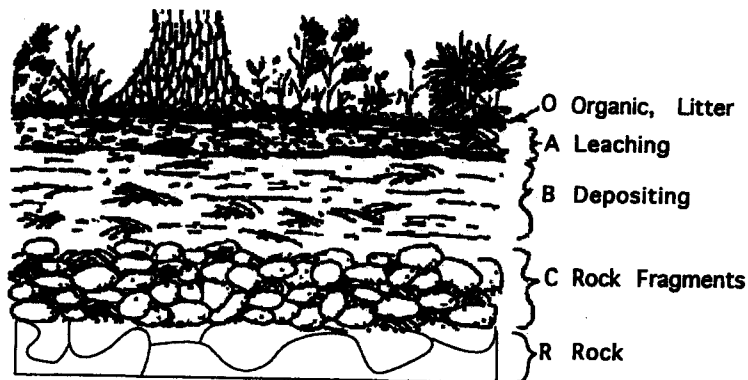
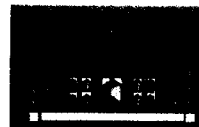


Figure 19.2 Cross-section of layers in soil.

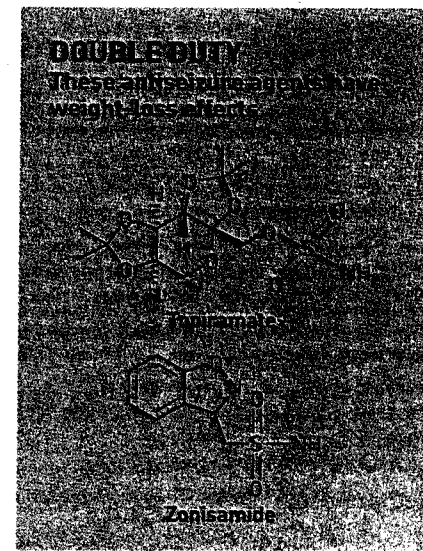
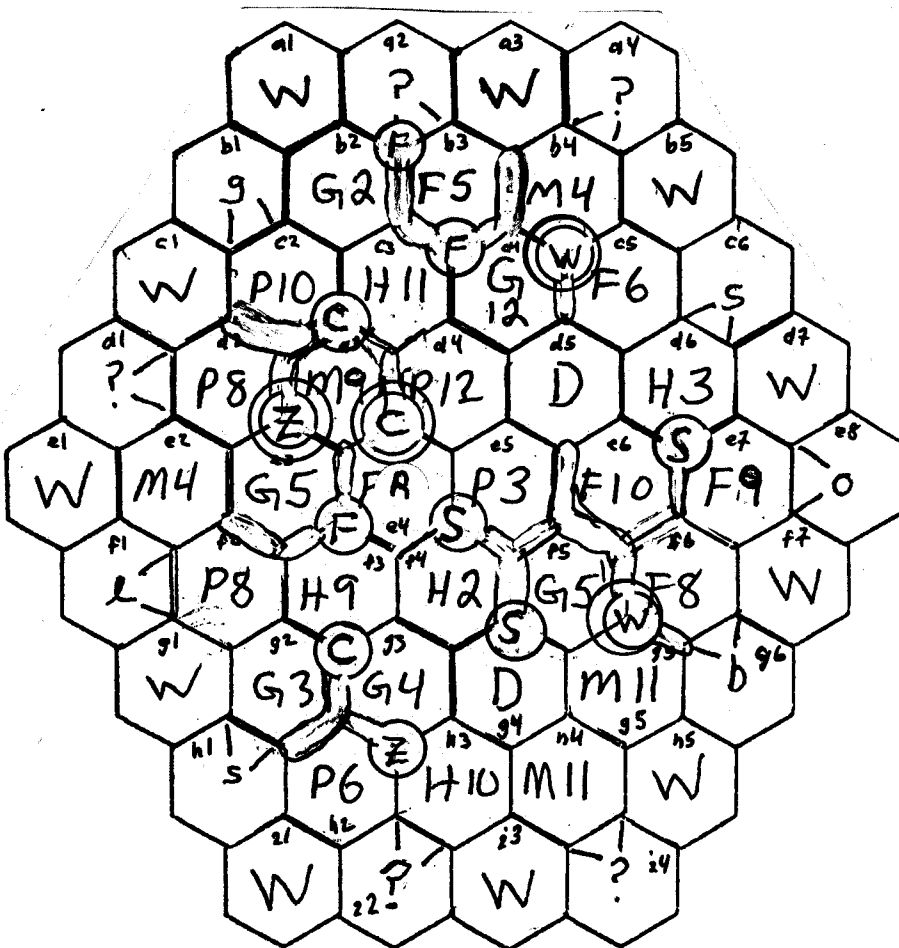
