BEL, HOL, are VEN possible, but not likely. 1911 could resp SWE, and DEN to complete the conquest. The English electorate is war-weary and about evenly split on whether to accept an armistice. The new Peace Now party is expected to gain a near majority of seats in Parliament. Several "Peace Rallies", sponsored by Catholic and Quaker organisations (and allegedly bankrolled by Austria) have been brutally put down by the Home Guard, fomenting the fall of the government of Prime Minister Zodda Thassalocratic Party and precipitating early elections.






