

shutdown of all currency trading in the Crown, the Finance Ministry today announced it would buy all Crowns offered at \$0.50, regardless of source. Finance Minister Wolfgang Gotalottabucks said the Crowns would be used to finance the war effort. "We'll make a killing ... er I mean a substantial return on our investment if trading resumes at levels existing prior to the halt in trading. Did we sell all of our Piasters? I hope we did. How many Francs are we holding?"

Geneva Gazette: ADMIRAL LINGUINI KIDNAPS POPE!! ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT ON AUSTRIAN EMPEROR BY GENERAL TURKEY TETRAZINNI!! Stories on p 25.

Il Duce (Rome, opposition): Initial reports from an undisclosed source in the War Department indicate the newly raised army in NAP was kidnapped by the visiting Austrian fleet last night. Upon further investigation, this newspaper determined that the army did indeed embark with the visiting fleet, probably destined to be cannon fodder in Turkey to feed Austrian imperial expansion. Our brave, young lads were no doubt lured aboard with chocolate and cute little leather shorts, meanwhile the Northern Army is wandering the mountains south of Switzerland and the 'so-called' real army is lost in the African desert. Naturally, Foreign Minister Fisher was unavailable to explain these useless troop movements; rumor has it he is visiting the wine making regions of France.

How long can the Italian people tolerate such high-handed Imperial trifling with our nation's defense while the hired foreign lackey cavorts abroad?

Therengi Business Review (Harvard, USA): Turkish coffee prices have shot up with the recent acquisition of the product by Italian firms. The Austrian firm of Cafe Vienna is also trying to penetrate the Turkish supply of coffee but they are lagging behind in the transportation logistics as the Italians have more ships available to carry the product.

Flemish liners have also seen a dramatic rise as the British firm of Soft and Comfort (a division of the American Charmin company) has completed a hostile takeover of the Flemish linen companies. The takeover is probably due to the control of Irish linens and a desire to reduce competition and monopolize prices. The British seem intent on changing this monopoly into a fortune with market penetration into the Iberian and North African markets despite tentative ventures by the French. This could be a real profitable venture.

The biggest question at this time is who will dominate the Scandinavian dairy product market. The Germans seem to have an advanced control of the dairy products but the Russian bear seems to have awakened from its hibernation and is quickly bringing its economic power to "bear" on the region. The centralized resources of the Germans may topple the Russians extended transportation lines if the other competitors do not try market penetration for some time.

In all aspects, especially the arms market, things seem quite profitable.
