"BORIS XIII" ENDS WITH A WHIMPER!!

Since only two of the five players voted, "Boris XIII" has ended in a 4-way (FIRE) draw. I had this one pegged as either an E or F win. Since no one has signed up for "Boris XV" yet, unless it fills soonest, we'll be replacing "XIII" with either MACHIAVELLI (1995) "The Balance of Power" scenario or with BALKAN WARS (need 1). Players interested in participating should send their country preference list and, in the case of MACH, whether basic, advanced, or optional rules should be used.

This issue is a disappointment. On top of the lack of fighting spirit that ended "XIII", we have two NMRs despite what amounted to a 3-day deadline extension. We have two guest GM games that are stalled: SETTLERS OF CATAN (Mr Wertz sent his orders to me after I left for WBC rather than to Don), and 1830 (only two players confirmed in game). KINGMAKER arrived on my doorstep, and while I have plenty of room for it this time, I may not be able to fit it in again until KREMLIN finishes.

This year's WBC was larger than last year's and had a noticeable increase in the number of distaff participants, perhaps because of the growing number of family oriented games in the Century. Boris fared about as usual--placing second at PRINCESS RYAN'S STAR MARINES and not qualifying at MONSTERS RAVAGE AMERICA (4 losses), CIRCUS MAXIMUS (run over for 11th and finished for 4th), SETTLERS OF CATAN (tied for 3rd on my board), WIZARD'S QUEST (3rd of 5 on my board), GANGSTERS (3 losses), SLAPSHOT (eliminated in the board playoffs), and DUNE (a three-way alliance win and a loss to a Guild residual, not enough to qualify for the final). Roomie Paul Saunders brought home "the Wood" by winning the VICTORY tournament and made the DUNE final (all eight hours of it--another Guild residual victory).

I did buy a Mayfair SILVERTON at WBC, so I hope to get something put together before the next issue describing the differences between it and the Two Wolf edition.

As play proceeds, Nobles will move in si-movement, and thru the movement of the Nobles, especially as they respond to event cards, that the players learn what cards are allocated to which Noble. And as the Nobles join together, the make up of the other factions are determined.... and of course, if a player allies with another faction, they might tell each other of their factions make up, which in turn help them determine the other factions better. When Nobles move their belligerent or neutral status is not reported, so there are some changes to the rules to help belligerent but understrength forces win when attacking a group with more strength than them.

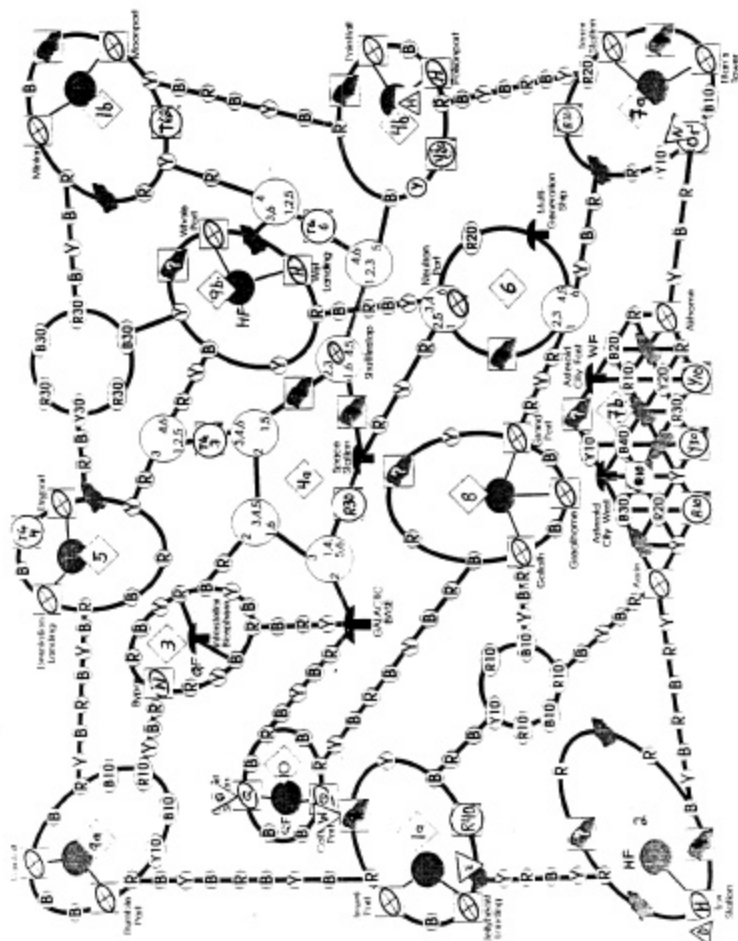

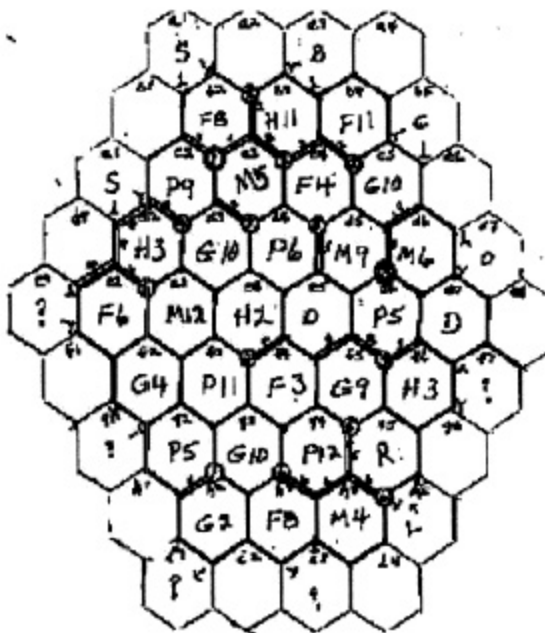
