Send the latter to Jack Frost, RR 4 Box 138-B, Lockport, IL 60441. The New BRUTUS BULLETIN specializes in FAST games, black press, and all the letters and filler I can pack into the 2 oz limit. Contributions of all kinds are welcome, especially with my 50th issue coming up next time around; anything that will xerox is fine.

THIS ISSUE is basically my second anniversary issue, as it was the latter part of November, 1977, that saw the start of this project, and I think it will be mailed out then. On the other hand, at the rate people keep writing me interesting to outrageous letters, #50 may be my second annish. The only thing that may hold this one up until that time was my promise in #48 to give you a three-week break from finding still another BB in your mailbox. I know I publish twice as fast as a lot, but if I put out 3 to some others 1, I'd feel embarrassed. Also, publishing fast makes me feel bad. I send out a lot, so then I think, 'Gee, I haven't seen a TORONTO TELEGRAM or MURDRIN MINISTERS or EGGNOG or DRAGON & LAMB or BEHOLDER or (whatever) in quite a while', when really they're not late at all. I'm just early.

LEAD-INS in recent issues, in case they make no sense to you, come from dialogue segments from STAR WARS. If you don't understand them, write Tony Watson of RURITANIA (201 Minnesota St, Las Vegas, NV 89107) who can help you. He has seen STAR WARS more than half again as many times as me, 23 to 14, so far. (It will no doubt be rereleased as a lead in to THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK, "coming to your galaxy, next summer".) Our scores may change then.

CAVEAT EMPTOR III: Bill LaFosse and Dan Palter (so far) have made the point that perhaps the new GM mentioned in an earlier warning was going by the old 1961 rules or something like that, as that rule was once worded just as his inquiry implied. Dan writes "A fair number of us here had our games turned upside down when we found out it didn't". Fair enough.

Speaking of new GM's, yet another new zine has appeared in the mailbox, this one called EMHAIN MACHA, published by Michael Mills, 3457 Makyes Road, Nedrow, NY 13120. Gamefee \$2 plus \$1 refundable, subs 6 for \$2.50 (42¢) or 12 for \$4.80 (40¢). Accepts preference lists, and hopes to group players according to their experience under a complicated system of ranking and classes. I doubt that will last in its present form for very long at all, as there are not all that many players seeking entries with so many openings as the hobby currently has, and his points system considers your old results in wipeout games as well as win/draws, and I for one forget those promptly and

couldn't tell you my losses if you paid me. In fact, I probably couldn't tell you all the DRAWS I've figured in, though I hope I could remember most. And how many total games? Forget it. While I'm on the subject, I should mention that I really disagree with the whole idea of ranking in any case. While "all-novice" games are a nice feature sometimes, what do they gain from that? Seven players who don't know what they're doing? You LEARN from your mistakes and successes, and the best way to learn is by jumping in with the best and the worst, the honest and the "Oaklyn"s, and trying your wings. To play among other novices is a waste of time. What can you learn from an error, or even a VICTORY there? But I digress.

Back to EMHAIN MACHA (brother of Chewbacca?). Repro is good, 5 sheets, 10 pages, contains articles, house rules, editorial notes, and a "Subscription Application and Game Entry Form". First time I ever saw someone ask you to apply for a sub, but I guess EM will have high standards. Mike also promises to refund your sub fee if EM folds during your sub.

CORRECTIONS to last issue: It turns out that Dave Pilant is French (+German, but apparently Pilant is French) when for some reason I could have sworn it was Irish by an earlier statement. Also, Curtis Gibson points out that I misread one of his "K.+B." as "K.B.", and typed up "Konrad Baumeister" when it should have read "Kemper + Blevins". See his letter within for details. Apologies to one and all.

FRED DAVIS, Ombudsman and Acting IDA President, reports the following are either candidates or nominees in the latest COUNCIL COURIER for IDA offices for 1980 elections: Eric Verheiden, Treasurer; Scott Marley (UTOPIA), Periodicals Editor; Victor Ricci, Special Projects; Cal White, Canadian Representative; and suggested are Konrad Baumeister for Ombudsman, Rod Walker for US Representative. I have asked for the current results of the ongoing presidential election of theirs, but apparently nothing is settled or available yet. I'll let you know as soon as there is any news.

NYC MINUS TEN-The Democrats approach a 2½ candidate race

OK folks and sheep-its now all out in the open. Kennedy is running. Carter's collapse has apparently hit bottom. Brown is off in the fringes. Now the fun begins.(1) Kennedy did a lot better in Florida than the news indicated. In one of Carter's best states, with a bozo amateur effort going against some fairly bright pros he came within a few hundred votes of stealing the whole thing.(2) This is more a reflection of Kennedy's star quality and Carter's popularity than a barometer of the race.(3) Don't follow the media in counting Brown out quite so fast; he's at this point but that could change fast.

I. Kennedy-his flaws are obvious-personal life, personal morals (girlfriends, wife, MaryJo etc), lack of accomplishments in the Senate, liberal record (even he said that he'd love to run against his record), lack of any real policy differences with Carter, poor speaking voice and style. However he is a media star. He's got the media in his camp. Also the primary schedule works in his favor. New England where he's strong comes first. If the southern primaries had been first up it would be a lot harder. His strategy has got to be as follows. Sweep New England huge, run a respectable second in the southern primary bloc (Florida, Georgia, Alabama) and then polish Jimmy off up north in Illinois, Wisconsin, New York, and Pennsylvania where the media, liberals and Catholics combined can give him a knockout. If it goes beyond this the nomination could be worthless for him even if he won. He cannot afford a blanket Protestant defection to the GOP in November- the south plus the west forces virtually a sweep in the industrial states for a demo win.

II. Carter-he's beginning the writeoff of the early primaries. Carter's the challenger here regardless of who holds the White House. His strategy has gotta be a variation on Ford in 76-go the distance-take your delegates where you find them-rub the luster off the challenger while avoiding the wipeout. Its not likely to work but its like having a 14 center power in Dippy; even if the board stabs you, you go down slowly.

III. Brown-he's a better campaigner than anyone's giving him credit for. If the race began with NY&PA that wouldn't matter-he'd be swamped by \$ and organization. But it begins in Iowa and NH-small states that can be barnstormed. Jerry's key is (A)his dedicated cadre of organizers, supporters from the antiNuke movement & (B)the Muskie syndrome-Kennedy doesn't jsut have to win; he has to win BIG. A 40-35-25 finish in NH could probably finish Ted before he started. Brown's got to run strong seconds and wait for Carter to fold. If Brown and Carter between them have a majority Brown could be in the nominee in a true suicide spite finish.

IV. The Oswald Factor--there I've said it. Right now every borderline psychotic in the US and Canada is out oiling his 30-30 waiting for the safe commuting distance. I'm not wishing this on the man but it is a factor in the campaign that we've got as a frontrunner of our largest party the biggest clay pigeon in presidential history. If he goes, who is helped--Brown on the emotional level--Carter's the enemy. Carter on the logical level--the Kennedy people fear and distrust Brown--indeed, Jerry's fast start was one of the key pressures forcing Kennedy out this early. Likely if the bullet comes early enough in the primary season, you'll see everyone and his brother become a favorite son while waiting for lightning to strike. If it's late, there may be a standard bear anointed by the family--Schreiver or Carey seem most likely.

I am dismayed to see all the slips of the typer which I made in my letter. I tend to write in first-and-only draft, and I seem not to be the world's most careful proofreader. But I assure you that I do know the difference between "idea" and "ideal".

This brings us, by a natural association of ideas, to Margaret Gemignani's letter. "Frogendra" is a favorite spelling of hers; I've encountered it elsewhere. The first Graustark game was intended to be a joke and was used as filler for a degenerate amateur press mailing. If he had known how much money he could get for it, he would have waited for bigger game fees and let someone else publish the first game.

The second Graustark^{game} did not begin until after a half dozen honest gamesmasters had started games. At that point, Boardman should have disappeared from the hobby, but, very sadly, he saw how much money he could make out of it and has continued to publish, always for a substantial profit, of course. Boardman was never capable of being the father of any-thing.

BOARDMAN LOVES FRAUD

Alan Calhammer, the inventor of the game, and one or two other innocent players entered the 2nd postal game (in the original Ruritania published by Dave McDaniel a.k.a. Seafood at Fisherman's Wharf is invariably overpriced and mediocre in quality. The food in Chinatown is usually Cantonese (not really suitable for a person raised on more meaty fare) and is also less than outstanding. In fact, I think the best value in a Chinese restaurant is about ten blocks down the street from my apartment, not even close to Chinatown! I see that 79E isn't in the recent issues of BB, so I guess it ended early, in a win for Frost-Austria ((right)) whom Uli Baumeister was so sure couldn't get either. Frost is a veteran of GRAUSTARK games, where much of the highest quality play in the hobby has been going on for years. I watched some of them (Frost's) back in early '76 when I entered my first, in GRAUSTARK, 1976BV. I played Germany, lasting 10 years, constantly fighting Russia, and part time every power but France. Some of my best friends have been Germans, and are still, even arrogant ones. I know they can't help being that way, and always make allowances for anyone's background. It's a wolf race, and there are all kinds of wolves, but they all lick, and all are predatory too. If you can keep one from getting too hungry, it may not eat you. Even the German shepherd dog is often wolfish. Those whose eyes are not deep brown are most dangerous. A whiff of blood on you and they may automatically turn killer before they can stop to think! I wouldn't have any dog around, but only a fool would want one of those, or one of those harebrained Dobermans.

((I know you'd prefer I print these without retyping, and as a rule, I will; however, because of your comments, I want to send a copy of this to the mother of an old friend whose ideas about Germans are remarkably like yours. Years ago, when I was in high school and college in Milwaukee, her son and I would sit around arguing with her many a time, and I'm sure she 'll be interested in the above. Her son and I, all pure Polish all the way back 4 generations, were keen on military history ca. WWII, which of course is basically all Germany. Thus we seemed to be on the 'enemy' side, which made for many an amusing and entertaining shouting match. (More amusing now in retrospect than then in fact, though). I do remember her opinions of Germans, though, and so I've taken the liberty of retyping your letter for easier perusal by one not used to it.

Frost won in fall, 1908, due to an unexpected taking of Rome, and Uli survived by being able to retreat to Norway that Germany vacated by an unexpectedly successful order of F Nwy-NWG that had been meant only to cut a support. That was my first 10-day-deadline special, and was a lot of fun to GM.

I know a lot of people in the audience look to your letters just as a source of wild and nutty stuff, or humorous for some reason or other, but something odd comes to mind with regard to all this 'wolf' stuff. Some author once mentioned how Hitler seemed to have something about Wolves: all his HQs were so named ("Wolfschance", "Wolf-schultz" etc.) and in his beggar days, he used the alias "Herr Wolf" on occasion. Odd coincidence.))

Creek Barbecue Club is located on land owned by former Grand Prairie, Tex., mayor Curt Wagoner, and its membership includes a number of prominent Dallas County politicians, two county commissioners and several judges.

Remember the \$145,000 U.S. Department of Interior grant to install a wave-making machine in a specially designed double Olympic-sized pool in Salt Lake City, Utah [Bureaucratic Blunders, April 1979 CD]? Believe it or not, the DOI bureaucrat who awarded the grant indignantly claims that the Interior Department did not waste tax dollars because the money for this gadget did not come from the taxpayers but was paid out of revenues received by the Treasury under the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act! Law Enforcement Assistance Administration regulations are requiring that Lincoln County, W. Va.'s new jail have individual, carpeted rooms for each prisoner, each with outside windows with a view. And there can be no bars on the outside windows. Vandal-proof plumbing, regarded as essential in most jails, also cannot be installed under the federal rules. The open design of the jail—large recreation areas are required—also will require the hiring of at least four additional full-time deputies at a cost of about \$48,000 a year over the present payroll.
