EMBASSY BEAT

ROME: Foreign Minister Fisher announced today that he has uncovered a French plot against Italy. Reportedly France was in the process of shipping huge quantities of extremely bad French white wine to Italian markets--mislabelled as Italian in origin. "This dastardly plot to flood the Italian market with lousy French wine, depriving our own citizens of their livelihood, taking out life for wine that should be served to swing in France (or possibly sold in Germany) and corrupting our population, will not go unanswered. I have ordered the ALPe to the border with France to prevent any shipments crossing the frontier and recalling a fleet from the Eastern Med to defend our shores. I also deny accusations that the real army is lost in the African desert. It will soon be in Morocco to entertain the visiting English fleet. In return for fresh fruit & spices and large amounts of mutton, the English navy has offered excursions on board their ships to see the coast of SPA and PDR. 1. The Storm moves to Sector 2.
2. Spice blows occur at Habbanya Ridge Flat (1O) and Minor Erg (3). 6S remain at Oh Gap.
3. Bidding: B & F collect 2S CHOAM charity. There are two cards up for bid. F bids 2S, gets _____ (-2S to E)

No bid on bids on the second card. It will return next time.

4. Revival: A revives 2T. E revives ST (-4S). F revives 2T. G revives 1T, then plays the "Chels" card to revive ST more. H revives 2T.
5. Shipping: G goes last. F ships 6T to Sietch Tabr. H ships 1T to Minor Erg (-2S to G). B hitchhikes 1T. G ships 6T to Sietch Tabr (-3S); B hitchhikes 1T.
6. Movement: A moves 1ST from Haggis Basin to Plastic Basin. B moves 2T from Habbanya Ridge Sietch to Habbanya Ridge Flat (-1S). F moves 2T & 1* from Polar Sink to Minor Erg. H moves ST from Sihsaya Ridge to Minor Erg.
7. Combat: F with 2T & 1* vs H (@) with 4T at Minor Erg. G with 6T vs F (@) with 7T at Sietch Tabr.

Due next time are orders for Turn 6 Combat through Turn 7 Spice Blow. Note that the Guild could win it this time. If the Fremen don't have a "Cheap Hero(ine)" card, they will not be able to play a leader at Sietch Tabr (even if Harkonnen played a captured Fremen leader--they both would be at Minor Erg).
