A report from Richard Price (Sir Jordan in "Magic Realm"): "18XX in the Midwest"

I have recently acquired (as part of a consortium of Chicago gamers) two new 18XX games, 1850 "The Midwest" and 1870 "The Trans-Mississippi". Both games were designed by W. P. (Bill) Dixon. We purchased them from him for \$100 each. They are both well made games with color plotted map boards which are mounted on foam board. The stock certificates, trains, private companies and tiles are also well done, but they have to be cut from the cardstock on which they are printed. Money is not supplied, so we purchased 1830 money from AH.

The 1850 map covers the area just West of the 1830 map stretching to South Dakota and Nebraska. The 1870 map covers the area just South of the 1850 map with a two hex overlap and extends South to the gulf.

I have played both games 3 or 4 times. They are both very like 1830, more so than the other 18XX games on the market. They both include some novel changes to the stock trading rules which, in my opinion, greatly improve the game system. These changes are compatible with 1830 and can be used with that game.

1850 has a less open map board and is a vicious token blocking game while 1870 has a very open map and encourages a lot of parallel track building and long runs.



**CLIFFHOME**--This season's action brings to mind the old axiom "I'd rather fight an alliance than be in one." Wormtongue's forces enjoy unity of command and a single, albeit twisted, purpose. The West has three "heads", three visions, and no one head completely trusts another. The Alliance needs Germany's armies to hold the line in *Mittel* Europe and Italy's fleets to take the attack to Wormtongue's weakness, his littoral centers. England has little to contribute and is positioned securely behind the Italo-German frontline. Berlin and Rome get the point.



**RUSSIA:** "Curses, foiled again!" to quote Snidley Whiplash.

**GM:** First of all, I'd like to thank Jon Langbert, Chuck Hanna, Jack McHugh, and Mark Frueh for fearlessly subbing where sane men would fear to tread. To me, it was obvious as early as 1903 that the game belonged to either England or Russia and that it was probably going to go to whomever made the first move on the other. Wayne moved first, and eked it out, primarily due to the non-fall of ROM and French intervention. Jack's fatal mistake may have been in not building F STP (incl) early as "insurance" against English predations. All in all, a well played game.



WALL STREET JOURNAL--The Eastern Alliance grinds its way inexorably westward. German and Italian forces have been reduced to banditry. I figure there are 24 different sets of retreats possible and that the most likely has 64 different combinations of builds/tears, assuming everybody builds to the max. Russia has 16 (43 if you count underbuilding) permutations alone. Accordingly, due next time are orders for the retreats and Winter 1904/05. The latter may be conditional on the former.







I actually do regret that it is necessary to take this step, because together we could have done some wonderful things, but we really needed more than just a nonaggression agreement.

#### BORIS WORLD PRESS REVIEW

Constantinople Cryeresski: The Duchess of the Golden Horn has announced the Russian Military's success, once-and-for-all, in the elimination of the Islamic threat against Christendom. The Last Crusade is complete.

The Economist: According to government sources there is a dispute between the Foreign Office and the Admiralty over the recent Russian naval expansion in the far North. "The Navy is being paranoid as usual," complained a high level Foreign Ministry official on the condition of being anonymous. "We are having delicate talks with the Tsar and the Navy insist on rocking the boat, no pun intended."

A high level source in the Admiralty was equally upset. "The Russians double their fleet in the Atlantic and we're suppose to ignore it? If the French or Italians did that we'd go bonkers but just because the Russian keeps in contact we're suppose pretend we don't see it."

The Prime Minister office issue a press release in the wake of this policy argument saying, "While we are not pleased Russia's new fleet builds we do not dictate policy to allies. However we do intend to make inquiries with our Russian friends. We also reserve the right to take all steps necessary to defend British interest as we see them. The government will not hesitate to take ANY actions as we see fit to protect our security."

Sources in the PM's office believe the last sentence refers to recent Royal Navy exercises in the Norwegian Sea. The exercise, codenamed "Northern Exposure I", is seen as a deterrent and a defensive strategic redeployment vis-a-vis Russia.

Vienna Voice--The Emperor's triumphal return to liberated Vienna was greeted with great jubilation, though he warned the cheering crowds, "We are not out of the woods yet, but the neo-hunish scum are being crushed, and our eventual triumph is assured!" After a ceremony of thanksgiving near the bullet-pocked Schonbrunn Palace, the Emperor announced he would be journeying to Rome to assist in the recreation of the various Italian minor states -- "...which are certainly entitled to their independent existence out from underneath incompetent central authority..." During his speech, the Emperor invited the French to complete the destruction of Italian armed forces in conjunction with Austria's powerful military. He also remarked that the Kaiser's only hope was to abjectly surrender and become an Austrian vassal state, thus resuming "...Prussia's natural role in central Europe."






