

Now, 4 3/4 years and between 100 and 110,000 xerox copies later, we reach #100. There have been about 8 others who got this far, but offhand, the only ones I can name are GRAUSTARK, RUNESTONE, FOL SI FIE, LIBERTERREAN, CLAW & FANG, and...I guess that's it. They are or were put out by John Boardman, John Leeder, Randolph Smyth, Jim Bumpas, and Don Horton. To that list we now get to add BRUTUS BULLETIN, Michalski. (Make that, "mih-HOLL-skee").

TRADITION has never been a big factor in BB, and in so keeping, #100 won't be much different from any of the others of late. I don't care to review the long and tiring history of the zine; I'm too lazy to dig much special out for you, although I do hope to have the issue a little lighter than just letters & games entirely; but as a sop to tradition, I will make the customary review of the state of the hobby as I see it from the bloodshot eyes of this publishing sage: To me, the hobby looks bigger and better than it ever was, and seems to be getting more so. I don't know about MOST interesting, but Brux thinks so, so that's something. (I won't say what though). You can get about 5 copies via thin paper and carbon, but toward the end, it gets pretty hazy. I used to use old Harper Oil forms with carbon and could get 6, setting the typer for "5-8 copies" setting, but the last two copies went to the 1-center players, and you could tell they were the last copies. Normal weight paper would make the third copy look pretty bad. Careful handwork would be OK for results; press, which often makes a dull game worthwhile, is where the hurt would come. The late BORN TO DIP and Palter's intermittent PINK DRAGON often had/have handwritten parts. With luck, twice over, 4 each time, would get a full 7 players plus file/reference copy. Tell people to submit 6 or 7 copies of their press, how about that?

Mining is the most dangerous. However, it, like the other professions you name, are just dangerous; no one, except for some cop jobs, faces another group that is out there specifically TRYING to kill you, and even the cops will retreat until they have the overwhelming weight advantage. Soldiers lack that ability. A cop or fireman can quit on the spot; a soldier who deserts under fire can be shot, and often will be right then and there.

I appreciate your honesty re serving/duty/etc. Even a reactionary like me would still permit you tht option of bugging out if you chose. However, you'd spend a long time in an unpleasant place if you snuck BACK, but... The duty aspect is why it should be a Universal male draft: to make it as fair as can be, and to minimize the resentment theat Berch brought up. If "everybody" was doing it, it might not even seem so bad to you. That's a risky speculation, though.

Your game views seem pretty decent—is there something wrong with me? Seriously, it might be interesting to compare your stance with that elaborated once in an old DW article by some big name (von Metski, Beyerlein, something like that) who wrote that your goals in any game should be "1. survive 2.draw, 3. win" in that order. I find the simple "gathering in of dots" to be difficult myself, especially in these damn slow monthlies. I enjoy the excitement and wide-ranging options of the early game best myself. I'd like to play a bunch of games just up to 04-06 as a 7-center or out, and then resign perhaps. Trouble is, then you get entangled. That 7 becomes 10, then maybe an 11, and then just when you think you've got it, the OTHER guy resigns, drops out, zine folds, whatever, and someone else wins, or you're stabbed and sink, or you watch Kathy get another CP or something like that. '01-03 are best, and in a FAST game; none of this Linsey 10-week stuff. I guess I'm more of a Panzer man than a footslogger in the muck of detail.))

After six months, the game was incorporated into Ray Heuer's FALLOVIA, still under Sacks as guest GM. When FALLOVIA folded, Sacks shepherded our game to Robert Lipton's MINUMAXU GAZZETTE, where it finally was played to its conclusion. Sacks has been in the hobby longer than I have (8 years), has guest-GMed numerous games in various 'zines, and has successfully rescued at least one orphan game.

It appears that Bruce Linsey and Bernie Oaklyn are in agreement concerning their attitude towards Boardman Numbers. Brux says that "... the institution is one of the most overrated in the hobby...", while Eernie says that HE doesn't need "...any reason—to split from the Boardman numbering system." He adds that "I, for one , don't' need that numbering system. So why am I to be taxed by those who do need numbering system (sic)? Huh!"

Marshfield, Wis. — Fifty-five is a safe speed indeed. Particularly when you're driving in place.

Wood County Deputy Sheriff Mark Gosh was patrolling Highway 13 just south of this central Wisconsin city two weeks ago when he came upon a van parked along the shoulder of the road. It was 3 a.m., the lights were on and the motor was running. Gosh decided to investigate.

He walked up to the driver's window and saw a motionless man draped over the steering wheel.

"I didn't know what was wrong with the guy," said Gosh, 29, who grew up near 70th St. and Hampton Ave. in Milwaukee. "First I knocked on

the window with my fist to try and get his attention. Then I rapped on it with my flashlight. He didn't budge."

Gosh said he walked around to the back of the van and, peering through a rear window, saw another figure sprawled on the floor. Then he checked all the doors. They were locked.

Gosh, who stands 6 feet 4 and weighs 225, returned to the driver's side. He put his hands on top of the van and began to rock it back and forth.

He recalled: "The van was moving enough so that the guy slipped off the wheel to his right. Just before he hit the front seat, the guy sat bolt up-

TILL OF RIGITS

- 1. Congress shall make no 'aw respecting the establishment of rifle ranges, pistol clubs, shooting societies, gun clubs, or any other such organization; or prohibiting the free use of guns; or abridging the freedom to shoot or to hunt; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble firearms collections, and to redress their grievances with guns.
- 2. A comfortable and well-regulated populace being necessary to the security of a responsible state, the levy by an individual, group, partnership, company, or governmental entity of any impost, toll, or turiff of any kind upon the use by the people of sanitary facilities in the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction is hereby forbidden.
- 3. Congress shall make no law prohibiting prayers in schools, or any other place, or abridging the freedom of reasonable speech or a responsible press; but speech shall be taken to mean sounds that come out of the people's mouths or, if provoked, their guns, and not strange and unnatural dress or hair, or cohabitation with persons of the same sex, or offensive or perverted gestures or behavior, or other things that cannot be heard and have to be seen to be believed, nor shall disrespectful silence or the display of badges, buttons, or alogans be held to be speech; but nothing herein shall be construed as limiting or abridging the right of the people to affix to the bumpers of their vehicles such signs and declarations as they may choose; and the press shall be held responsible for any smut or nasty things; nor shall any publisher insert any card in any periodical which shall fall upon the people's lap when it is opened.
- 4. Congress shall make no law abridging the freedom of speed by setting arbitrary limits thereon; or prohibiting turns to the right on a red light after a full stop; or preventing the removal of any buzzer or alarm in any vehicle or the installation of any device, electronic or otherwise, therein; or requiring any person to wear a belt, harness, helmet, or other encumbrance while in motion of any kind; or restricting the right of the people to assemble at the scene of an accident or disaster to acquaint themselves with the results; or depriving any person of leisure, mobility, or a license to drive, without due process of law.
- 5. No person who has been granted lawful entrance to an establishment which has on its premises an hors d'œuvre table, salad bar, or other assembly of comestibles shall be prevented from filling his plate therefrom as often as he shall choose, nor be made subject to any additional charge therefor, providing only that he shall have agreed to pay the full cost of an entree.
- No person receiving public monies of any kind for support or aid shall be quartered in a hotel or any other such lodging, with or without the consent of the owner.
- 7. The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, garages, cars, trailers, recreational vehicles, leisure homes, condominiums, papers, effects, belongings, and gun collections shall not be violated; nor shall they be required to seek permits to make additions or improvements upon their basements or attics or any place; nor shall any person enter therein for the purposes of inspection or assessment without their consent; nor shall they be required to enumerate their flush toilets or closets or any other thing therein, save only its occupants; and if anyone shall enter in or upon their property or vehicles without their consent they may in the first instance shoot, and then make inquiries.
- 8. After one year from the ratification of this article, the sale of containers with tops which require more than one motion to remove is hereby prohibited within the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction.
- 9. No person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime unless a police officer shall say that he did it; nor shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life and limb, except if his sentence be excessively lement or his acquittal be due to a technicality or be otherwise radiculous; nor shall he be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself and he shall be informed of his right to remain in confinement until he consents to do so; and if he shall be a witness against himself, he shall have the right to confront and cross-examine himself.

- 10. In all criminal prosecutions, the criminal shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial by a jury of not less than one person, whose verdict must be unanimous in all capital cases; and to be infarmed of the nature and cause of the accusation and of the lesser charge to which he may plead guilty, as well as of the maximum sentence he could receive should be be found guilty of the original charge, and to have compulsory process to obtain copies of his confession; and to have present at his trial a courtroom artist
- 11. No bail in excess of one hundred million dollars shall be required; nor any sentence longer than six thousand years imposed; and any cruel or unusual punishment inflicted must be televised.
- 12. In commerce with other nations, where the value of goods to be sold shall exceed twenty dollars, the duly elected officers of any company incorporated in the United States shall not be hindered from granting such emoluments as they may choose to foreign princes, citizens, or subjects to ensure the speedy success of their enterprises, and if they shall be questioned for it in any other place the right of perjury shall be preserved
- 13. No person shall be fined or otherwise held to account for stationing his vehicle at a broken inoperative meter; nor shall any vehicle be towed more than two hundred feet without its owner's consent; nor shall any fine be imposed for discarding litter in a public place which is more than ten times the value of the discarded litter.
- $14. \ \ No\ person\ shall\ be\ compelled\ for\ any\ reason\ or\ in\ any\ place\ to\ acquaint\ another\ with\ his\ mother's\ maiden\ name.$
- 15. No pregnancy may be terminated without the written consent of the fetus; nor may any person under the age of consent be struck or otherwise disciplined, except by his parents or with parental consent, or by a police officer having possible cause, or a teacher during regular school hours, or by an officer or employee of any institution into whose care or under whose control he has been given or placed, or a person or employee thereof onto whose property he has placed himself, or by a lawful rider on public or private transport, or by a citizen acting under provocation or having a particular purpose.
