

NOTIONAL PBEM RULES FOR JUNTA

The standard Rules as published by West End Games © 1985 will be used except as altered here.

CONCEPT: The game will play like face-to-face (ftf) except that the GM will handle all card draws and maintain a record of Bank deposits/withdrawals and that the players will communicate by e-mail.

SET-UP: The Game Master (GM) will randomly assign table positions and "deal" each player five political cards. He will inform all players of the Table order and inform each player secretly of his/her political cards.

INITIAL ELECTION: Player #1 will have the first opportunity to nominate a player to be *El Presidente* and to choose a faction name/color. Nominations (and faction/color selection) then proceed in table order. Then the second round of voting. If no *El Presidente* is elected, further rounds of nominations/voting will occur until *El Presidente* is elected. The first game year then begins.

GAME YEAR:

A/C: GM draws political cards and money cards, informing the appropriate players

B: *El Presidente* may (re)assign cabinet positions

D: *El Presidente* proposes the Budget, and the Chamber of Deputies votes thereon

E: Each player sends his Location to the GM who notifies the players when all are in

F: Assassinations are announced and attempted.

G: The Bank does business (maybe).

H/I/J: A coup may occur. If so, there follows a Coup aftermath then the Bank does business.

COUPS:

Dice rolls will be resolved either by the GM or by dice@pbm.com, preferably the latter.

DEADLINES:

Players will normally be expected to make their moves within 48 hrs of the previous move.
Extensions will be available.

NMR:

Should a player disappear, the following are the default orders

- a) Abstain on all votes.
- b) Location will be chosen at random (exe: the player will go into exile the 2nd time this occurs); if location is the Bank, the player will deposit all monies in pocket if not assassinated
 - c) No assassination attempted
 - d) Remains loyal during coups
 - e) Units will only fire if fired upon.
 - f) Cards will be discarded at random to maintain a 6-card hand

Should *El Presidente* fail to send orders, the following are his default orders

- a) Ministries will not be reassigned
- b) Ms Nar will propose a Budget
