Game ABA (1969?) which has its' Spring 1901 moves in this issue, has a feature in common with most games in 'zines which permit country choice; Austria was the least favored country. It was listed last a total of 12 times, and one player didn't even list it.

Let me agree that Austria is in an unenviable position. It is a centrally located nation, directly astride Italy's route to the Balkans and Turkey's route West.

Secondly, from the bing lists, Austria has a firm hold on last place for overall performance. I can remember that a year ago Germany was in last place yet now many players list Germany as their first choice.

Austria has now ((with the completion of game '67AC in Diplophobia)) won as many games as France. It has been eliminated eleven times more often than France, however But, let me lean on John McCallum, who supplied much of the information, and who says it so much better.

There is no doubt Austria is unopular, and there is little doubt why. Austria can almost always get a non-aggression pact with Germany, but if its other three neighbors gang up on it, it is going under in short order. However I must say I think that if it survives the very early period is chances are not as bleak as they are sometimes thought. Of the 61 games completed as I write this, here are the outcomes for the various countries, where W = win, T = Split Board Tie, D = Multi Player Draw, S = Other Survival, and E = elimination.

So, on games to date, Austria does distinctly better than Italy. And somewhat better than Germany: And if we compare it with France, just above it on the list ((This was written before the end of '67AC as John later noted)) on the basis of forces surviving at end of play, in cases of other survival, we

get the following table;

As can be seen, Austria does quite as well as France in the real contending survival cases. Where France does better is in having many more of the minor survivals in the 6-5-4-3 range. That is, for a player in a win, or a real try for a win, I don't that Austria is a worse choice than France. The chances of survival are lower, but the chances of real accomplishment are little worse. This certainly is the view of John Smythe, who has state-d that France is the worse possible country to play, and who has played Austria in zines which give players partial choice of country. That isn't to say that Austria was always John's first choice in those games, but it was presumably high on his preference lists. ((As a matter of fact, I will say that the least favored countries for myself, are Italy, England, and Turkey in that order. Germany and Austria may not be the front runners, but they are the most fun to play!))

While on the subject of Austria, let me extend congrats to Buddy Tretick on first win as Austria in 1967AC. Buddy needs no urging on future victories, he will doubtless take care of those himself.
