Gamefee is \$2 plus sub, or \$3 withOUT sub for the 2-weeker, \$4 flat fee for the 10-Day Special #4. Adjudications are mailed to players on deadline day, and all press is printed as a rule.

Response to Gibson

((I think you're kind of going out on a limb by predicting 'many months of violence and chaos' to begin "by year's end". Personally, I think a little shaking up would be a good thing, but I think astrology is unadulterated bullshit. Still, even when these end-of-the-world predictions fail to come about, the dirge goes on. Doesn't really seem much different to me than the audacity of Tretick to apply for a GRAUSTARK game after Boardman's work in exposing and ejecting him.

On black press, you've hit on a sore point. Personally, I favor and promote black press, but recent excesses, primarily in 79lid, have instead produced embarrassment for me. In 77KS, my second game, it turned the game around early, and some of those who denounced it most, wrote and turned in the best. It was, for a while, a good deal more interesting than the game itself. Hopefully this will be the direction 79lid now takes under more stringent censorship. Most white press has always seemed exceptionally trite and bland; black press is at least more let-it-all-hang-out interesting.

I think you're wrong about CK. There is a lot of negotiating goes on over deadline, and the fast pace keeps interest up, unlike most monthlies about which you can plan, plot, negotiate, wait 2 to 5 weeks, forget, nmr, and whatnot. In these fast games, you just go,go,go. The main thing I use the phone for in mine is simply to learn the results faster, and from the 2 I'm running/have run, virtually all orders come in by mail, not phone (altho there was a VERY active period in late 79E where BOTH mail and calls were at a very high peak). The only real change I've seen is that all the hemming and hawing are discarded, and you get down to, and keep down to, the strict playing. Try one. \$4 to Jack Frost, jump in, play wild, and live it up before all that violence and chaos hit later on. You can be looking at 1904 before New Year's, while a crook (as you called him) (probably pretty darn close!) like Rowland probably won't PUBLISH but maybe once between now and Valentine's Day. (I'm in his 78AD, too dumb so far to resign).

Your straightforward remarks concerning genetic control date you. Such things smack of effectiveness, which flies in the face of modern liberal requirements that we create more ineffective bureaucracies to stifle all freedoms of decent people, while insuring total license for the deranged and deformed. In other times, the power of the State was used as an instrument of the people to knock the misfits into line, whether it be on the village or world scale; today, however, the power is used to shelter and encourage the flourishing of the deviant at the expense of the decent and normal, all under the euphemism of "equality". Kind Sir;

In my last letter I said "there exist no pressing need for American manpower that only a draft can fill".

You responded by attacking that premise. Your argument was that a voluntary enlistee is not willing or eager to obtain the kind of technical expertise that modern warfare requires of those who wage it. How you come to the conclusion that a draftee would be more eager to get that technical training than a volunteer is beyond me.

You say that "the manpower that is raised via volunteers is pretty dubious". Presumably by this you mean that the volunteers the armed forces are currently getting are inferior in intelligence and education than the armed forces would get under a draft. That is a dubious premise. If you'll examine the record, you'll see that the number of Category II and III recruits have risen drastically since the end of the draft, and that the proportion of Category IV recruits has dropped drastically. The number of Category I recruits has remained about the same or dropped slightly; but you don't actually want Category I people as recruits (by and large)---you want them in the officer corps.

Consequently, the intelligence and education of the armed forces, on average, has RISEN since the end of the draft.

Yes, you need "decent people" to run a modern, technological military. And our armed forces are getting them under the All Volunteer Force. Whether you would get more "decent people" under a draft is dubious, unless you decided to draft only intelligent and educated people (which isn't likely to be a popular move).

You say: "We must 'stoop' to coercion and the like in order to stave off becoming slaves to systems far worse than the 'oppressive coercion' the draft represents in our own system." This is, in fact, a succinct analysis of why a wartime draft is justifiable. Under the current circumstances, in which the armed forces are getting the number and quality of personnel they need, this is not a justification of a peace-time draft.

Re Oaklyn/Tretick: It seems to me the position of any responsible GM is clear. I am selling a service; anyone who's willing to put up the money and abide by my rules can join my games. But at the first sign of misconduct in any of my games, I'll throw the culprit out. I would, of course, accept Oaklyn/Tretick, or Adolf Hitler, for that matter, as a player in my zine; but any violation of my house rules or the rules of Diplomacy would be sufficient reason to expell him.

Also; I am currently running a game which consists of nothing but people from the DC area. None of them are Oaklyn/Tretick (at least to my knowledge). Yes, there are lots of players from the DC area; and it's silly to force them to produce proof of existence. I have been playing in Bernie's gamezine since its first game started in February 1970 (Bernie started publishing in October 1977). During that time, I have seen no more gamemaster errors in his games than in any other gamezine I have been playing in.

If he does indeed play three powers in his own game, 1978 AY, as some persons seem to be saying lately, and can't do any better than they have, then he needs that advantage and should have it in all of his games.

However, I have received letters from each of those three players that Bernie is supposed to be, and feel strongly that they are the three separate persons they claim to be, Diplomacy players in their own right.

Publishing a Dippy Zine is not my idea of a profitable venture, considering the time spent--nor are the game fees that Bernie charges large enough for anyone to consider it worthwhile attempting to milk the hobby that way but apparently there are those who are worried about just such a possibility. (I have had one Zine touted in Diplomacy World to fold and disappear with my money and game fees but no hue and cry has reached my ears on that one--it is a small risk and one which we are all exposed to when we subscribe to a new Zine--or even to an old established one--there are rarely any safeguards.)

Some folks may be more open to risk taking than others and perhaps that would be reflected in the style of play seen in a new Zine--but that's another subject. To provide a cushion for those who don't like risks and in order to have a degree of security not normally found in other Zines, I have agreed to hold funds in escrow for Bernie to guarantee the performance of his Zine. Bernie has sent \$50.00 in the form of a Bank Cashier's Draft to me to hold so players would have some assurance of a degree of security in an otherwise insecure world. These funds will be used to continue games in progress and to provide refunds to subscribers should Bernie's Zine come to an untimely end.

Dear Mr. H.D. Bassett,

Thank you for a copy of your recent open letter.

I am sorry to hear that a zine, touted in DW, folded on you. Please remember that being touted in DW does not "strengthen" a zine. Nor are its editor's somehow prominent. DW, as, after all, just a zine, published by a human being. But I know how much this hurts. In the first issue of my own zine, I praised a zine which had been quite regular, and whose GM I knew quite well. Yet it folded on me, a move which killed all the games but one (the one that I was in, which was saved only as a result of a bitter struggle on my part to free the game from the wreckage of the zine).

Having a third party hold a security deposit is a fine idea. Indeed, not-fully-established-zines (which by hobby experience is less than 2 years old) are often handicapped by the fact that others do not trust them yet. Yours is a fine plan for helping such a zine.

Moreover, this is not really the issue with Oaklyn and F.H. While it is true that Tretick was probably the only publisher in dippy history to start new games even as he was folding old ones, the furor about Oaklyn has nothing to do with whether he might fold all his games. Anyone might do that.

Similarly, it's not the issue whether or not Alan, Andrews, and Edwards are "separate persons". I have not the slightest doubt that they are, and I have never seen any evidence to the contrary.

What is the issue is GM integrity. It is the very cornerstone on which the postal hobby is built, and is an indispensable feature. This is because the GM has almost unlimited power --- and no one peering over his shoulder. It is absolutely essential that the players be able to trust the GM. That means that all players must be treated exactly the same. If there is some special relationship between players that the GM is aware of, all must be informed. The GM must in no way participate in the actual play of the game. Sadly, Oaklyn just doesn't believe in these rules apply to him. Let's get down to specifics.

Jack Frost has stated that material from Steven Andrews and Brian Edwards "all have the same typewriter and scrawl used by Buddy-Bernie". When I accused Bernie of being these persons he said they were kids that he had to help with their mail. IF this is true, then Oaklyn's conduct is totally unacceptable. I do not know how long you have been in the postal hobby, but I assure you that my experience postal GM will tell you that for a GM to write a letter for a player in his game is unthinkable. If such a thing happened in one of my games, I would immediately move to have it transferred, and if that failed I would resign, regardless of my position on the board.

Second, there is the matter of his GMing a game containing his own son. This violates the notion that all players be of equal standing. It just isn't going to work that way with father and son. We are talking about people, not robots. Let me illustrate with an incident recounted to me at this year's DIXCON by Lee Kender, Sr. It seemed that Bernie was about to NMR in one of Lee's variants, so Lee put in a call. Bernie wasn't home, but James Alan was there. When Lee expressed disappointment, James pressed him to give the game number, and Alan could give him the orders, as he had access to Bernie's files. When Lee asked about the games in which Lee was the GM, and James was the player, James said that he just didn't look at those.

Sure. You can believe that if you like; it doesn't matter. The point here is that for a son to have access to his father's house, and what's in it, is perfectly natural. For a player to be able to see a GM's files is just not acceptable.

Third, there is the matter of the fact that, at least ~~James Alan~~ Steven Andrews and James Alan lived at the same address. Bernie obscured this fact by having Steven pick up his mail at the Cooper address. Any game with two people at the same address would be considered irregular. For a GM to hide this fact from the other players is just plain dishonest.

I assume that you are familiar with the details of most of the above, having received DD #23 and #24.

In your note at the end, you made reference to some "further investigations." I suggest the following agenda, to add to whatever other items you are considering:

1. The Frost Charges, mentioned above
2. See if you can get some positive identification out of Oaklyn that he really is who he says he is, and that his continued stories about Tretick being in Oak Ridge are not just more lies. I have not succeeded in getting any proof out of him.
3. Write Don Horton, 16 Jordan Court Sacramento Calif 95826 to get the story about why Oaklyn is no longer a guest GM in Clay and Yang.

You say that "I believe in second chances." So do I. But Tretick has had his second chance, as Oaklyn, and he has blown it. The way I was misled, when you made a mistake, and wish to change, the first thing you must do is admit to yourself that you have made the mistake. Then you resolve not to repeat it. I see absolutely no sign of this in Oaklyn. When as Tretick, he was heavily criticized for putting his own son in his games, and for interfering in the operation of his games. The exact same charges are now valid against Oaklyn. Three of his first four games have Alan in them as a player. And he just does not seem to be interested in stopping this process of deception. For example, he has recently invented a tale that Tretick was a president of the IDA. More lies. In this regard, I have enclosed copies of my recent correspondence with Oaklyn, for your perusal.

Finally, back to your \$50 deposit idea. I truly regret to say that I personally do not approve. The reason is quite simple. Such a plan may tend to entice new players to play in F.H. So far as I am concerned, this would be very undesirable. Tretick/Oaklyn is a dishonest and unethical GM, and I am opposed to anything that will help him fill more games. I hope that you will reconsider your activities in this regard.

4. Is LE FRONT...worth getting? Not really. Even if "Goslyn" were real, I would not recommend his 'zine to a novice, and to anyone else. Physically, it is a good product, yet the design work is well done. But the content is all but unreadable. Trickett's writing style has always been labored and hyperbolic to the point of silliness. He is like a little boy who has just discovered big words but hasn't the slightest idea how to use them. The result is virtually unreadable, especially for anyone who has the slightest regard for English composition. As a professional writer, I always become ill at ease reading anything that pretends to be serious. Nor is the content any

I do not see how the constant belaboring of the obvious can be of any help to anybody. A player, novice or otherwise, really needs to read more informative and sophisticated stuff than Tretick writes. There are numbers of infinitely better outlets to play in...CLAW & FANG, GRAUSTARK, POL SI FIF, THE DRAGON AND THE LAMB, WHY MET, RUMITANIA, and so on. Information in general about the game is available there as well as in DIPLOMACY WORLD, DIPLOMACY DIGEST, and my own Game's Guide to DIPLOMACY (which Avalon Hill will be happy to sell you for \$3.75).

Frankly, I would not play in Tretick's 'zine (if I played postal games, which I don't these days) if somebody paid me to do it. If I wanted to join a postal game, I would immediately go to GRAUSTARK or CLAW & FANG or BOUTUS BULLETIN. I see no reason why any player should have to put up with the sort of drivel Tretick writes when he can be assured of a well-run game and something half-way intelligent to read elsewhere.

Final note: Back to Tretick's love of the lie. One of his best is how "Oaklyn" met Tretick, which he has just perpetrated again in in DIPLOMACY WORLD. I have in my possession a card from Tom Miller in which Don states (a) he never heard of "Oaklyn" and (b) in any event would never have introduced him to Tretick. If "Oaklyn" is the real thing, and if there is no hoax going on, why is it necessary for him to lie about how he met Tretick? Answer: that one, Eric, before you pledge any money to his support.

Thanks for the warning about "Oaklyn" and for the collection of evidence concerning the Oaklyn/Tretick thing. I had long since determined to my own satisfaction that Oaklyn was an incompetent and unethical GM. Understand that at the time I was totally unaware of any of the Oaklyn/Tretick controversy. Here are some of the reasons for my conclusions.

Oaklyn has repeatedly reported my moves incorrectly in FLD (I am France in his 1978WW). In subsequent seasons, moves continue from a position that would have been reached by the moves that I actually submitted, not the moves reported in FLD. There is ample evidence that this has been the case with the moves of other players in 1978WW.

James Alan came into 1978WW as Russia (standby). The first couple of seasons after his entering the game, Alan made some moves that suggest strongly that he had knowledge of his opponents' moves. I remarked to the Italy and Germany players (Dwayne Shreve and Charles Price, respectively) that I thought there was a good chance that Oaklyn was making Alan's moves.

There are numerous other little incidents that have no significance on their own, but collectively they generate a feeling for what is going on. I have for quite some time now been calling Oaklyn just about anything except Biddy Tretick.

For what it's worth, Oaklyn contacted me after John Boardman gave my name in Graustark as having inquired about postal diplomacy. Oaklyn is the only GM who contacted me. Boardman had just closed entry to his games and I was interested in playing another, so... I hope that responsible representatives of the hobby will make knowledge of such as Oaklyn available to newcomers.

Again, thanks for the collection of Oaklyn/Tretick info. It has been very interesting reading, and collectively is rather conclusive evidence that Oaklyn is far from what and who he represents himself as.

PS More of my babbling—another little shred of "evidence". "Oaklyn" does not hesitate to offer "proof" when he can prove something. As I mentioned in the enclosed letter, Oaklyn repeatedly reported my moves incorrectly in FLD. Each time, I wrote to him, calling to his attention that the moves he reported were not the moves I had sent to him. I never received a reply to these notices—until the one time the moves really were the moves I had submitted—and had recorded incorrectly in my records. Oaklyn did not hesitate to send a xerox copy of the moves that he received from me (along with some derogatory remarks on my character—which should prove that I am not Oaklyn, one of his pseudonyms, proteges, sons, etc.—besides, I have a birth certificate, etc.). If you see any use for adding any of this to your "evidence" collection—feel free to do so.

AN OPEN LETTER TO JOHN BOARDMAN

Dear John:

If you expect Tretick to sign your "admission" letter, you are more a fool than I had thought. You should know, as I know, that he will persist in the "Oaklyn" charade to the bitter end. The enormous commitment he has made to this hoax, not to mention his own peculiar personality, renders that course necessary for him.

Naturally it would be better if Tretick owned up, but in essence he is trying to escape his past. He ought to know that the hobby can be quite forgiving of one's past mistakes if one admits them...after all, nobody warns people away from GRAUSTARK because you used the "Eric Blake" pseudonym to win 1966C by playing two positions. And if Conrad von Metzke or I were to resume publishing, each of us would be the first to point out... "look, I have this tendency to drop...". So long as potential players are properly warned of any risk they might be taking, I doubt any wrong is being done. In any event, I doubt anybody would start up games and then disappear simply to con people out of money. There isn't that much involved...and considering the sheer bulk of LE FRONT..., it appears Tretick is putting out more than he's taking in.

But if the publisher himself will not warn prospective players, then perhaps it is right for the hobby itself to do so. Hence the so-called "hate mail", I suppose. But such things can go too far. I do not believe that Tretick will necessarily default on this second occasion. Danger signs there are, yes. But knowing that he is a neurotic personality, it may be that we are putting him under more strain than is strictly necessary. Your snide insinuations that he intends to rip people off (and that, at least, is certainly not true) are not helping.

I can think of better reasons for warning people off LE FRONT.... For one thing, there are many better GMs and 'zines, not the least of which are yourself and GRAU. For another, plowing through the drivel in LE FRONT... is a pain.

I would like to suggest, therefore, that if any letters are being sent to players to warn them off Tretick, they be mildly worded. It is enough to recall Tretick's past history, to show that "Oaklyn" is Tretick, and to suggest that the potential risk be avoided...and to mention the many better alternatives that exist. It should also be suggested to Tretick that if he comes clean and warns potential players himself, that the hobby would be glad to assist him in his efforts to reestablish himself. That would be a fair and considerate position for all concerned.

AN EDITORIAL

The Military Balance 1979-80

EACH year, in early September, the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London publishes "The Military Balance" for the current and coming years. Through an exclusive arrangement with IISS, AIR FORCE Magazine has reprinted the Institute report in our December issue for the past eight years. We will publish it again in December 1979.

The Institute, as most of our readers know, is an independent center for research in defense-related areas and is universally recognized as the leading authority in its field. Its reputation has been built on adherence to cold facts and, where judgments are made, on cautious conservatism. To paraphrase a TV commercial, when IISS speaks, people listen.

In the past, we have reserved comment on "The Balance" until it appeared in AIR FORCE Magazine. Because of some unusually significant reporting and analysis, we are breaking that precedent.

The Institute reports this year that in the strategic area, "the capabilities of the Super-Powers will continue to increase despite SALT II, if asymmetrically. On the Soviet side, older land-based missiles are being replaced by more accurate systems carrying greater numbers of warheads. Extrapolation of this trend will create a theoretical vulnerability of US land-based systems by the mid-1980s which greater hardening cannot redress. . . . Given the time lag inherent in the production and deployment of new strategic systems and the new constraints introduced by SALT II, it will be eight to ten years before the US could again restore a degree of invulnerability to their land-based deterrent forces. . . ."

That means the deterrent value of US strategic forces will be pretty much limited—by 1982, we believe—to preventing an attack on the US itself. This unwelcome wind of change will have turned inside out the nuclear umbrella that has protected US allies and external interests. That leads to another significant IISS judgment.

Until this year, it generally has been accepted that the US had some 7,000 tactical nuclear weapons in Europe, compared to about 3,500 for the USSR—an apparently comfortable margin that should give the Kremlin long thoughts about starting trouble in Europe (or other theaters, for that matter) or about first use of nukes if a conventional war were launched.

Now the Institute finds that instead of the rough parity reported in our March 1979 issue (p. 47), "there currently exists a 25% advantage to the Warsaw Pact in terms of *deliverable* [our emphasis] warheads likely to be deployed in a European conflict and a moderate 13% advantage to the Warsaw Pact in terms of the effectiveness of those warheads when measured against the three parameters of survivability, assurance of penetration, and flexibility. . . . We note that this balance is

sustained by American central systems (*Poseidon* SLBMs) allocated to SACEUR for Europe's defense but counted in SALT. If these central systems are removed from the equation, the Warsaw Pact advantage rises to almost 60% in both numbers and effectiveness. Continued deployment of SS-20 intermediate-range ballistic missiles . . . will alter the balance substantially in favor of the Warsaw Pact if NATO's Theater Nuclear Forces are not increased or modernized or both."

It follows from this that if US strategic and theater nuclear forces are both neutralized, potential conflict between the superpowers or their alliances is most likely to be at the conventional level, where the USSR has an advantage in military manpower and a wide quantitative lead in offensive equipment.

For example, the USSR's inventory of tanks, according to "The Balance," stands at about 50,000, compared to 10,500 for the US, and the Soviet Navy continues to emphasize amphibious ships and attack submarines. Finally, the Soviet Union is stockpiling (our term) large quantities of up-to-date military equipment in such strategic locations as Libya, South Yemen, Ethiopia, and Vietnam along the West's oil and raw materials supply routes.

From this evidence and a great deal more comparative data in the new "Military Balance," we find strong support for our belief that the USSR is implementing a carefully integrated global strategy, elements of which claim fleeting public attention but which, as a unified strategy, has been obscured by the shadows of détente, oil, and inflation.

In ten years, the USSR has moved patiently, step by step, from strategic inferiority to parity-plus, headed for superiority; from gross inferiority in theater nuclear forces to parity-plus, headed for superiority; from parity in conventional forces to superiority; and from a land-locked continental nation to a global presence, headed for global hegemony. "Hair by hair," as the Russian proverb goes, "you can pluck the whole beard."

This outbound passage from military inferiority has cost the Soviet people dearly—from eleven to fifteen percent of each year's gross national product. But the Kremlin's goal of world domination has been judged by the few who rule to be worth the sacrifices of the many who serve.

The relative decline of Western power is not likely to be reversed by anything short of heroic measures. We do not see such measures in the immediate offing, but there is a growing grass-roots recognition—at least in this country—that all is not well. That's a first step. If the people will tell their leader where they want to go, perhaps the leader will lead them.

If you need to blow your nose, it is only according to the schedule put out in the latest **FEDERAL REGISTER**.

Next, the quote from Anderson. Jack has his place, as he often exposes things that ought to be exposed. Unfortunately, he has a daily column to put out as well, so when there are no legitimate exposés to run that day, well, put in something that sort of LOOKS like it. This item you quote is a good example: a nice exciting piece on the face of it, one that panders to the ignorance and prejudices of the public, but one which sadly fails upon a little thought. To wit: Do you remember when milk used to come in glass bottles? (Probably not, but it will seem recent to your parents). Anyhow, take their word or mine for it, it did. It is more fun to imply as he does, that the "Big bad oil companies" are out to screw you tomorrow just like today; in fact, they, like any good Diplomacy player, are looking beyond the next season, and are doing all they can to be sure they're around 2 and 3 decades down the line. If they're switching to solar, coal, and atomic businesses, so what? Would you rather the GOVERNMENT get into it? Who else can afford to?

Now, don't get me wrong. I'm a consumer too, driving a 13 mpg Thunderbird 21 miles to work and 21 miles BACK each day.
