(from Arturo Guajardo, 8-13-78): Dear Roy,

I have never doubted that you would serve as an honorable gamemaster. You have proved this in the games you administered in Rowland's Warmonger, and long association with you over the past year has convinced me of your upright character in these matters. Certainly, one who has used his publication as a forum for Gamemaster ethics demonstrates his concern and recognizes the importance of the subject.

However, I do not feel that you should have printed Mr. Nielsen's letter.

Granted, your reaction to the letter was proper and just, but the action you took was, in my opinion, a tad extreme. I agree that the gamemaster should not involve himself in the game to such an extent that he is tampering with the alliance structure by giving out asked for or unasked for "advice." Perhaps Bill should not have asked the question, and certainly you should not have given him an answer. But consider, that by publishing his letter you have indeed influenced the course of the game which is the very reason the gamemaster should not have answered the letter.

I don't know how exactly this will affect the course of the game. That can probably be answered best by France and Germany and perhaps Russia and Italy (As Austria, I am somewhat removed from this particular controversy, though I do not doubt it will affect me indirectly in the long run).

I think a more reasonable course of action would have been to send Nielsen a private note explaining your position and asking that he refrain from future inquiries of this nature. Or, if you wished to use his letter for illustrative purposes, you could have printed it, deleting specific references to names, countries, and games, or anything that could be used to identify the writer. This could have saved Mr. Nielsen unnecessary embarrassment, explained your position to the world at large, and still have eliminated any possible charge of interference in the game.

I doubt that the printing of the letter is a serious matter, at least not so serious that it would end Bill's chances of winning the game. He may have to put a good deal more effort into his diplomacy or alter his game plan somewhat. The letter has been printed and that fact is unalterable. It is the players that must decide how it will affect the game, if at all.

In any event, it is my belief that you are a completely just and honorable gamemaster, though I believe that perhaps you acted a little over-zealously in this particular matter. Looking forward to the next P&R.

Some of you out there may know that I am active in the 'Save the Whales' campaign sponsored by the Center for Environmental Education. I have circulated petitions, collected contributions, written letters to congressmen, foreign cons lets, and in general done lots of things to get myself a file in the F.P.I. and C.I.A. headquarters. The other day I got a letter from the CEE which I would like to share with all of you.

Dear friend of the WPF,

The United States Congress' "work barrel" interests are preparing to gut the Endangered Species Act of 1973 and we urgently need your help to stop it.

On July 19, the Senate voted to weaken the Endangered Species Act when Senators John Culver (D-Iowa) and Howard Baker (R-Tenn) rammed through an amendment to the Act that sets up a high-level committee of political appointees to be the ultimate arbiter of the existence or extermination of any species of plant or animal that is in "irreconcilable conflict" with a federal dam, highway or other "work barrel project".

In recent months, the snail darter - a small 3" fish - has been the subject of one such "conflict", resulting in a Supreme Court fight which saw the Court rule against the construction of the ill-conceived Tellico Dam - and in favor of the snail darter - because it would destroy the habitat of this endangered species.

Angered at the Court's apparent protection of wildlife, the Senate's Environment and Public Works Committee has reported out a bill which places more concern on "work barrel projects" than preserving any endangered species or its habitat. In effect, they want to change the Act to ensure that "development" interests will not be rules against, again.

If the Act is weakened, hundreds - even thousands - of endangered mammals, fishes, birds, amphibians, reptiles, mollusks, crustaceans, and other species will be in immediate jeopardy of extinction to satisfy man's short-term economic interests. We can't let that happen.

This is not just a fight to save the obscure species of plants and wildlife which are virtually unknown to most of us. Rather, it is an attempt to save the Southern bald eagle (less than 700 left), the bowhead whale (less than 2500 left), the grizzly bear (less than 900 left), the Eastern timber wolf (less than 1000 left), the Florida panther (less than 100 left) and countless other species whose existence and habitat preservation are immensely important to our lives.

You can help us head-off any weakening of the Endangered Species Act by doing the following:

1. Write a letter immediately to the member of Congress whose name appears on the enclosed postcard and urge him to fight any attempts at diluting the Act. Feel free to use the thoughts expressed in this letter and just put them in your own words. In this election year, members of Congress need to be reminded that a large conservationist constituency exists, too.

If you don't have the time to write a personal letter, or if you want to underscore your concern, mail the enclosed, pre-addressed postcard.

2. Send a letter to the editor. We have focused on several of the most influential newspapers in the country in the hopes of enlisting their support, too. Please write a personal letter to them outlining your concern about weakening the Act and urge them to take an editorial stand in favor of the existing law. Your pre-addressed postcard to the editor is another means of demonstrating that thousands of people, like yourself, are deeply committed to the cause of wildlife protection.
3. Encourage your friends to join with you in this letter writing campaign. Congress is susceptible to public pressure, so we must let them hear from us. The "work barrel" lobbies are hard at work to destroy the Endangered Species Act. We must fight them now.

Please don't delay in writing. Congress will return from recess after Labor Day and a vote could come anytime after that.

P.S. Since the Act was passed in 1973, over 5, 200 potential or actual "conflicts" have arisen and all but 1 - the snail darter/Terlico Dam controversy - have been resolved through mediation, negotiation or compromise. To set up a high-level "committee" as the Culver-Paker bill proposes, is not only unnecessary, it is dangerous because it makes the future of wildlife susceptible to the whim of the "work barrel" special interests. You can help save our wildlife. Send your letters today.

P.P.S. Don't forget to call or write your own congressional representative, too. We'll need all the help we can get when the Endangered Species Act reaches the House floor for a vote.

If for example, the country has more centers than units is will be indicated like this: '1/4, 1short/' meaning 4 units, but owns 5 centers. CAPITALS indicate the final resting place of the unit. Underlined orders or parts of orders fail. Some common abbreviations are: OTE, Off The Board. ann, Annihilated. S, Supports. R, Retreats to. H, holds. C, Convoys. nso, no such order. nsu, no such unit. imo, impossible order. The equations in the Winter Adjustments beg explanation also. They are of the form: A=B(+/-)C. 'A' is the number of centers currently owned. 'B' is the number of units currently on the board. 'C' is the difference between the two: the number to be build to removed. 'Home' referse to the countries original centers. Centers in CAPITALS indicate that those centers were gained during the current year. Centers crossed out (ex. ~~4/4~~) indicate that those centers were lost during the current year. If you have any questions regarding my system of notation, please feel free to ask.
