

CLIFFHOMER--Wormtongue and his Crimau Tide roll on. BER and ANK fall. VEN is all but surrounded; on the other hand, MUN wriggled out of his clutches. Perhaps his honey-coated lies never reached Interim-King Ressarday whose order of A Hol-Ruh would've saved MUN or A Hol-Kie would've denied German A BER a retreat. England is poised to snuff out the Taur to spite the Archduke, and in so doing secure one stalemate line and her survival. Italy, it seems, has seen the light and has sortied into AEG; on the other hand, isn't this similar to last Spring's analysis? As strange as it may seem, the rogue French army may be the key to the situation. Allied with Austria, it could catalyze Germany's collapse; allied with the West, it could bulwark the defense--but at what price to the increasingly desperate Germans and Italians? The Brits know they will survive and will indeed almost certainly place second. But who remembers runners-up?
