Admittedly they risk missing the thrills of stabbing which are the breath of life for these pitiful upset punks. Admittedly their alliances endanger the ambitions of many a compulsive thug (in Dippy clothing). Yes, the sublime cause of perfidity may end in shambles, even oblivion, if their example really catches on and pervades the hobby with "loyalty ever". I even see signs that ((another player)) is in danger of being swallowed up in their fraternity now. Who'll be next? Tragedy looms over the hobby like a thunderhead!(I'd love to be).

Maybe one should add, harmony in politics, hobby or national or both, but that could come under the general area of 'personalities', or 'extra-gaming considerations'.

Now look again at these four bases for ally preference, and think them over carefully. They are all factors of merit, not the whimsy that novices base alliance on. And this is all aside from factors of old scores to settle, which may take precedence, and needs to if dealing with unrepentant rascals. And Kelly & Verheiden would find only 10% of players strong in more than 2 of the 4 areas, and only 1% strong in all 4. So when they encounter each other in a game, wouldn't they be fools not to ally? (Both strong in all 4)

Furthermore, altho Kelly is too loaded (60-70 games usually) to be a keen cooperator in the normal sense, most players don't realize and don't enjoy allinace with him as he seldom writes. So, when he finds himself with E.V., who understands perfectly and is able to suggest the plans that he knows Ron would approve of (usually), there's another reason why he'd be a fool not to welcome the chance to get a GOOD ally! Berch knows all this, so I can't see why he made such stupid comments. Maybe just an urge to court popularity when he feels an anti-true-blue wind is prevailing. He ought to be ashamed. If he was an average, half-informed Dippie, it would be excusable.

Well, the above wasn't really meant for you at all, John, just for any readers dumb enough to like what Berch had said, or duped by the 1977,8 &9 wave of silly anti-cross-gaming opinions that have been fouling up the hobby. The only thing wrong wiht cross gaming is that if your ally isn't a true blue, he'll likely stab you ~~somehow~~ sooner or later, and in all your games if possible. That is why loyalty is No 1 of all 4 bases for ally preference, and then enough competence so both allies can agree on aims & plans.

Was very impressed by Brutus Bulletin #55-56. What was best about it was, of course, the change in policy. The "print everything" policy was not getting you anywhere, I feel, since it damaged your own integrity almost as much as it did that of John Boardman and others. Some of yhat stuff does reflect back on the guy that prints it, too. In any case, ghe over-all positive attitude of this last double-issue saved the day for your 'zine and my subscription. Perhaps some comments are in order. (Remember that whenever I comment it's bound to be negative because just not commenting is usually considered positive; if everything's fine, why say anything else?)

Lee Kendter will do a great job with the numbers, I feel. I wasn't as impressed with the job the Agostas did as much of the rest of the hobby was, I'm afraid. While Bernie kept on numbering games every so often, she only produced one issue of Everything...without which the numbers are pretty worthless. Lee has assured me that his first issue is soon to come out, and I know that he's been working a great deal on the stuff Bernie gave him. I'm sure he'll be the best we've had since Doug Beyerlein...and may last almost as long...it's a hell of a tough job. (It's always easy to criticize until you try to do better yourself.)

Actually, I don't have six brothers...I have seven. However, they are rapidly fanning out across this country of ours, with the eldest just having moved to Chicago, and others currently living in places such as Wahington. Of course, many are now married (been a lot of that lately), and are rapidly losing interest in Diplomacy. It's been a long time since I've had more than two of them help me put out EGGNOG, that's for sure! (They have this habit of disappearing and not answering the phone...) I only have one brother younger than me, and he's getting into the game a bit more these days...

As for Curtis Gibson vs. half of the Diplomacy community (give him time, give him time...), I guess that Kelley and others are catching on to what I've been saying for years...that having Gibson subscribe to your 'zine is a sure-fire way of having some of the games ruined by his interference. Even you, John, run that risk; Gibby himself admits that the games in your 'zine are what he looks forward to the most. When you consider it carefully, or even not so carefully, the only reason for that is that he would want to involve himself in them. Nobody else stares at your games just for the hell of it, and pays his subscription price for it!! And, as Bob Sergeant said in the letter column of my latest EGGNOG, there is more cause for kicking Gibson out of the hobby than Tretick...Tretick can only screw the games he himself is involved in, while Gibson can foul up any given game he sees in a 'zine. It's something to think about....

Thanks for the kind review of EGGNOG in 'zines received. I try. I have not seen anything from Marley in some months now, so I don't know what's what with him. I assume that I'll hear from him soon, but who knows?

I am now, as I have always been, of the opinion of Randolph Smyth regarding making orders conditional upon whom you have been negotiating with. What is the point of making plans with a standby when you can't use them until one season after they're useful? Remember when I made such orders in an old Brutus Bulletin game? Remember the stink you made when you wrote me back about it?

You didn't answer Mills' question about "worn out cliches." I was wondering about that too.

As for automobiles, I have mentioned what I like to drive in past EGGNOGs; that Firebird. That was in the days when even American cars were made to last (1967) -- mine is still with it, though I've done a good deal of repairing/replacing/pampering. Still, it's parked outside during the

Winter, and you know what kind of winter we have here in Wisconsin! It's also got more miles on it than you'll ever get onto your T-bird, I'll wager. I drive it every day for more than 70 miles/day (35 miles one way, 35 back, with an occasional drive out of my way to fulfill my quota of feminine company for each day), and get the worst gas mileage in the city; somewhere around 11 on the highway. I wouldn't have it any other way. But, for all of the stuff I have on it, 11 mpg is good. What do you have on your T-bird to match that? And the mileage we get is comparable; only slightly better for you, but you don't even drive as much.

Part of the problem is that we are going in fifty different directions when it comes to energy. For example, the environmentalists were instrumental in pushing for unleaded gas and for exhaust control and all that shit (I'm not an environmentalist!). Of course, every gadget one puts on hurts the mileage another 10%. Suddenly gas is a rare commodity; but do the environmentalists ease off! NOOO! They only get stricter. Densa... and yet characteristic of Carter's administration.

In any case, American cars are generally pieces of shit on the road these days. They should come with blank recall notices to save time and postage. We bought a brand new Olds Starfire (same as a Monza or other similar mad-else; the industry isn't getting any more original at this stage of the game last year, and have had miserable experiences with it. Not only that, I ended up chewing out a service attendant who spoke behind my back (but in front of my mother's) about the teenage son driving the thing (I don't even touch it -- Uli does). We're selling the heap this year with 14,000 miles on it (low for us for one year) and are going to buy an import -- anything foreign. BMWs and Mercedes and the like are the best in my opinion, arguments to the contrary notwithstanding. You don't have to take care of them, they get better mileage (mostly), are faster (in most cases), are infinitely more dependable. Our newest BMW, a 530i, has proven cheaper to maintain than that above-mentioned Oldsmobile, for insatnce...and the 530i is a 1976 car!! (50,000 miles on it to date,) My father has his eye on a Datsun 280 ZX, which will drive circles around your T-bird speed-wise, is only marginally more expensive, and gets twice your mileage.

So much for that. Now you can print another four pages of Curtis Gibson's material. Try that stuff sent to John Boardman about "astromumerology," or something like that. John tells me that Gibson offered to do a column for Graustark on it, and actually wanted to get paid for it, too Good for a laugh, if nothing else!

The dollar has been seriously weakened by this trade imbalance. A lot of people, especially those on fixed incomes are really being squeezed, many thousands of jobs have been lost, etc. There are plans to extract oil from rock which will divert water needed from agriculture. Technology for this will be in a lot better shape in 15 years, but we must now go with the primitive processes that we now have. I am aware that there are some advantages, but they pale. Our allies, more dependent on imported oil, are in worse shape. This dependence limits their political maneuverability, and limits the kind of support they can give us for, e.g. Israel and against Iran. Worst off are the third world countries. They just cannot afford the extra billions of dollars, so the living standards decline. This produces domestic unrest, which is as you know just what local left-wing revolutionaries need --- and indeed require. Money that ought to be spent on US manufactured products and grain instead goes to the OPEC coffers because of these drastically increased rates. All this I understand.

Now, along comes your Craig Karpel. He concludes from the fact that Saudi Arabia has donated one (1) solar system to a school in Reston Va that the Saudi's are planning a fiendish conspiracy against the US by means of keeping the oil prices lower than they would otherwise be! To the extent that this project has been able to show the present feasibility of solar, it encourages solar in this country, thus cutting demand for Saudi oil. Perhaps you understand better why I normally do not bother with the political crap you put into BB.

Personally I am very much in favor of codewords. Where is it written that orders can't be dependent on "current events"? You can't make it contingent on specific orders of the same season, but code words are not legal orders.

That is valuable background information for anyone to have, we as well as they, but especially they in their capacity as future oil price setters. 
