought to be done someday.

Budapest Tageblatt: Our correspondent in Berlin filed the following report: Unconfirmed rumors today indicated a serious disagreement within the halls of parliament. Herr Zimmermann (the Deputy Foreign Minister) was in the process of a tedious speech justifying the attack on Austria, despite the fact that Germany is already engaged in a stalemated war with Britain and France and the fact that a marauding Russian army has crossed the frontier in PRU (apparently due to some foolishness in high circles) when he was shouted down by a large number of delegates from both sides of the aisle. The resulting debate reached levels of acrimony unheard of in German history with even the Kaiser being denounced for his "inexplicable stupidity; probably only to be expected in a deformed cripple who thinks his best friend is a swinish Slav or a smelly Dogo!" Members of the Kaiser's personal Guards battalion were finally ordered to restore order and prevent bloodshed.

London Times: The well known *Financial Times*, until recently produced by Lord Bolduc of Fort Walton was forced to issue an embarrassed apology to Chancellor of the Exchequer, Lord McHugh the Liberal MP from Upper Darby. The *Financial Times'* Lord Bolduc brazenly predicted the demise of Lord McHugh and his government at the outbreak of the recent hostilities on the Continent. "I really underestimated the great leadership ability of the Liberal leader," said a repentant, but unbowed, Bolduc, now an editor of *The National Star-Inquirer*. Bolduc's current rag claims that aliens are fighting for the Kaiser.
